History and Mission - One School-Two Metro Atlanta Locations

Founded in 1991 in Lilburn, GA, Providence Christian Academy is a non-denominational, covenant Christian PreK-12 school. The mission of Providence is to provide excellence in Christ-centered education as an extension of the Christian home. Continuing with the vision of its founders, Providence hallmarks include high standards of academic achievement and spiritual growth, personal growth through athletics and fine arts programs, and moral development through Christian education and community service. Providence has a total enrollment of over 600 students, 296 in grades 9-12.

Providence operates on a two-semester system. Students take 7 courses per semester, and are required to take English, Math, Science, and Bible every semester in grades 9-12.

To better align with Georgia Futures and the HOPE Scholarship, we will add .5 Quality Points to any Honors and 1 Quality point to any Dual Enrollment or AP class.

Students may only take Honors courses with the recommendation of the previous subject instructor.

Qualification for the **National Honor Society**: 93.0 cumulative overall numeric GPA at the end of the sophomore year.

Qualification for the **National Beta Club**: 90.0 cumulative overall numeric GPA at the end of the sophomore year.

Both require faculty approval.

Advanced Placement Courses

Students are typically allowed to take one AP in 10th, 2 in 11th, and no more than 4 in 12th grade. All students enrolled in an AP course are required to take the AP exam in May. Though guidance is provided for course selection, students must have the recommendation of their current grade-level teacher to be eligible for an AP class.

Diploma Tracks

History of Providence Christian Academy Johns Creek Hub

In an effort to accommodate families looking for a covenant Christian high school in the North Fulton area, Providence opened the Johns Creek hub in the fall of 2017 with 33 students in grades 9 and 10. There are currently 61 students in grades 9-12 at our Johns Creek Hub.

PCA Johns Creek operates on a two-semester system. Students take 7 courses per semester, along with L2, a one-of-a-kind leadership development class developed exclusively for Providence Christian Academy.

To better align with Georgia Futures and the HOPE Scholarship, we will add .5 Quality Points to any Honors and 1 Quality point to any Dual Enrollment or AP class.

Students may only take Honors courses with the recommendation of the previous subject instructor.
