The Gist with Fr. Jeremy



Dear Divine Child Family,

This will officially be my last bulletin article. After thanking Fr. Bob, Fr. Ryan, and Fr. John last week it is now time to thank all of you. From the first moment I arrived three years ago I have experienced a profound outpouring of kindness, hospitality, gratitude and love, and it is hard to say how thankful I am for that. You have also helped me to grow. Through words of advice spoken in kindness and also positive feedback about the things I have done well, you have acted somewhat like a lattice that a plant grows around. You have given a supportive structure that marks out the proper direction for growth. And that has been extremely helpful.

I want to reflect on two comments that I often heard. One is, "Father, thank you for being a priest." I hear this so often that I don't always pay full attention to it. But this remark expresses the depth of the faith of the people of this parish. You are in love with God, and because you are in love with God, you love His Sacraments and His priests. The second remark is, "Father, your homily got me thinking." That one probably gives me the most joy. If you can't tell, I like to think. I am thinking all the time and I can't help it. And I think that thinking is good. And thinking about God is better! It is wonderful if my homilies made someone feel good, but what I *really* want is just to get them *thinking*. A number of you have been kind enough to indulge me in that regard, and I thank you for that. So, for everyone who has given me kind words, support, encouragement, advice etc. I thank you from the bottom of my heart!

I want to try and name some groups. I really loved our staff here at the parish and schools. We truly have outstanding staff. From Mr. Simpson in the choir loft to Marilyn at the front desk, from our principals down to the maintenance crew, from the ladies in the advancement office to the classroom teachers, everyone is competent, kind, and good to work with. I will sincerely miss you all.

I would like to give a shout-out the people who, maybe we never talked too much in person, but we saw each other's faces every week on Sunday, or, for many of you, almost every day at 6:30 or 8:30 Mass. Thank you for your fidelity to God and the Church. Your devotion and faith is inspiring. You have a special place in my heart!

Also, to those families where I had the honor either to marry them or a loved one, or say the funeral Mass for a loved one, or to do an Anointing of the Sick for you or a loved one, or baptize your child. You allowed me to be part of your life at a very important moment. Please know that I regarded it as a sacred blessing to share those moments with you as you welcomed God into them. Those moments taught me a lot about what it is to be human, and they also brought me closer to God. Thank you for sharing them with me.

If you came to me for Confession regularly, perhaps I don't even know who you are, but only know you as a voice behind a screen. Or perhaps you came face-to-face. Early on in my priesthood, I feared that I would run out of things to say to people who came to me every week for confession, so I was a little bit afraid of those interactions. Then God showed me that it wasn't about saying new things, but about providing a supportive and encouraging presence to people walking through difficult things, who often had no one else to talk to about it.

That was a moment of conversion for me, and from then on, I really treasured those relationships. Thank you to everyone who allowed me to accompany you through difficult struggles from the confessional.

To everyone who welcomed me into your home for a visit or a meal, I am deeply grateful. I love home life and houses, and seeing families in their "native environment" is such a blessing. Even if it was messy, it didn't matter. In fact, that was almost better! Thank you for letting me experience a small slice of your family life and letting me get to know you better. Those experiences were a great treasure for me.

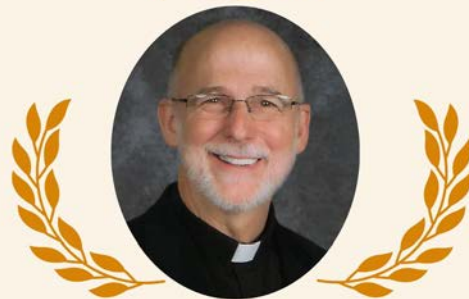

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We've reached another important milestone in our Archdiocesan Restructuring process. Over the last several weeks, we have completed over 400 parish listening sessions, hosted at every parish in the Archdiocese of Detroit. These listening sessions were opportunities for the Faithful to see the proposed models for pastorates in their planning area, and share valuable feedback on what might work, what needs additional refinement, and other insights into the local communities of each parish. These listening sessions were not a simple offering; rather, they were a high-level view of a deeply layered process. I am thankful to all of our parishes for hosting these events, as well as all those who had a part in making the sessions possible: our priests, deacons, parish staff, volunteers, Key Parish Leaders and Primary Points of Contact, our on-site technical contacts, on-site facilities contacts, scribes, volunteer facilitators, and of course—the participants!

I want you to know that, while parish listening sessions have been completed, there is still time and space for you to provide your feedback. You can visit the restructuring website at restructuring.aod.org to access your parish workbook and the information presented at your parish listening sessions, including the videos from your listening session, the proposed models for your planning area, and the post-listening session survey.

I encourage each of you to first and foremost find time to thoughtfully and prayerfully engage with these materials. Then, please share your feedback on the proposed models in the online survey. Your suggestions, insight, and recommendations are essential to this next phase of our restructuring. Every piece of feedback received will be read and taken into consideration. This survey will remain open until July 31st.

In August, further discernment and refinement will continue as we review and analyze all the data from the parish listening sessions, the online survey responses, and ongoing feedback from our priests. We expect to announce the new pastorates in April 2027, with implementation beginning July 1, 2027.

Brothers and sisters, I know this process has not been an easy one for many of you. I know, too, that as we discern the future of our archdiocese, difficult decisions

must be made. But my hope remains in our shared vision for the future: vibrant faith communities, flourishing priests, and sustainable, mission-ready parishes. Join me in prayer during this spiritual moment, as we continue to walk this path together, and know that I'm praying for each of you.

SAFE ENVIRONMENTS: Volunteer Requirements



UNITED STATES CONFERENCE OF
CATHOLIC BISHOPS



The Archdiocese of Detroit, in compliance with the USCCB Charter for Protection of Youth and Young People, **requires any and all parish and school volunteers to complete Protecting God's Children training and maintain a current background check, regardless of whether they are interfacing with children or vulnerable adults.** Please review the steps below to ensure you are in full compliance.

Create and/or login to VIRTUS Account

VIRTUS is the Church's online system for Protecting God's Children training and volunteer safety compliance. All information shared within VIRTUS is secure and encrypted for online security. Please visit **VIRTUS.org** to get started.

New users: Create an account.

Returning users: Log in with your current credentials to access courses, authorize background checks, recertify or update your information.

Quick tip: Keep your login handy for future training updates or renewals.

Authorize Background Check

Upon registering with VIRTUS, **new users** will provide their date of birth, gender, race, and confirm Michigan residency for the past 7 years, followed by signing and authorizing the background check.

Your VIRTUS account will show the check as cleared once it has been completed by our on-staff VIRTUS coordinator in strict confidentiality.

Review & Sign Volunteer Code of Conduct

All volunteers are required to read and sign the Volunteer Code of Conduct. This can be completed by logging into your VIRTUS account.

If needed, a paper copy may also be reviewed and signed; completion will be recorded in your VIRTUS account under the "Required Documents" tab.

All Divine Child parish and school volunteers - new and currently serving - are expected to complete all four steps prior to volunteering.

Sign up & Attend Protecting God's Children Training

Protecting God's Children (PGC) is a 3-hour awareness session that educates adults on how to recognize inappropriate or predatory behavior, take steps to prevent abuse, and report concerns responsibly.

First-time participants must attend an in-person *Protecting God's Children 4.0* session, while **anyone who completed PGC in 2022 or earlier** may complete a recertification online through the VIRTUS web training module (*Protecting God's Children 4.0* and *Vulnerable Adults 2.0*).

How to Register

All registration is completed online through your VIRTUS account. VIRTUS offers sessions across metro Detroit (see database in your account).

250 Hours of Adoration

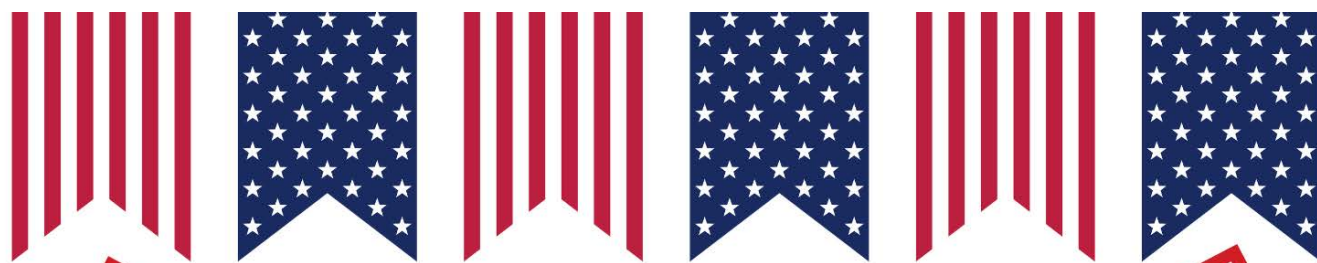
Church of the Divine Child is participating in the USCCB's 250 Hours of Eucharistic Adoration for America to mark the 250th anniversary of the United States of America.

Praying with Sacred Art

This year, Divine Child Elementary students have been learning about different forms of prayer. One form they learned and practiced was praying with sacred art. Some students did this by reflecting on the creche at Christmas, some learned about and drew our stained glass windows, and some created their own works of sacred art. Then, parishioner Kathy Crombie, an iconographer and speaker, was invited to share the presentation "Saints and Icons" to grades 4-8. The presentation was about iconography, Sts. Carlo Acutis, Pier Giorgio Frassati and the icon of them that she wrote.

Before presenting to the DC students, Kathy prayed for the success of her presentation, and that the guardian angels of DC students would open the students' hearts and ears, allowing God to work through them and her presentation. When presenting to the students, a 5th grader asked if Kathy had ever written an icon of an angel (she had not). A 4th grader asked how God spoke to her about icons. Later that day, she went home and discovered she had unknowingly presented on the feast of St. Gabriel the Archangel. Through prayer and reflection, Kathy felt confident God was calling her to write a St. Gabriel the Archangel icon!

Kathy then invited the school to join her in prayer as she began writing the icon. Each day during morning prayer, the K-8 students prayed for God to guide her work. When the icon was completed, the students joined Kathy at a Mass and blessing ceremony for the St. Gabriel the Archangel icon. With Divine Providence leading the way, it is fitting that an Archangel Gabriel icon should have been inspired by a Divine Child student and solemnly blessed at a Divine Child Mass. After all, the Archangel Gabriel was the first one to hear and share the message of the Divine Child.



A little information about icons:

Icons are the fruit of prayer and are meant to teach. Every color and portion of an icon has special meaning. For example: In the left hand, he holds a trumpet which is symbolic of his mission as God's Messenger. He holds a lily in his right hand symbolic of purity, but also symbolizing Mary the Mother of God to whom he appeared at the Annunciation.

Thank you to all the students in the schools. You were one of the best parts of my job! I loved it so much when I visited your classrooms or talked to you in the hallways and you were so excited to see me. I loved giving high fives to the kids in elementary and junior high. I loved going on retreats with you, and seeing your faith grow. I also loved preaching to you at your Mass time every week. If you are reading this, please know what a gift you were to me, and please remember that you are NOT too young to love God and make Him the top priority in your life. Your acts of love and obedience to Him put a huge smile on the face of God, and what could be better than that?

I want to mention now four groups that I feel especially closely attached to: one is the group of men, women, and children who joined the Church this past Easter, when I had the honor to preside at the Easter Vigil, and Baptize and/or Confirm them. You all have such beautiful faith, and celebrating your birth into Christ with you was one of the greatest highlights of my priesthood so far! In this connection, I also want to thank Mrs. Micallef and Ms. Dwyer by name for all their hard work, but especially their work preparing those who come into the Church. That is such an important ministry, and they do a wonderful job! The second group are those who went on pilgrimages with me, either to Rome or to our Lady of Champion Shrine. I also want to thank all the men who did Exodus 90 during the last three years. I really felt that that ministry was a work of the Holy Spirit in this parish. Finally, I want to thank all the Altar Servers, and their parents who support them. Seeing your faith grow through the experience of being up close to the Sacrament of the Eucharist may have been my favorite part of the last three years.
