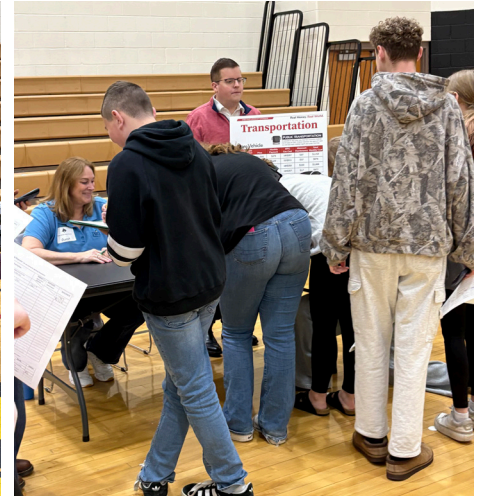
Scene 75

Real Money - Real World

Tri-Valley Middle School again hosted the Real Money, Real World (RMRW) simulation through the Ohio State University Extension. RMRW is a youth-centered financial literacy program. Its built on the collaborative efforts of Extension educators, local school teachers, and community volunteers. The program features a hands-on spending simulation where students make lifestyle and budgeting decisions similar to those faced by adults in their mid to late twenties. Middle School students complete four classroom lessons covering topics such as gross vs. net income, budgeting, spending priorities, saving, interest rates, and insurance premiums. The simulation itself takes place in the gym, where students move through various booths to either make payments or collect earnings and deposits. Throughout the experience, they record all transactions in a checking account register to track their financial decisions. The class departed Washington D.C. for home at 10:30 p.m.

The 8th grade class returned home on the morning of Saturday, May 16th, with many fond memories and valuable knowledge gained from visiting the nation's monuments and memorials. The trip provided students with a meaningful opportunity to learn about and appreciate the history of our country and its founding fathers.

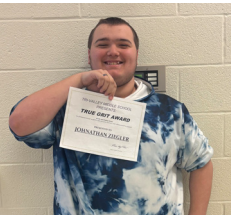

Annual Banquet Awards

Bright Light Award

7th grade: Keira Shriver - 8th grade: Ammon Martin

Two Middle School Bright Light Awards were presented this year to one 7th & 8th grader for their hard work and dedication to the TV Music Program, and the "bright light" energy they bring to the band room. These students embody everything that we try to demonstrate with the music program by bringing a hard work, ethic, and a high energy mindset to every rehearsal.

Directors Award - Max Huffman

The Band Directors Award honors outstanding members of the junior or senior high school band. It's typically given to students who demonstrate exceptional musicianship, leadership, dedication, and contribution to the band. The award highlights a student's commitment and positive influence on the ensemble.

Louis Armstrong Award - Nathan Hustey

The Louis Armstrong Award, sometimes the King Bee Award, is the "top senior jazz award" or highest level interscholastic award given to students at high schools in the United States. It is given in recognition of "outstanding musical achievement and an incredible dedication to the program".

John Philip Sousa Award - Mackenzie Bain

The Sousa Award is the pinnacle of achievement in a high school band. Introduced in 1955 to honor the top student in the high school band, the John Philip Sousa Band Award recognizes superior musicianship and outstanding dedication. It was created with the approval of Helen Sousa Albert and Priscilla Sousa, daughters of the famous composer and bandmaster.

The band debuted next year's show, *Riverbound*, at the banquet. Created in celebration of America's Semiquincentennial, the show was designed to capture a feeling of home through the use of American folk music and the theme of taking the river back home. Arranged by TVHS Band Director, Mr. Saylor, TVHS Choir Director, Mr. Mulcahy, and Luc Scott, the production will feature selections including *The Road Home* by Stephen Paulus, *The Glendy Burke* by Stephen Foster, *Orphan Annie* as performed by Punch Brothers, and *Stompin' Grounds* by Béla Fleck and the Flecktones.
