Community: The USD 261 community comprises of the city of Haysville, areas of southwest Wichita, and unincorporated areas of southern Sedgwick County. Estimates place the population of the district community at 23,755, with potential PK-12 enrollment between 5,500 and 6,000 students.

School: Campus High School is a comprehensive four-year public high school enrolling 1600 students in grades 9-12. The school opened in the fall of 1960 and graduated its first senior class in the spring of 1961. Campus High School is accredited by **KESA** and is an **International Baccalaureate World School**.

Curriculum: The academic program is organized on an alternating block schedule. Students are enrolled in eight classes on alternating days with 84-minute class periods along with a 37 minute daily Advisory/Seminar period.
