July 6 - July 10

Grow Girl, Grow!

Gardening, seed planting, nature exploration, mindfulness, and confidence-building through caring for living things.

Trip: Laurelwood Arboretum

Middle School Focus: Lead a garden-to-wellness project: goal tracking, wellness journaling, and an introduction to environmental justice (green spaces and food access). Create a "Grow Guide" to mentor younger campers.

Week 2
July 13 - July 17

Global Chefs

Explore world cuisines with kid-friendly recipes, measuring, teamwork, and cultural appreciation through food.

Trip: In-House Program - Culinary Kitchen

Middle School Focus: Food justice and intergenerational connection: Girls lead a shared meal with seniors to explore civic engagement as caring for community, guide story-sharing, and reflect on how all ages can make a difference.

Acting, storytelling, movement, and public speaking to build confidence and self-expression.

Trip: Madame Tussaud's

Middle School Focus: Create a message-driven performance (spoken word or skit). Practice feedback, stage presence, and confidence versus public image. Produce a "Girl Goals Spotlight."

Hands-on STEM experiments, curiosity labs, and problem-solving challenges.

Trip: P-Tech Planetarium

Middle School Focus: Run higher-level design challenges, collect data, and present results. Plan a STEM Demo Day station to teach younger campers.
