COMMUNITY:

The Town of Wilson was established on April 10, 1818, and is centrally located in the great fruit growing region of Niagara County. The Village of Wilson was incorporated May 11, 1858, and is located on the shores of Lake Ontario, twelve miles east of Old Fort Niagara. The district encompasses an area of 144 square miles including Wilson and portions of Ransomville, Newfane, Cambria, Lockport, and Porter.

SCHOOL SYSTEM:

High School Enrollment: 240 Faculty: 35

The public school system is composed of Wilson Elementary School, Wilson Central Middle, and Wilson Central High School.

Wilson students excel both inside and outside the classroom. 100% of eligible seniors from the Class of 2026 earned a Regents diploma and were offered \$12 million dollars in scholarship funds. Wilson High School has been recognized as a School of Distinction for the 7th consecutive year (2020 – 2026) and School of Excellence in 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019.

In 2025-2026 two (2) teams earned league sportsmanship awards (Field Hockey and Girls Track & Field). Six (6) teams were Niagara Orleans league champions (Boys Soccer, Girls Soccer, Boys Basketball, Girls Basketball, Softball and Tennis). Two (2) teams were sectional champions (Boys Soccer and Girls Soccer). One (1) team (Boys Soccer) was the regional champion. Sixty-one (61) students were named All-WNY Scholar Athletes by Section VI. Additionally, three (3) students were named Player of the Year and fourteen (14) seniors earned Orangemen awards for playing 3 sports a year from grades 9-12.

CURRICULUM:

Sequential course work is available at Wilson in all of the following areas: Art, Business, English, French, Spanish, Mathematics, Music, Science, Social Studies, and Technology Education. Courses are also provided in Health, Physical Education, and Home & Careers.

Students may also pursue vocational education sequences during their junior and senior years at the Orleans-Niagara BOCES Vocational Center.

In addition to the Standard New York State Advanced Regents/Regents Curriculum, College-Level courses are offered in Calculus, Pre-Calculus, Statistics, French, Spanish, Astronomy, Physics, English, Health, CAD 2, Physical Fitness, and Criminal Justice.
