Although it feels like the school year has just ended, we are already preparing for the upcoming one. In addition to welcoming our new students and families, Moreau Catholic is thrilled to welcome some new faculty and staff members for the 2026-2027 school year. SCHEDULES

Your complete schedule, including teachers, room assignments, locker numbers, and lunches, will be available on PowerSchool beginning early August.

PLEASE NOTE: PowerSchool will not be accessible beginning June 29th through the month of July due to upgrades and maintenance.

SCHEDULE CHANGE REQUESTS

Counselors will be available to respond to schedule change requests from Monday, August 3rd through Friday, August 14th **for the following reasons:**

- A student shows “Missing Course Pre-Requisite”
- A student is missing a class. Students should have a course scheduled for every period for both semesters.
- A student is not scheduled into a required course (e.g. English)

Appointments for these issues may be made beginning Thursday, August 6th by contacting the Counseling Office Assistant at (510) 881-4331.

All other schedule change requests may be submitted from August 6th to August 14th and will require a \$20.00 schedule change fee. Fees may be paid through the online store from Saturday, August 1st through Friday, August 14th. Visit [Mariner Mall—Academic Fees](#).

- Counselors will contact students on a first come, first served basis. Please make sure the student’s cell phone is noted on the form.
- The deadline to submit a schedule change request is Friday, August 14, 2026, at midnight.
- The Counseling Department will do all that it can to create a schedule to meet the needs of each student. Not all schedule changes may be accommodated due to class size limitations, scheduling constraints, fulfillment of prerequisites, admissions placement requirements, or other reasons. Please contact the Counseling Office at (510) 881-4331 with further questions.

MISSING COURSE PREREQUISITES

If you see “**Missing Course Prerequisite**” on the schedule, it indicates that a summer school (or equivalent) course was required in order to take one or more courses requested for the 2026–2027 school year. If this is the case, please note the following:

- Grade reports for summer work must be submitted by **Saturday, August 1, 2026**.
- Proof of successful completion of any summer school work, not taken at MCHS, should be submitted to your student’s s counselor.
- Your student’s counselor will make the necessary changes and release a complete schedule to your student.

MANDATORY SUMMER REVIEW

Several departments require work to be completed over the summer. Please check the information and links below to see if you are in any one or more of those categories.

All summer assignments are due on the first day back to school: **Monday, August 10th**.

MATH: All new and returning students have summer [Math review assignments](#).

SOCIAL STUDIES: Students taking [AP US History](#) or [AP US Government](#) will have assignments to complete by the first day of school.

SCIENCE: Students taking [AP Biology](#), [AP Chemistry](#), and [Honors Chemistry](#) will have assignments to complete by the first day of school.

Instructions for all of these summer assignments are clearly outlined on the [Summer Review](#) page. Please be sure to read all instructions thoroughly before beginning. It is also highly recommended that you begin early and do not procrastinate.

SUGGESTED SUMMER READING

Just like any sport or musical instrument, reading skills must be practiced in order to improve vocabulary, enhance comprehension, and cultivate a love for reading. SUMMER SPORT CONDITIONING AND TRAINING

Moreau Catholic is hosting Girls' Volleyball, Girls' Basketball, Boys' Basketball, Football, Girls' Flag Football, and Cross Country summer workouts. Students interested in training and learning more about these sports can sign up through [Magnus Health](#). When answering your "Conditional Questions," please select which sports you are interested in. Coaches will send communication out through Magnus Health for those interested in participating. Open practices are not required or mandatory to make the team for the regular season. All students interested must be registered on Magnus, be on the tryout list for that sport, and have a current and valid physical on file.

Fall sports include: Girls' Tennis, Girls' Golf, Boys' and Girls' Water Polo, Boys' and Girls' Cross Country, Girls' Volleyball, Football, Girls' Flag Football, and Rally Squad. STUDENT DINING

Moreau Catholic proudly partners with The Epicurean Group in service to students, faculty, and staff. The Epicurean Group is an independent food service management company whose philosophy is rooted in buying fresh, natural, seasonal, and organic food, sourced locally and prepared with meticulous skill. The Epicurean Group's values are rooted in delivering and practicing sustainable dining and offer the following to our students:

- Breakfast options beginning at 7:00 am
- Grab & Go snacks from 9:50 am-10:15 am
- Full menu of hot and cold items at both lunches
- Grab & Go snacks after school until 3:30 pm

Moreau Catholic's cafeteria operates on a cashless system. Students pay for purchases by scanning their physical or digital Student ID which is linked to an online account through **MySchoolBucks**. Students must have a funded MySchoolBucks account prior to the purchase of any food and beverages. New accounts can be set up after August 1st, with existing accounts rolling over from year to year. It is recommended that account set-up includes opting in to the *auto-replenish* option to ensure funds remain available to students throughout the school year.

CARPOOL LIST

If you are interested in forming a carpool, please register online by July 14th by visiting moreaucatholic.org/carpool. A list will be compiled, by area, and will be emailed back to you later in July to assist you in forming carpools on your own. If you do not wish to have your contact information published, please do not fill out the carpool list.

SHUTTLE SERVICE

Moreau Catholic High School offers morning transportation on each instructional school day to Moreau Catholic from four locations. For students opting in for the morning shuttle, the cost is \$795 per year, paid in equal installments on the tuition payment plan chosen for the school year. The shuttle fee reserves the student's seat on the selected morning shuttle for the entirety of the school year regardless of how often the student avails of the morning shuttle. The shuttle fee is non-refundable and is not transferrable to another shuttle or individual. Families were offered the opportunity to opt in to the shuttle when completing the financial contract in Clarity. A second enrollment opportunity will be offered in mid- to late-July on shuttles with remaining capacity.

MAGNUS STUDENT REGISTRATION SYSTEM

Magnus Health is the gold standard within the industry. Magnus Health adheres to the strict policies of HIPPA with a deep care for your privacy and security. You will have continuous access to your child's health records. All updates to your child's record should be submitted to the Main Office at attendance@moreaucatholic.org. You will also have the option to access the account after your child graduates.

For incoming families, you received a link directly from Magnus Health to create your account. **The initial email went out on Friday, June 12th with a follow-up email on Tuesday, June 16th.** Once active, please fill in all of the information requested. This will help us better serve you and your family. If you did not receive an email, please double check your spam folder. If you have any questions or did not receive an email from Magnus Health, please email Mr. Dave Bruton at dbruton@moreaucatholic.org.

For returning families, you must confirm all of your profile information is up-to-date and accurate. To ensure all information is accurate, within the "Conditional Questions" section, if your child will NOT be trying out for a sport, select "No" for that given sport. Beginning July 1st, you will have to re-acknowledge select forms that are only valid for one year.

ALL PHYSICALS must be completed between July 1st and August 1st.

SCHOOL LOCKERS

Student lockers inside the main school building may be requested anytime during the school year through the Campus Supervisor's office.

LOCKS: Grades 10-12, please continue using the same lock you used last year.

P.E. CLOTHES AND LOCKS

P.E. clothes can be purchased through sportpacks.com/moreaucatholic. P.E. clothes must fit properly, not too loose or too tight.

P.E. clothes can be ordered **now**. Don't wait until the last minute!

Locks for P.E. lockers for Frosh and transfer students will be provided by your P.E. teacher.

HOW TO PURCHASE APPROVED APPAREL

Please order early so you have it in time for school. All students must follow the Appearance Code Guidelines provided on the next page.

VISITOR MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

All visitors to Moreau Catholic must check in at the main office during school hours. On your first visit to campus this year, you will be asked to provide a valid state-issued ID that will be scanned into the visitor management system and run against federal databases. Once approved, a visitor's badge will be printed. On future visits, you will only need to give your name to receive a visitor badge. A visitor's badge is not necessary to drop off an item or pick up paperwork from the office. Please contact the reception desk with any questions.

APPEARANCE CODE GUIDELINES

In keeping with its mission statement, Moreau Catholic High School expects its students to demonstrate good taste and modesty in their appearance, as appropriate to an educational environment. School approved apparel fosters the idea that a student's uniqueness derives from within, not from their appearance. In addition, dress regulations contribute to a positive school learning environment and lend dignity and pride to the school community. The school administrators, in consultation with the Principal, have ultimate responsibility and authority for all issues pertaining to the appearance code.

APPAREL CHOICES FOR ALL STUDENTS

1. **SHIRTS:** Approved, unaltered polo shirts with the Moreau Catholic logo. Color options include green, black, gray, and cream. Polos must be buttoned to four inches from the top of the shirt collar and fall below the waistband when seated. Approved, unaltered long-sleeve polo shirts with the Moreau Catholic logo are optional. Approved, unaltered long-sleeve t-shirts with Moreau Catholic logo will be acceptable for all students as well.
2. **PANTS & SHORTS:** Cotton twill long or corduroy pants fitted at the waist. Pants that are "sagging" are not acceptable. Shorts must be cotton twill and fitted at the waist and must fall four inches above the middle of the knee or lower. *No jeans allowed. No clothing that has the appearance of jeans (for example: denim and spandex blends) are allowed.* Any solid color, pattern, or print is allowed.
3. **SKIRTS:** Cotton twill skirts fitted at the waist and must fall four inches above the middle of the knee or lower. Leggings and tights under skirts are acceptable if the skirt is four inches above the knee. *Approved polo must be worn with the skirt.*
4. **OUTERWEAR:** Only approved, unaltered Mariner Wear sweatshirts, and hoodies are allowed in the school building. Jackets and coats are accepted on campus, but not in classrooms. *Approved, unaltered Mariner wear, which includes polos or long sleeve t-shirts bought through SportsPacks or BSN, with the Moreau logo, must be worn underneath. This includes gear provided by athletic or co-curricular teams, clubs and classes.*
5. **SHOES** must have backs or back straps. No "slides," slippers, UGG mid slippers, backless shoes or heels above 2 inches allowed. Crocs must be worn in sport mode (meaning strap on back of the ankle).
6. **HAIR** must be well groomed and no inappropriate hairstyles will be allowed. If any question, the Dean or designee will decide whether a particular style or hair color may be worn. Students are allowed neatly trimmed beards and/or goatees.
7. **OTHER GUIDELINES**
 - Clothing must be neat and in good repair, with no holes, tears, rips, or frayed edges.
 - No "jeggings," leggings, sweats, or tights may substitute for pants.
 - No pajamas or sleepwear
 - No baggy or tight clothing allowed; avoid pants with spandex in them
 - No tank tops, spaghetti straps, or sleeveless tops
 - No smart glasses or AI-enabled eyewear allowed (i.e. Meta Glasses)
 - Inappropriate words, graphics, symbols, decorations, or chains are not allowed on clothing, bags, or tattoos
 - Hats, bandanas, hoodies, durags, and sweatbands are not permitted at any time indoors during the school day.
 - Sunglasses may not be worn inside school buildings.
 - Emergencies, including injuries, which cause students to be out of appearance code must be reported to the Attendance Office, Dean, or Campus Supervisor immediately.
 - Any appeal of the appearance code for religious reasons must be documented each year by the student and family.
 - On days of athletic contests, student-athletes are required to be in appearance code. Team members may wear appropriate team tops (jersey, jacket, warm-up, or other outerwear) with pants, shorts, or skirts in compliance with the appearance code. Any exception to this rule needs the approval of the Athletic Director.

All pledges (promises) must be fulfilled, or in the process of being fulfilled, by March 1, 2027.

UPDATED MARINER CLEARED PROCESS

REQUIRED FOR ALL NEW AND RETURNING FAMILIES

Important information for all new and returning parents and adult volunteers:

Moreau Catholic High School has revised its [Mariner Cleared Process](#) for the 2026-2027 school year to align with a new California law passed in January 2026. These requirements apply to all adults who wish to volunteer, participate in school activities, attend field trips, support athletic programs or otherwise work with students.

ALL returning families should carefully review the updated process, even if you have previously completed volunteer clearance requirements. New annual training requirements and compliance standards have changed and require your attention.

To remain eligible to volunteer, all adult volunteers must complete the requirements and submit any required documentation. Your cooperation helps ensure a safe and supportive environment for every member of the Mariner community.

Frosh Orientation Day is on Friday, August 7th from 7:30 am-2:50 pm

Moreau Catholic participates in the nationwide Link Crew Program, an organization whose purpose is to help frosh feel more comfortable with the transition into their first year of high school. 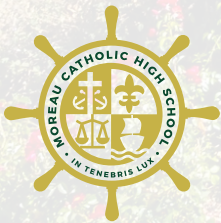
TRANSFER STUDENTS INTERESTED IN ATHLETICS

Transferring from one school to another school may affect a student-athlete's athletic eligibility under NCS and CIF rules. It is your responsibility to see the Athletic Director for a copy of eligibility rules, or information where eligibility rules can be viewed. Transfer paperwork can be turned into the Athletic Director to submit to North Coast Section beginning Aug 1, 2026.

The North Coast Section (NCS) of the California Interscholastic Federation (CIF) has a detailed process for athletic eligibility.

Furthermore, certain forms must be completed prior to any Moreau Catholic Athletics activity. All transfer students interested in gaining athletic eligibility at Moreau Catholic are encouraged to fill out the Parent/Student Certification form on the CIF website and connect with our Athletics Department before the start of the school year.
