From the Tribe of Asher



Dear all,

It is hard to believe I have been at Divine Child nearly a full year at this point. This past year has been a blessing to me, and I am looking forward to the next year here at Divine Child. I am grateful to have ministered with Fr. Bob and Fr. Jeremy this past year. I am grateful for your kindness to me. It has been a privilege for me to

minister to you in so many ways: doing the funeral of a loved one or anointing a loved one when they were ill, praying for your intentions, hearing your confessions, preaching God's Word and the Gospel at Mass, celebrating occasions like anniversaries, graduations, First Communions, Confirmation, being present at all the many events here in this community, and the list goes on! I know many more names and faces than I did a year ago, and yet I still have much work to do!

Things will be different this coming year. I will miss Fr. Jeremy. At the same time, I look forward to welcoming Fr. Dan Whalen. Fr. Dan and I entered the seminary together in 2018. At that time, I had just finished my undergraduate degree at Hillsdale College, and he had just finished high school. I remember two years ago when I was newly ordained and all the new experiences which happened then, as I began priestly ministry. There are many "firsts" when one begins priestly ministry. I know that we as a Divine Child community will welcome Fr. Dan warmly and support him as he begins his ministry here. In the priesthood, as in any vocation, we need to constantly rely on the Holy Spirit to lead us so that we can be instruments of grace leading people to Jesus. When we rely on ourselves, the task at hand is far too difficult. However, relying on the Holy Spirit is a different story.

The restructuring process will continue this coming year. The changes for the restructuring will go into effect one year from now, on July 1, 2027. We need to keep praying that the Holy Spirit guides this process, and we need to pray that we as a whole Archdiocese will have the courage and humility to accept the outcomes of this process as God's will, even when that means difficult news like priests changing assignments or parishes having less Mass times than they have been accustomed to. As we go through this process, we have to stay deeply rooted in our faith and our love for the Eucharist. For people of faith, the best is not in the past. The best is yet to come. Because of Jesus' Resurrection, we have this hope.

I pray that many will take advantage of the Eucharistic Revival Day we are having as an Archdiocese on Wednesday, July 22, at Huntington Place (Cobo Hall) in Detroit. You must sign up for tickets by June 30. There is more information on page 9 in the bulletin.

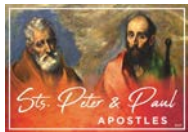

SAFE ENVIRONMENTS: Volunteer Requirements

UNITED STATES CONFERENCE OF
CATHOLIC BISHOPS


The Archdiocese of Detroit, in compliance with the USCCB Charter for Protection of Youth and Young People, **requires any and all parish and school volunteers to complete Protecting God's Children training and maintain a current background check, regardless of whether they are interfacing with children or vulnerable adults.** Please review the steps below to ensure you are in full compliance.

Create and/or login to VIRTUS Account

VIRTUS is the Church's online system for Protecting God's Children training and volunteer safety compliance. All information shared within VIRTUS is secure and encrypted for online security. Please visit **VIRTUS.org** to get started.

New users: Create an account.

Returning users: Log in with your current credentials to access courses, authorize background checks, recertify or update your information.

Quick tip: Keep your login handy for future training updates or renewals.

Authorize Background Check

Upon registering with VIRTUS, **new users** will provide their date of birth, gender, race, and confirm Michigan residency for the past 7 years, followed by signing and authorizing the background check.

Your VIRTUS account will show the check as cleared once it has been completed by our on-staff VIRTUS coordinator in strict confidentiality.

Review & Sign Volunteer Code of Conduct

All volunteers are required to read and sign the Volunteer Code of Conduct. This can be completed by logging into your VIRTUS account.

If needed, a paper copy may also be reviewed and signed; completion will be recorded in your VIRTUS account under the "Required Documents" tab.

All Divine Child parish and school volunteers - new and currently serving - are expected to complete all four steps prior to volunteering.

Sign up & Attend Protecting God's Children Training

Protecting God's Children (PGC) is a 3-hour awareness session that educates adults on how to recognize inappropriate or predatory behavior, take steps to prevent abuse, and report concerns responsibly.

First-time participants must attend an in-person *Protecting God's Children 4.0* session, while **anyone who completed PGC in 2022 or earlier** may complete a recertification online through the VIRTUS web training module (*Protecting God's Children 4.0* and *Vulnerable Adults 2.0*).

How to Register

All registration is completed online through your VIRTUS account. VIRTUS offers sessions across metro Detroit (see database in your account).

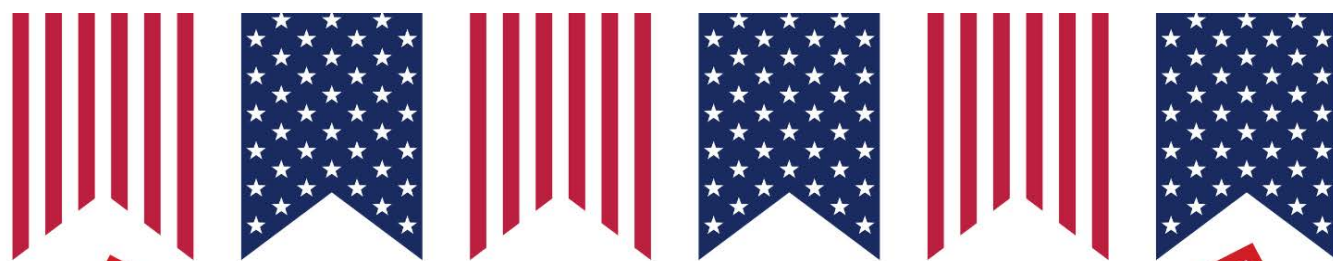

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We've reached another important milestone in our Archdiocesan Restructuring process. Over the last several weeks, we have completed over 400 parish listening sessions, hosted at every parish in the Archdiocese of Detroit. These listening sessions were opportunities for the Faithful to see the proposed models for pastorates in their planning area, and share valuable feedback on what might work, what needs additional refinement, and other insights into the local communities of each parish. These listening sessions were not a simple offering; rather, they were a high-level view of a deeply layered process. I am thankful to all of our parishes for hosting these events, as well as all those who had a part in making the sessions possible: our priests, deacons, parish staff, volunteers, Key Parish Leaders and Primary Points of Contact, our on-site technical contacts, on-site facilities contacts, scribes, volunteer facilitators, and of course—the participants!

I want you to know that, while parish listening sessions have been completed, there is still time and space for you to provide your feedback. You can visit the restructuring website at restructuring.aod.org to access your parish workbook and the information presented at your parish listening sessions, including the videos from your listening session, the proposed models for your planning area, and the post-listening session survey.

I encourage each of you to first and foremost find time to thoughtfully and prayerfully engage with these materials. Then, please share your feedback on the proposed models in the online survey. Your suggestions, insight, and recommendations are essential to this next phase of our restructuring. Every piece of feedback received will be read and taken into consideration. This survey will remain open until July 31st.

In August, further discernment and refinement will continue as we review and analyze all the data from the parish listening sessions, the online survey responses, and ongoing feedback from our priests. We expect to announce the new pastorates in April 2027, with implementation beginning July 1, 2027.

Brothers and sisters, I know this process has not been an easy one for many of you. I know, too, that as we discern the future of our archdiocese, difficult decisions

must be made. But my hope remains in our shared vision for the future: vibrant faith communities, flourishing priests, and sustainable, mission-ready parishes. Join me in prayer during this spiritual moment, as we continue to walk this path together, and know that I'm praying for each of you.

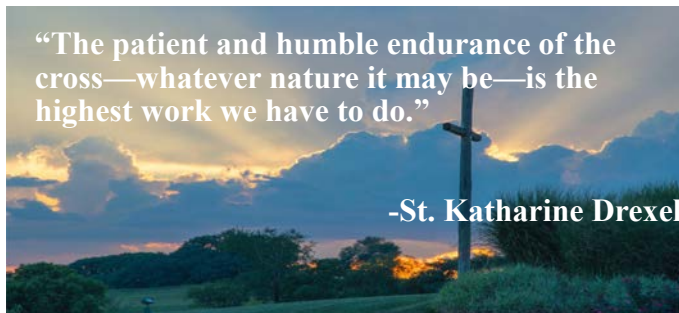

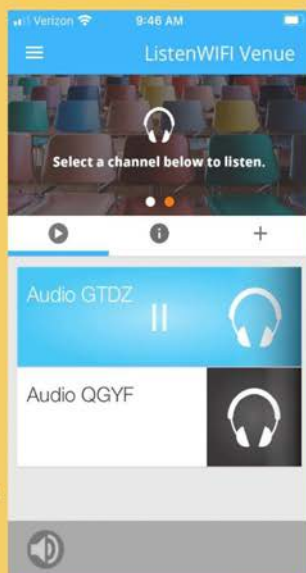

REPORTING ABUSE

The following may be indicators that someone is being abused or neglected:

Children: Sudden change in behavior or school performance; medical conditions go untreated; lacks adult supervision; overly compliant, passive, or withdrawn behavior; does not want to go home; dehydration or malnutrition.

Adults: Sudden changes in physical behavioral or financial status of elderly or someone with a developmental disability; left in front of a TV all day; dehydration or malnutrition.

HOW TO REPORT

Emergencies: If you suspect someone is in immediate danger, call 911

Law enforcement: Individuals who suspect clergy sexual abuse of children or vulnerable adults are encouraged to contact the Michigan Attorney General's Office by calling its toll-free reporting hotline at (844) 324-3374 (Monday through Friday, 8am to 5pm) or by emailing aginvestigations@michigan.gov.

Individuals also may contact their local police department.

Mandated reporting: Mandated reporters in Michigan must make an immediate verbal report to the CPS Centralized Intake for Abuse & Neglect at (844) 444-3911 followed by a written report within 72 hours (DHS-3200). Reports also can be made online.

Archdiocese of Detroit: The Archdiocese of Detroit's abuse reporting Intake Coordinator, Tony Latarski, can be reached at (313) 237-6060, toll-free at (866) 343-8055, or via email to reportabuse@aod.org. Mr. Latarski has an extensive background in law enforcement and works to receive and respond to all complaints. All calls and messages regarding complaints of sexual abuse will be returned in a timely manner. Callers will be asked to provide their name and telephone number.

An individual may be more comfortable having first contact with the Victim Assistance Coordinator (Ms. Andrea Foley, VAC@aod.org, (313) 237-6062), but the report must nevertheless be made through the Intake Coordinator.

Reporting a bishop: The Catholic Bishop Abuse Reporting Service (CBAR) has been established to receive reports of sexual abuse and related misconduct by bishops and to relay those reports to proper Church authorities for investigation. To make a report, visit ReportBishopAbuse.org or phone (800) 276-1562. When a report includes a crime, such as the sexual abuse of a minor, it will also be reported to civil authorities. Otherwise, reports will be kept confidential. Reports of sexual misconduct by other Church personnel — priests, deacons, laypersons — should be reported in using the means described in the above sections.

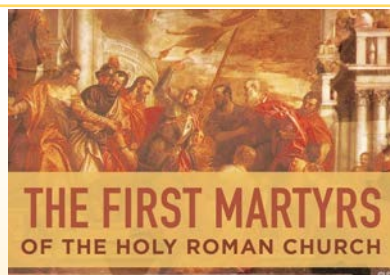

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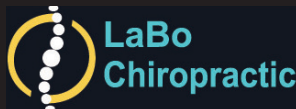


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
