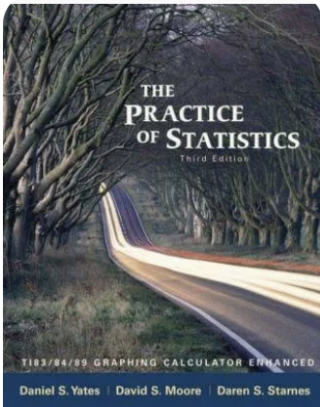

**AGREEMENT FOR PROVISION OF SPECIAL EDUCATION
AND CERTAIN RELATED SERVICES**

This Agreement is entered into by and between Applewood Centers, Inc. (“Applewood”), a not-for-profit corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Ohio and having its principal place of business in Cleveland, Ohio, and operating an educational institution known as The Gerson School (“Gerson School”), and the Board of Education of Revere Local Schools, Ohio (“Board”).

WHEREAS, Gerson School admits students who require special education and related services as defined in the IDEA 2004 and its accompanying regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Board wishes to enter into an Agreement with Gerson School for the provision of special education and related services for one or more qualified students who reside in the Board’s school district (“Student” or “Students”); and

WHEREAS, Gerson School will provide special education and certain related services documented in each Student’s Individualized Education Program (“IEP”) for the 2026-2027 school year, upon the terms and conditions set forth below.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is mutually agreed as follows:

1. The Board is responsible for compliance with applicable state and federal law regarding the provision of special education and related services to its Students. Gerson School is a chartered non-public educational institution that complies with applicable Ohio law. The special education and related services provided by Gerson School meet the standards for special education and related services established by the Ohio Department of Education. Ohio Revised Code Section 3323.08(B)(3), authorizes the Board to contract with Gerson School for the provision of special education and related services to Students.

2. Gerson School hereby agrees to provide small ratio and individualized academic programming; parent contact and consultation; school district contact and consultation, including regular evaluative reports of each Student’s progress; and participation in each Student’s IEP Team. Should a conflict between the IEP and this Agreement exist, the IEP shall supersede this Agreement.

3. The Board agrees to provide Gerson School with each Student’s educational, medical, psychological and social evaluations as are available to the Board. Gerson School and the Board agree that any records provided by either Party pursuant to this Agreement are confidential and will only be disclosed as required by applicable state and federal law.

4. For services identified in Paragraph Two provided to each Student, the Board shall pay tuition to Gerson School in the amount of \$51,643.28 (fifty-one thousand six-hundred forty-three dollars and twenty-eight cents) (“Tuition”). Tuition pays for the special education and related services provided to each Student during the regularly scheduled school year as defined in Ohio Revised Code Section 3313.48. The Board will be responsible for payment of additional funds for Gerson’s provision of special education and related services to Students whose IEP’s include an Extended School

Year Program. The Tuition payments shall be made in four equal payments according to the following schedule: The first payment shall be made on or before the first of September. The second payment shall be made on or before the first of November. The third payment shall be made on or before the first of January. The fourth and final payment in full shall be made on or before the first of March. Tuition will be charged on a prorated basis for Students admitted/discharged after commencement of the school year or attending on a part-time basis.

5. If documented on the Student's IEP, Gerson School may provide related services in addition to those described in Paragraph Two. Gerson School shall obtain prior approval from the Board before providing any additional related service that will result in an increase in tuition. The Board shall continue to be obligated to pay monthly invoices as set forth above.

6. The District is obligated to pay the Tuition for any withdrawn student through the date the written withdrawal notice from the Board was received and acknowledged in writing by Gerson School.

7. Gerson School is not responsible for transportation for any Students attending Gerson School under this Agreement. Transportation, and the costs of transportation related insurance coverage, shall be the responsibility of the Board.

8. In the event of emergency or injury concerning a Student, Gerson School will promptly notify the Board.

9. This Agreement, and the rights and obligations of the parties hereunder, shall be governed by, and construed in accordance with, the laws of the State of Ohio.

Program dates: September 1, 2026 - May 7, 2027

Mission Statement:

To create opportunities for people of every ability to connect, work, grow, and thrive.

This is accomplished by working with local school systems and local businesses to create bridges so that the transition for our individuals with exceptionalities, who are graduating from high school and entering the workforce, will be as seamless as possible.

Vision Statement:

Life without labels.

Objective:

To offer a job readiness training program for students to accomplish the transition statement in each individual's IEP and obtain gainful employment upon graduation.

How this is accomplished:

Students will attend four days per week during the school year. The set days will be Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday each week. They will attend three-hour sessions from 9:00am-12:00pm each day.

Services will be provided by the Two Foundation, Inc. Education Specialists, who are also certified job coaches. Students will also receive lessons from the Two Foundation, Inc. curriculum on self-determination and then apply meaning through work experience immediately within Two & Company. Every individual's skillset and interests will be assessed daily. Students will also get to meet with our business partners and tour their facilities as part of our career exploration experience. This allows individuals to begin building relationships with business partners of Two Foundation. By the time each student graduates, they will be prepared for their interviews, and they will have an elevator speech written. Resumes will also be created with each student.

Quarterly progress reports will be provided by our Education Specialists. By the end of the school year, our final quarterly report will show a detailed profile of each student with clear, concise recommendations and will be sent to the designated school contact.



Two Foundation, Inc. will hold two program wide meetings during the year to discuss with parents, students, and administration our process during the school year and how Two Foundation, Inc. works with OOD & DODD to assist after graduation with the job development process. We will also attempt to ensure a smooth transition for the individual as they prepare to leave high school and enter the local workforce.

Once individuals graduate from the Two and high school, the end goal is to have all eligible individuals placed in the community where they are competitively employed at a job that fits their strengths and interests, as assessed by Two Foundation, Inc. Should community employment not be the best option upon finishing the school year, Two Foundation will give their best recommendations for next steps.

Cost/Payment:

The annual rate will be \$20,625 per student. This will be broken down and billed monthly. The month of May will be billed as a quarter payment of \$625 per student, the months September through April will be billed as full payments of \$2,500 per student. Invoices will be sent on the 1st of every month that services will be performed, and payment terms are net 30. Services included for this amount will be:

- Four days per week of training at Two & Company for three-hour shifts each day
- Two's self-determination curriculum
- Weekly teacher planning time
- Guest speakers from different businesses in the local community
- Visiting business partners and touring their facility
- Attending up to two meetings per year for each individual student
 - Additional meeting requests will be billed at \$75/meeting
- Four quarterly reports for each student
- Two program wide meetings as mentioned above to help ensure a great experience and smooth transition
- Additional support tailored to each individual student (as needed)

Requirements:

- All students are required to self-medicate and must be able to take care of their own personal hygiene.
- Two Foundation, Inc. will have forms sent over to the school system for each individual. The school is responsible for having all forms turned in to Two Foundation, Inc. prior to the student beginning services.
- Two Foundation, Inc. must meet with and assess each student as a fit and recommend for acceptance to the program. Two Foundation, Inc. reserves the right to reject or remove from the program, at any time and in its sole discretion, any student who does not meet the requirements of the program or is unsuitable for the program.
- Two Foundation, Inc., will have additional forms requiring parental signatures which will be sent to the designated school contact by August.



AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT was made by and between LLA THERAPY (“LLA”) and **REVERE LOCAL SCHOOLS** (“SCHOOL”).

WHEREAS, SCHOOL desires the services of licensed therapists for its students – specifically: speech, behavioral, physical and occupational therapists and/or assistants, as further described below (collectively, “Therapy Services”);

WHEREAS, LLA desires to provide Therapy Services to students of SCHOOL who qualify for Therapy Services.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises, covenants, and agreements set forth herein, LLA and SCHOOL (“Parties”) do mutually agree as follows:

I. SERVICES PROVIDED BY LLA

Subject to the terms and conditions set forth herein, LLA shall provide the following services to students of SCHOOL in accordance with the student’s individualized education program (“IEP”) and as authorized by a student’s physician and mandated by Ohio law:

1. LLA agrees to provide licensed therapists and therapy assistants to provide Therapy Services, as necessary, Monday through Friday (except holidays), subject to availability of such therapists as determined by LLA.
2. LLA agrees to provide staff for behavioral services as needed, Monday through Friday (except holidays), subject to the availability of such therapists as determined by LLA.
3. Therapists shall have current and valid Ohio licenses, and as required, a teaching certificate from the State of Ohio Department of Education.
4. LLA shall maintain or cause each therapist to maintain insurance coverage for acts of negligence or professional misconduct with respect to Therapy Services rendered by LLA therapists as representatives of SCHOOL. LLA shall furnish a certificate of insurance to SCHOOL upon request.
5. Therapy Services shall include, without limitation, assessments/evaluations, treatment, consultation, documentation, parent/teacher instruction, in-service education, team staffing and IEP meetings.
6. When Therapy Services rendered by a therapist and a therapy assistant, collaboration time is necessary and will be billed accordingly.

7. LLA therapists shall communicate directly with the SCHOOL DIRECTOR OF SPECIAL EDUCATION regarding school policies and procedures, scheduling, equipment needs, and any other provisions necessary to carry out the terms of the Agreement. If questions arise regarding interpretation of Ohio Model Policy and Procedures for the Education of Children with Disabilities that impact service delivery, LLA reserves the right to consult with appropriate legal counsel and/or the Ohio Division of Special Education. LLA further reserves the right to deliver services in accordance with said recommendations.
8. LLA shall comply with all applicable federal and state laws, rules and regulations in rendering Therapy Services.
9. LLA Therapists understand they have access to confidential student information, and that they are considered a contractor under FERPA. LLA therapists will abide by all FERPA rules regarding the handling of confidential student information.

II. SERVICES PROVIDED BY SCHOOL

Subject to the terms and conditions specified herein, SCHOOL shall provide LLA the following:

1. Timely information regarding scheduling, treatments, and any other information necessary to carry out the terms of this Agreement.
2. A suitable area for treatment that is accessible, private, ventilated, well lit, and large enough to accommodate Therapy Services and activities.
3. Equipment and supplies necessary to carry out the therapy programs of students. SCHOOL shall be responsible for arranging for payment of said equipment and supplies.

III. COMPENSATION

LLA shall deliver invoices to SCHOOL for Therapy Services rendered to coincide with the accounts payable payment schedule of the SCHOOL. SCHOOL shall pay LLA invoices within 15 days of the dates of LLA invoices. Hours for Therapy Services shall be stated on invoices and billed at the hourly rates specified in "Exhibit A" attached hereto. The fee schedules set forth in "Exhibit A" may be modified by mutual written consent of LLA and SCHOOL. LLA reserves the right to suspend or terminate services if SCHOOL fails to pay invoices when due.

IV. INDEMNIFICATION

LLA shall not be liable under any agreements or obligations of SCHOOL, except as otherwise provided pursuant to this Agreement, or for any act or omission of SCHOOL or SCHOOL's officers, employees or agents. SCHOOL will be responsible for any and all liability, claims, causes of action, losses, damages, costs and expenses that are caused by or arise out of any omission, fault, negligence, malpractice or other misconduct by SCHOOL, its officers, employees, independent contractors or volunteers, in connection with this Agreement.

SCHOOL shall not be liable under any agreements or obligations of LLA, except as otherwise provided and pursuant to this Agreement, or for any act or omission of LLA or LLA's officers, employees or agents. LLA will be responsible for any and all liability, claims, causes of action, losses, damages, costs and expenses that are caused by or arise out of any omission, fault,

negligence, malpractice or other misconduct by LLA, its officers, employees, independent contractors or volunteers, in connection with this Agreement.

V. RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE PARTIES

1. Nothing in this Agreement is intended to, or shall be construed to, create a partnership or joint venture between the Parties, the employees or agents of either. Neither party shall have the authority to bind the other in any respect, it being intended that each shall remain an independent contractor solely responsible for its own conduct. No employee or agent of one party hereto shall be considered an employee or agent of the other party hereto.
2. It is the intention of the Parties that no employment relationship between SCHOOL and the LLA licensed therapist be created since the LLA therapist is a representative of LLA and shall receive all of his or her compensation for services rendered from LLA. The supervision and control of the work performed by the LLA licensed therapist pursuant to this Agreement will be the responsibility of LLA since the licensed therapist is a representative of LLA. However, in order to comply with Ohio law, the clinical supervision of licensed therapy assistants will remain the responsibility of the supervising therapist, regardless of his or her employer.
3. SCHOOL shall not solicit nor offer employment, by contract or otherwise, to any LLA professional rendering services to SCHOOL for a period of one (1) year following termination of this Agreement without the express written consent of LLA. In the event that LLA grants written consent, SCHOOL agrees to pay LLA the greater of: (a) the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) or (b) fifty percent (50%) of the LLA professional's highest annual or annualized (if employed less than one year) gross wages or salary during said professional's association with LLA.
4. The vendor will comply with the requirements of 45 CFR 164.504 (e) (1) for safeguarding and limiting access to information concerning beneficiaries. The vendor will allow representatives of the US Department of Human Services, ODM, ODE, or their respective designee access to the subcontractor's books, documents and records. The vendor acknowledges that they or their principles are not suspended or barred.

VI. ASSIGNMENT

Neither party shall assign or delegate its rights and obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party, which consent may not be unreasonably withheld.

VII. ACCEPTANCE OF AGREEMENT

Acceptance of this Agreement is evidence of SCHOOL's intent to comply with Title VI and Title VII of the 1964 Civil Rights Act and subsequent amendments, which prohibits discrimination because of race, sex, national origin, age, color or handicap in any facet of SCHOOL operation.

VIII. CONSTRUCTION AND INTERPRETATION

This Agreement shall be construed and interpreted in conformity with the laws and regulation of the State of Ohio.

III. PURPOSE OF INTERAGENCY AGREEMENT

Summit County Interagency Agreement

The purpose of this agreement is to assist the LEAs, HMGEI (Summit County DD), and Head Start in meeting the challenges of working collaboratively when faced with different interpretations of criteria establishing eligibility for disability services to children, ages birth to age 5, in Summit County. The dilemma is not and should not be which set of criteria is correct but how best to establish a framework that supports a unified system and promotes collaboration in providing services to children and families.

This agreement establishes who has the responsibility for specific services, as has been defined in *Ohio's Joint Agreement Between Federal Regions V and XII Administration for Children and Families (Head Start), The Ohio Department of Education and the Ohio Department of Children and Youth*. Whenever appropriate, this information has been formatted into three columns to clearly delineate agency roles. The agreement also provides guidance for the economical use of funds by discouraging the duplication of services and by promoting communication and collaboration.

Collaboration among the LEAs, Head Start and HMGEI (Summit DD), provides services to young children with disabilities, ages birth through age 5, and their families while making the best use of available resources and avoiding duplication of effort.

The purposes of this agreement are to outline roles and responsibilities, and to provide guidance for collaboration between the LEA, HMGEI (Summit DD) service providers, and Head Start in order to:

- 1.) Guarantee that all eligible children have access to the full range of services under the agreed-upon definition of eligibility contained herein.
- 2.) Assure the involvement of parents and families in all services provided to children, including procedural safeguards.
- 3.) Increase awareness of the array of services and continuum of options available to children and families.
- 4.) Facilitate the smooth transition of young children between Help Me Grow EI, Head Start and the LEAs.
- 5.) Maximize services through the joint utilization of resources.
- 6.) Assure placement of eligible children in the least restrictive environment with the provision of appropriate services.
- 7.) Assure the sharing of information for the benefit of the child and family as a strategy for avoidance of duplication of effort.
- 8.) Assure the plan reflects the needs of all stakeholders.

B. ELIGIBILITY

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES CONTRACT

This Professional Services Contract (“**Contract**”) is entered into this ___ day of _____, 2026, by and between: (i) Morgan E. Amend, a Certified Academic Language Therapist, with a principal place of residence located at 5092 Concord Drive, Copley, Ohio 44321 (“**Therapist**”); and (ii) Revere Local Schools, with a principal place of business located at 3496 Everett Rd., Richfield, Ohio 44286 (“**School**”) (collectively, the “**Parties**”).

For good and valuable consideration, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree as follows:

1. RELATIONSHIP OF THE PARTIES. Therapist enters into this Contract as, and shall continue to be, an independent contractor. All services shall be performed only by Therapist. Under no circumstances shall Therapist look to School as her employer, or as a partner, agent or principal. Therapist shall not be entitled to any benefits accorded to School’s employees, including without limitation worker's compensation, disability insurance, vacation or sick pay. Therapist shall be responsible for providing, at Therapist's expense, and in Therapist’s name, unemployment, disability, worker's compensation, as well as licenses and permits usual or necessary for conducting the Therapy Services (as defined below).

2. TERM OF CONTRACT: This Contract shall begin on the date written below and continue, on an annual basis, until terminated by one of the Parties. The Parties hereby agree that either party may terminate this Contract, at any time, by giving the other party at least a forty five (45) days prior written notice of said termination. In the event that Therapy Sessions (as defined below) have been scheduled at the time of termination by the School, the School shall remain responsible for paying all applicable Therapy Fees (as defined below) associated with any such scheduled therapy sessions.

3. THERAPY SERVICES, THERAPY FEES AND PAYMENT TERMS:

(A) Therapy Services. Therapist shall provide language therapy to students of the School (“**Student**”) as directed by School and agreed to by Therapist (the “**Therapy Services**”).

(B) Therapy Fees. Therapist shall be paid for all Therapy Services in the amount of \$104.73 per session (the “**Therapy Fees**”) and time and a half per additional student who participates in the literacy session. By way of example, if two students are a part of a group the effective rate for that session will be \$157.18. If three students are part of a group the effective rate would be \$235.72. The Parties may alter and/or amend the Therapy Fees, on a case-by-case basis or otherwise, in writing signed by both Parties.

(C) Payment Terms. Therapist shall, on a monthly basis, invoice School for any and all Therapy Fees owed by School and School hereby agrees to pay any and all Therapy Fees owed to Therapist within thirty (30) days of the date of such invoice.

4. CANCELLATION BY SCHOOL: School shall be responsible for notifying Therapist in the event that it is necessary to cancel any scheduled Therapy Services. So long as the Therapist is given at least 24 hours prior notice. So long as such notice is given, School will not be charged for any such cancelled session. In the event that the circumstances do not allow for 24 hour advance notice to be given, School is encouraged to notify the Therapist as soon as possible; however, any modification to the provisions of this Section shall be within the sole discretion of the Therapist. Therapist shall make reasonable efforts to re-scheduled Therapy Services that are cancelled for reasons related to the sickness or the students or otherwise.

5. CANCELLATION BY THERAPIST: The Therapist may cancel a scheduled therapy session by giving reasonable prior notice to the School and student, in which case no Therapy Fees shall be charged to the School.

6. LATE ARRIVAL: Therapy Fees are calculated according to the scheduled times agreed to by the Parties and no adjustment shall be made for time lost as a result of a late arrival by a student. No refunds or discounts shall be given as a result of Student arriving late to a scheduled therapy session.

7. CONFIDENTIALITY. The School and Therapist shall keep confidential all information related to the Student and shall contact other parties involved in the therapy of the Student only if the School and/or Student's parent(s)/legal guardian(s) give the Therapist permission to do so. The Therapist will only provide information concerning the Student's progress to the School and/or Student's parent(s)/legal guardian(s), unless instructed otherwise.

7. PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN OBSERVATION. Assuming that a Student is comfortable with allowing them to do so, representatives of the School and/or Student's parent(s)/legal guardian(s) are free to observe therapy sessions and the Company encourages them to do so. It is recommended that parent(s)/legal guardians(s) wait at least three weeks before attending a scheduling session in order allow the Student to become acquainted with the therapy program.

8. NO WARRANTIES: Therapist makes no promises, representations and/or warranties regarding the Student's performance as a result of the Therapy Services provided. Depending on the individual needs of the Student, an appropriate therapy program may take three to five years to complete.

9. WAIVER/LIMITATION OF LIABILITY: To the maximum extent permitted by law, the School hereby releases, waives, surrenders and forever discharges the Therapist, and its successors and assigns, from any and all liability, claims, demands, actions, or expenses, including attorney fees, or causes of action whatsoever arising out of or related to any injury, illness, loss or damage, arising out of or otherwise relating to the therapy services provided under this Contract. School further agrees that, in the event of an injury or emergency requiring medical attention, the Therapist may provide treatment, and/or call upon a third party to administer medical treatment, to the Student and that neither the Student nor his/her parent(s)/legal guardian(s) will hold the Therapist responsible or otherwise liable for the consequences of any such treatment and/or any problems, injuries or complications resulting there from, regardless of whether said treatment is administered by the Therapist or a third party. School hereby agrees that, under no circumstances, shall the Therapist Parties be responsible for any damages, costs and/or expenses, including medical bills, arising out of or otherwise relating to treatment provided under this provision and further represent and warrant that they will not hold the Therapist responsible therefore. Subject to the foregoing, the Parties further hereby agree that in no event will the Therapist's total liability to School exceed the amount paid to the Company during the one (1) month immediately preceding the event that gave rise to the claim, demand or action.

10. OHIO LAW GOVERNS. This Contract shall be governed under the laws of the State of Ohio, without reference to any Conflict of Laws provision contained in the statutory or common law.

11. SEVERABILITY. It is the intention of the Parties that the terms and provisions of this Contract be construed to be separable and severable. If any term or provision of this Contract shall be held void, invalid, unenforceable or in conflict with any applicable law, all of the other terms and provisions of this Contract shall remain valid and fully enforceable.

12. ENTIRE AGREEMENT: This Contract embodies the entire agreement between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes any and all prior agreements and understandings, oral or written, with respect thereto. This Contract may not be changed orally, but may be amended, superseded, cancelled, renewed or extended, and the terms hereof may be waived, only by an instrument in writing signed by each of the undersigned Parties or, in the case of a waiver, signed by the undersigned Party against whom enforcement of such waiver is being sought. The Parties hereby declare and represent that no promises, inducements or agreements not herein expressed have been made and that the terms of this Contract are contractual and not a mere recital.

13. OPPORTUNITY TO REVIEW AND AUTHORITY TO EXECUTE. By affixing their signatures hereto, the undersigned Parties acknowledge that they: (i) have fully read this Contract; (ii) understand all of its terms; (iii) have the authority to execute the document in the capacity set forth below; and (iv) have executed this Contract voluntarily.

It is further agreed that contract costs and adjustments (plus or minus) based on unanticipated increases/reductions in State funds will be made prior to June 30, 2026. All applicable federal and state laws, regulations, and/or rules shall govern the implementation of the services provided pursuant to this agreement.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") is by and between the Revere Local School District Board of Education (the "Board") and the Revere Education Association (the "Association").

WHEREAS, the Board and the Association are parties to a collective bargaining agreement in effect July 1, 2025, through June 30, 2028 (the "CBA"); and

WHEREAS, Article 12, Section 12.01(B) of the CBA sets forth the process for employees filing for reclassification for additional training; and

WHEREAS, Article 15 of the CBA creates the Local Professional Development Committee ("LPDC") and sets forth its charge; and

WHEREAS, the Ohio State Board of Education ("SBOE") notified school districts of concerns regarding continuing education credits teachers were earning for purposes of licensure renewal from the Albion Center for Professional Development at Idaho State University ("Idaho State"); and

WHEREAS, effective October 10, 2025 the SBOE determined that for any individual who is not enrolled in coursework at the Albion Center as of October 10, 2025, the SBOE will not accept coursework obtained through the Albion Center at Idaho State University for the purpose of applications reviewed directly by the SBOE for licensure renewal; and

WHEREAS, effective November 12, 2025, the Revere LPDC has determined it will no longer accept credits from Idaho State for licensure renewal; and

WHEREAS, a question has arisen as to whether courses taken through the Idaho State University's Albion Center should be considered for reclassification credit on the salary schedule under Article 12, Section 12.01(B); and

WHEREAS, on October 31, 2025, the Association filed a grievance alleging the Board was violating Article 12, Section 12.01(B) by refusing to grant reclassification credits for coursework taken by bargaining unit members through the Idaho State University's Albion Center; and

WHEREAS, the Board and the Association have mutually agreed to resolve this grievance and clarify how credits from Idaho State Albion Center will be handled by the Board for the purposes of (1) licensure renewal and (2) reclassification credit;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties agree as follows:

1. Effective October 10, 2025, the Board will no longer accept classes courses from Idaho State for purposes of licensure renewal nor reclassification credit, except as set forth in this MOU.

2. Association bargaining unit members who registered and paid for classes courses with Idaho State Albion Center on or before November 12, 2025, and who provide to the Board proof of enrollment dated prior to that date shall receive credit for those courses for the purposes of reclassification credits provided they follow the procedures set forth in Article 12, Section 12.01(B). Credit shall be calculated consistent with prior Idaho State Albion Center courses.

3. Association bargaining unit members who advanced on the salary schedule on or before November 12, 2025 shall retain their salary schedule placement, even if such advancement was based on hours from Idaho State Albion Center.

4. Association bargaining unit members who (1) meet the eligibility requirements set forth in Paragraph 2 above, (2) met the notification requirements set forth in the REA's November 24, 2025 email (copy attached and incorporated by reference) and (3) whose reclassification credit applications include credit from Idaho State Albion Center, shall be permitted to use Idaho State Albion Center credits for the purposes of reclassification credit. Retroactive pay for those members who are eligible for such pay under Paragraph 2 above shall be made in a lump sum not later than two pay cycles after this MOU is approved by both the REA and the Board. A list of those Association bargaining members who fall within this paragraph, along with their hours, is attached as Exhibit 1 and incorporated by reference.

5. All previous decisions by the LPDC for approval for Idaho State courses classes for credit are hereby ratified.

6. The Association will withdraw its grievance dated October 31, 2025, and any grievances filed by individuals arising out of the Idaho State Albion Center credit issue shall be withdrawn with prejudice.

The compensation shall be paid by the District to Summit County in four (4) installments, on or before 11/1/2026 (\$29,464.90), 1/1/2027 (\$29,464.90.), 3/1/2027 (\$40,213.65) and 5/1/2027 (\$40,213.65).

All other terms and conditions of the Agreement that are not inconsistent with the renewal remain in effect.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties have executed this First Renewal of the Agreement as of the date signed by the County Executive. This First Renewal may be executed in counterparts. Electronic signatures shall have the same legal effect as handwritten signatures.

Dear Revere Administration and Board of Education:

This **December 3-6, 2026**, the Revere Model UN team would like to send delegates to the **Chicago International Model United Nations (CIMUN)** conference as we did in December 2025. This letter will provide some information about the conference; however, please keep in mind that it's early yet, and much of this information will be based on last year's conference.

The Chicago International Model UN (CIMUN) is widely regarded as one of the most immersive and "realistic" conferences on the high school circuit. Unlike traditional conferences where the goal is often to reach a friendly consensus, CIMUN is designed to mirror the gritty, high-stakes nature of actual international diplomacy. The December 2026 conference will travel back in time to the year 1989, marked as the definitive twilight of the Cold War, characterized by the dramatic collapse of communist regimes across Eastern Europe—most iconically symbolized by the fall of the Berlin Wall—alongside the Soviet withdrawal from Afghanistan and the brutal suppression of student-led protests in China's Tiananmen Square. Recently, CIMUN has updated their website to reflect the 2026 theme. You will find more information at cimun.org. Anticipate more pages on their website in time, particularly detailed information about the committees that students will serve on.

Location & Hotel Accommodations

Fairmont Chicago Millennium Park
200 N Columbus Dr, Chicago, Illinois

The delegates' registration fee includes their 3-night hotel accommodation.

Transportation

Last year, Revere's Model UN delegation joined Mentor High School's Model UN team on their chartered bus, which helped with the travel costs for both schools. At this time, Mentor has invited our delegation to join their group again. I would expect all Revere delegates to travel on the bus with us to and from Chicago.

Safety & Security

In addition to my supervision, CIMUN begins curfew at midnight each night. CIMUN also has its own security team that will walk the hallways when it gets close to curfew time and will patrol the hallways all night. The hotel itself also has security although that is rarely an issue.

Transportation Fee

Mentor's advisor, Steve Couch, will arrange the chartered bus for transportation to and from Chicago, as well as for the Saturday night sightseeing. In the past, and likely again, Mentor arranged for the chartered bus and itinerary through Joshua Combs of Nowak Tours, 1395 Barn Run Dr., Valley City, OH 44280. Last year, the bus cost \$6,800 with Mentor sending 29 delegates and Revere sending 4. Thus, Revere delegates paid \$194.34 apiece to ride the bus, due in October. While inflation may affect the price, on the positive side, Revere is inviting 14 students to attend Chicago this time. The more we send, the more the price will go down.

Registration Fees

The delegate registration fee includes the Thursday banquet dinner and the 3 nights' stay at the Fairmont Millennium Park; however, there is a catch—the fee assumes the double room is at full occupancy of 4 delegates to a room.

If a room does not have 4 delegates, then CIMUN charges a \$175 “empty bed fee” for each missing delegate from that room. Last year, Revere sent 1 girl and 3 boys to the conference; as a group, we decided to allocate the rooms, determine the total “empty bed fees,” and then divide amongst the 4 so that all delegates paid the same amount (\$175 extra apiece). For them, it would not have been fair for the girl to have to pay \$525 extra because she was the only girl while the 3 boys would pay merely \$58.33 extra since they were short one boy in their room. I will expect Revere to follow the same practice this year with all delegates paying the same “empty bed fee,” based on how rooms are allocated. That amount will be determined once we secure commitments from those invited to attend. CIMUN Delegate Registration Fee (Plus “empty bed fee,” to be determined):

By September 23: \$475

By October 2: \$500

By November 9: \$550

Refunds:

- October 15: Deadline for 100% refund on cancellations
- Nov 9: Deadline for 50% refund on cancellations; final school rosters and committee assignments due. (After this date, no refunds will be given and Revere will be billed for any costs of your child's expected attendance that are deemed irrevocable by CIMUN.

Students are responsible for paying their own registration, transportation, and meals.

Advisor Expenses

\$800 CIMUN advisor fee, which includes the hotel accommodation

\$200 (approximately) for a seat on Mentor's bus

In Summation

CIMUN presents a wonderful opportunity to learn the art of diplomacy and get to know students from around the world while making memories in one of my favorite cities. At the foreign affairs breakfast, students will even have the chance to meet with people working in the field in case they might want to pursue such a career someday.

We appreciate the opportunity to attend the Chicago International Model UN Conference in December.

PREVENTING CHRONIC ABSENTEEISM

Student absences from school for any reason, whether excused or unexcused, take away from instructional time and have an adverse effect on student learning. The District shall utilize one or more absence intervention teams to work with students at risk of becoming “chronically absent” and their families to improve the students’ attendance at school. As used in this policy, “chronically absent” means missing at least 10% of the minimum number of hours required in the school year under O.R.C. §3313.48 for the school a student attends.

As prescribed by O.R.C. §3313.668, suspending, expelling, or otherwise preventing a student from attending school based on the student’s absences is prohibited.

Tiered Interventions and Supports

The following tiered system provides more intensive interventions and supports for students with greater numbers of absences and includes resources to help students and their families address the root causes of the absences. The District may utilize a range of interventions to address the diverse needs of students and prevent chronic absenteeism before it affects achievement.

Tier One (“Core”)

The District will provide universal attendance messaging and engagement practices to all students and families to establish the expectation of daily attendance.

Tier Two (“Targeted”)

When a student has been absent from school for between 5% - 19% of the statutorily required number of hours based on the student’s grade, the following action shall be taken:

A written notice highlighting the student’s absences and his/her attendance obligation under Ohio’s compulsory education law will be supplied to the student’s parent, guardian, or custodian.

Tier Three (“Targeted”)

When a student has been absent from school for 20% or more of the statutorily required number of hours based on the student’s grade, the following actions shall be taken:

1. An absence intervention team shall work with the student to improve the student’s attendance at school.

2. The student’s parent, guardian, or custodian shall be encouraged to participate with the absence intervention team in the development of an absence intervention plan.
3. The absence intervention team shall complete a root cause analysis for the student’s absences and shall make referrals to resources to help the student and his/her family address the student’s absenteeism.

Strategies to Prevent Absenteeism

The District may utilize the following strategies at any time, as determined appropriate, to help prevent the student from becoming chronically absent:

- A. Personalized positive calls by the teacher when the student misses a day of school;
- B. Involvement in before- and after-school activities;
- C. Recognition of good and improved attendance;
- D. Small group sessions;
- E. Counseling;
- F. Check in/check out;
- G. Connecting the student to a mentor or caring adult;
- H. Development of a student success plan and/or family help bank;
- I. Tutoring;
- J. Developing an alternative schedule for the student;
- K. Extracurricular activities;
- L. Positive home visits; and
- M. Connection to mental health resources and supports (in school and out of school).
- N. The absence intervention team may utilize the student’s building-wide Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (“PBIS”) intervention system, as determined appropriate.

Filing of a Complaint by an Attendance Officer

If found to be truant, the District’s attendance officer will warn the student and the student’s parent, guardian, or custodian in writing of the legal consequences of being truant and will take all other actions required under O.R.C. §3321.19, which may include the filing of a complaint against the parent, guardian, or custodian in a court of competent jurisdiction if the student fails to attend school in violation of the law.

The District’s attendance officer shall file a complaint in juvenile court against any student who was absent without legitimate excuse for 30 or more consecutive hours, 42 or more hours in one school month, or 72 or more hours in a school year.

The District shall provide written notice to its attendance officer if it determines that the student and the student’s family are making satisfactory progress in improving the student’s attendance, in which case the attendance officer shall not file a complaint. If the student and the student’s family cease to continue making progress in improving the student’s attendance, the District shall notify the attendance officer in writing, who shall file a complaint.

Development and Interpretation of Policy

In developing this policy, the Board has consulted with the juvenile court of the county or counties in which the District is located; the parents, guardians, or other persons having care of a student attending school in the District; and appropriate state and local agencies.

This policy shall be interpreted to align with any District or school improvement plan developed pursuant to state or federal law.

ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATION DEVICES

For purposes of this policy, electronic communication devices (“ECDs”) means any device that is powered by batteries or electricity and that is capable of receiving or transmitting communications from or to another ECD or person. An ECD includes, but is not limited to a cellular telephone. A student has no expectation of privacy in the use of an ECD on District property.

The possession and use of cellular telephones by students is prohibited during the instructional day, unless otherwise authorized by the student’s teacher or an administrator for purposes of student learning or to monitor or address a health concern, or unless a student’s individualized education plan or 504 plan permits such use.

If a student brings a cellular telephone to school, it must be kept in his/her assigned locker during school hours, unless otherwise specified by an administrator or a teacher. The need for a “health concern” to be monitored or addressed during the instructional day through the use of an ECD, including a cellular telephone, must be affirmed with a written statement from the student’s physician providing that such use is required, which must be submitted to the student’s building principal for authorization. Students may use ECDs, including cellular telephones, in accordance with the building’s comprehensive emergency management plan if permitted thereunder. Students are permitted to access and use cellular telephones while on school buses with the permission of the school bus driver or a District staff member, and during extracurricular activities occurring outside of the instructional day.

Use of ECDs must comply with state and federal law, Board Policy, and the Student Code of Conduct.

No student shall use an ECD to record images, video or audio of another student or staff member without the express permission of the person being recorded. ECDs shall not be used to record images, video, or audio at any time or place on District property where a reasonable expectation of privacy exists, such as in locker rooms, bathrooms, shower facilities, or any other place where persons may be found in a state of undress.

Students are prohibited from using ECDs to facilitate academic dishonesty by way of recording and/or transmitting test materials or information.

Violations of this policy may result in the ECD being confiscated. A confiscated ECD will only be returned to the student or the student’s parent or guardian at the end of the school day. A student who violates this policy may also be subject to discipline, including suspension and/or expulsion, and/or may have the privilege of using an ECD suspended or revoked.

If, in the judgment of the student’s building administrator, a violation of this policy potentially constitutes an illegal act, the ECD may be provided to law enforcement.

As with any other item of personal property, students are solely responsible for the safety and security of their own ECDs.

This policy shall be made publicly available, posted in a central location in each school building, and posted prominently on the District’s publicly accessible website. This policy shall be reviewed annually by the Board, which shall consider any revisions it deems necessary, consistent with Ohio law.

PARENT PARTICIPATION IN TITLE I PROGRAMS

In accordance with the requirement of Section 1118 of Title I, programs supported by Title I funds must be designed and implemented in consultation with parents of the students being served.

The Superintendent shall ensure that the Title I plan from each school being served contains a written statement of guidelines which has been developed with, approved by, and distributed to parents of participating students. The following guidelines described should be included in the Title I plan:

- A. Parents are to be involved in the program, including their participation in the development of the plan;
- B. Meetings shall be conducted with parents including provision for flexible scheduling and whatever assistance the District may be able to provide parents in order to better ensure their attendance at meetings;
- C. Meetings shall include review and explanation of the curriculum, means of assessments, and the achievement levels students are expected to attain and maintain;
- D. Parents shall be provided opportunities to formulate suggestions, interact and share experiences with other parents, and participate appropriately in the decision-making about the program and revisions in the plan;
- E. Parents shall be involved in the planning, review, and improvement of the Title I program;
- F. Parents shall be assisted in providing help to their children in achieving the objectives of the program.
- G. Other activities will be conducted as appropriate to the plan.

This policy shall be updated annually.
