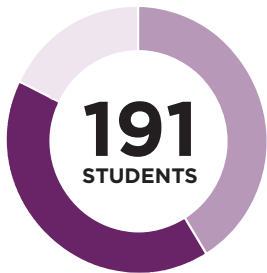

READING GROWTH

Accelerated Reading Growth. Students paired with intergenerational volunteers improved their reading skills faster, achieving a 74% growth rate from Fall to Spring, outperforming the general student population's 73% growth.

Closing the Achievement Gap. Program participants saw a remarkable 19% jump in the number of students reaching grade-level benchmarks, drastically outpacing the 7% increase seen in the general student body during the same period.
