

Course Description: This is a course designed for students who are capable of doing college-level work in French while they are in high school. The teacher and students will speak almost exclusively in French during class. Additionally, students will read authentic French texts and listen to authentic French sources via the internet on an on-going basis. This course will emphasize the student's ability to comprehend spoken French, to speak and write French with proper syntax and style, to read for understanding French authors including poetry and prose selections from all eras of French literature. A familiarity with styles of work in art, architecture and music will also be developed. The goal is to enable students to demonstrate their achievement in college-level work by taking the Advanced Placement French exam offered in May of each school year. Required summer work will include reading, writing, and listening exercises, along with recorded oral assignments to prepare for the Advanced Placement exam.

Course Goals: The course will develop students' reading, writing, listening, and speaking skills (interpersonal, interpretive, and presentational communication) through the six thematic units:

1. Families in Different Societies
2. The Influence of Language and Culture on Identity
3. Influences of Beauty and Art
4. How Science and Technology Affect Our Lives
5. Factors that Impact Quality of Life
6. Environmental, Political, and Social Challenges

Exam Format

Multiple Choice — 65 Questions | ~ 1 Hour, 35 Minutes | 50% of Exam Score

- **Part B** — Spoken Responses; ~ 18 minutes
 - o **Interpersonal Speaking:** Conversation (5 prompts; 20 seconds for each response)
 - o **Presentational Speaking:** Cultural comparison (1 prompt; 4 minutes to prepare, 2 minutes to respond)

A. Vocabulaire: Note cards

TERMS AND CONCEPTS FLASHCARDS

You are responsible for defining all of the terms and concepts found on pages 42-43, in our APprenons textbook. On one side of an index card (or similar facsimile), write the word; on the other side, write its definition. Flash cards should be no larger than 3X5 and they must be hand-written in your own handwriting. Place your flash cards in a Ziploc bag, label the Ziploc bag with your name and class period, and turn in the bag. You will be graded on the thoroughness and accuracy of your cards. **Due: upon return to school in September**

B. Reading/Written Print:

Read pages 4-7 of the APprenons textbook. Answer all the questions in sections, 5-8.

C. Reading/Writing/Project:

You will be creating an "Electronic Profile" (a fake facebook page). Use the document that can be found on google classroom for details and rubric.

D. Writing (interpersonal, presentational):

You will write three emails, throughout the summer. You will respond to each one in your handwriting, using the forms provided, in your binders.

Email requirements:

- Salutation
- Respond to a questions
- Ask a question or for more information
- Closing

E. Writing (presentational): Persuasive essay (due first day of school):

Choose a French movie and watch it. Write a 200+ word essay summarizing the plot, identifying the themes, and convincing me to watch it or why to avoid it. Use lots of new vocabulary (opinion vocab, convincing points, etc...). This should be completed in your own handwriting and brought to school on our first day of classes. Use the lined pages to write your essai.
