IPM statement

It is the goal of San Ysidro School District to implement IPM by focusing on long-term prevention or suppression of pests through accurate pest identification, by frequent monitoring for pest presence, by applying appropriate action levels, and by making the habitat less conducive to pests using sanitation and mechanical and physical controls. Pesticides that are effective will be used in a manner that minimizes risks to people, property, and the environment, and only after other options have been shown ineffective.

Our pest management objectives are to: *(Example: Focus on long-term pest prevention)*

The San Ysidro School District uses an Integrated Pest Management approach for managing insects, rodents and weeds. From time to time, it may be necessary to use pesticides registered by the Environment Protection Agency to manage pest problem. A pesticide will only be used when necessary, and will not be routinely applied. When a pesticide is necessary, the school will try to use the least toxic product effective. Notices will be posted at these areas at the least 24 hours prior to application and for 72 hours after the application

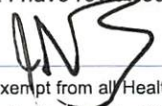

Persons who register for this notification shall be notified at least seventy-two (72) hours prior to the application, except in emergencies, and will be provided the name and active ingredients(s) of the pesticide as well as the intended date of application. Notices will also be posted at the school site where the pesticide will be applied at least 24 hours prior to the application.
