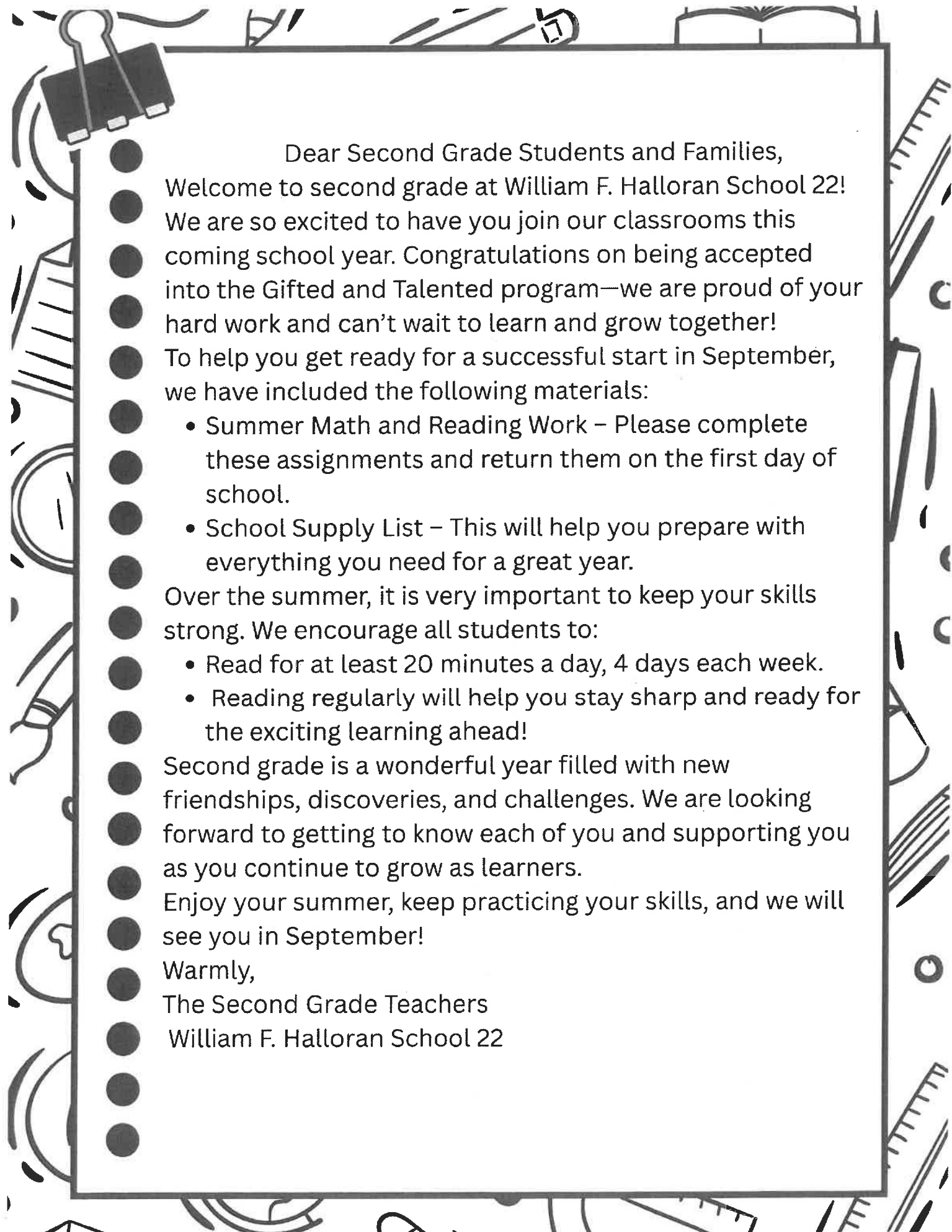




Dear Second Grade Students and Families,
