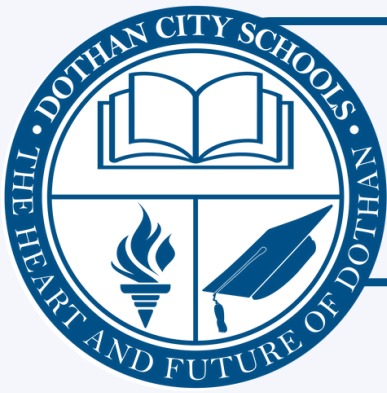

DOTHAN TECH AWARDED \$94, 476 FROM THE ALABAMA STATE DEPT. OF EDUCATION

It means more opportunities, more hands-on learning, and more pathways to success for students at Dothan Technology Center. Dothan Tech was recently awarded a \$94,467 Innovation and Modernization Grant from the Alabama Department of Education to strengthen CTE programs and expand access to industry-standard equipment.

The grant will support equipment upgrades in seven high demand programs, including Automotive, Aviation, Agriscience, Construction, HVAC, Engineering, Welding, and Culinary Arts. A new forklift will give students in multiple programs hands-on experience with real world tasks like lifting, loading, and construction operations. Automotive Technology students will benefit from a vehicle lift, brake lathe, and tire changer – transforming an empty bay into a fully operational fourth service station as well as allowing students to practice advanced repair skills aligned with industry needs. Culinary Arts students will also see improvements with the addition of an industrial dishwasher and multi-bin sinks, which will enhance efficiency, sanitation, and health code compliance in the student run commercial kitchen.

These upgrades will be implemented in the coming months and further Dothan Tech's already robust CTE programs. The award from the Alabama Department of Education will give students even more opportunities to earn certifications, develop workforce ready skills, and gain confidence in their chosen career paths.

DOTHAN PREP AWARDED \$6,000 FROM AL STATE COUNCIL ON THE ARTS

It means more creativity and more ways for students to express themselves through the arts. Dothan Preparatory Academy has been awarded a \$6,000 grant from the Alabama State Council on the Arts to support an innovative visual arts project in Mrs. Jacqueline Furlong's Visual Arts classroom.

The grant will fund an eight-week, project-based unit titled *Printmaking Through Time - Gelli Plate & Screen Printing*, allowing students to explore the history of printmaking while creating original works through gelli plate monoprinting and screen printing. The project will culminate in a student art exhibition held alongside DPA's Awards Day in mid-May, celebrating student creativity, growth, and artistic expression.

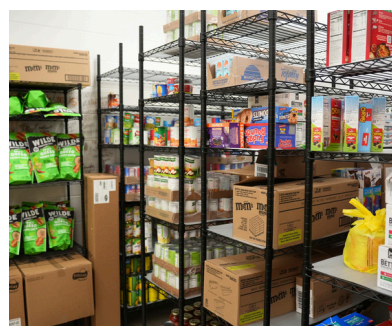
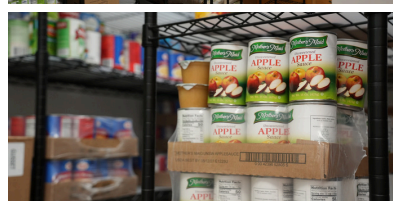
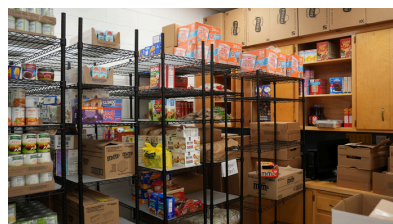


DCS CARES: FRESH & FABULOUS FOOD AND HYGIENE CLOSET

Kelly Springs Elementary School is making a meaningful impact through its Fresh & Fabulous Food and Hygiene Closet. It's a student inspired resource designed to support students and families with access to basic necessities.

The initiative grew out of a student-led service project last year, when students participated in a food drive to support families displaced by natural disasters. Seeing the impact of that effort sparked a larger idea, bringing that same sense of care and support back to families at Kelly Springs.

"The students said it felt really good to help others and that sparked something within us," said Monica Montalvo, Kelly Springs Principal. "We realized we could actually set up a food pantry that would be able to serve our families in need."



Today, the Fresh & Fabulous Food and Hygiene Closet is stocked with food items and personal care products, allowing staff to discreetly assist families who may need extra support. By meeting basic needs in a respectful and compassionate way, the initiative helps remove barriers that can affect attendance, focus, and overall student success.

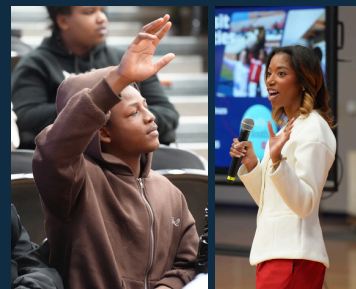
