The District is executing this renewal prior to the expiration of the current agreement on June 30, 2027, by prepaying before July 24, 2026, to lock in current pricing. Based on projected annual price increases of approximately 3.5%, the estimated cost of waiting until the current agreement expires would increase to approximately \$1,280,512.04, or about 35% higher than the current renewal price. By renewing early, the District is expected to avoid approximately \$329,699.04 in future price increases. In addition, prepaying now avoids an estimated \$300,468.25 in financing or investment opportunity costs (assuming an 8% annual cost of capital), resulting in a combined estimated financial benefit of approximately \$630,167.29 over the five-year contract term.

Subject: Consider Approval of a Master Affiliation Agreement with Sam Houston State University

Executive Summary: Administration recommends approval of a Master Affiliation Agreement between Pearland Independent School District and Sam Houston State University to provide supervised clinical education and internship opportunities for students enrolled in designated health science and related academic programs. Eligible programs include Athletic Training, Health and Kinesiology, Dietetics/Nutrition, Health Promotion and Education, Bilingual Health Care, Public Health, Clinical Exercise Science, Human Performance, Wellness Management, Healthcare Administration, Nursing, Phlebotomy, and Music Therapy.

The agreement establishes the responsibilities of both parties regarding student placement, supervision, insurance requirements, compliance with applicable laws, and coordination of educational experiences. Pearland ISD will provide appropriate on-site learning experiences and qualified supervision, while Sam Houston State University will coordinate student placements, ensure participating students meet all applicable requirements, and maintain professional liability insurance for participating students.

The initial term of the agreement will commence upon full execution and continue through May 31, 2029, with two automatic one-year renewal options unless terminated by either party with ninety (90) days' written notice.

Executive Summary: Request for Proposal (RFP) 26-0121-1 for Fine Arts Contracted Services was issued to establish a multi-vendor, non-exclusive requirements contract for districtwide fine arts services. The solicitation was structured as a **rolling bid award** that supports multiple vendor awards and allows incremental vendor additions throughout the contract term. The rolling bid structure helps ensure the District maintains adequate vendor availability, promotes competition, and provides campuses and departments with timely access to services when needed and enables assignments based on best value in accordance with Texas Education Code §44.031.

Consistent with these objectives, the RFP was advertised in accordance with TEC §44.031 and distributed to all applicable vendors registered in the District's electronic bidding system. The Board approved the initial vendor awards on March 17, 2026.

Subject: Consider Approval of a Memorandum of Understanding with Alvin College

Executive Summary: Administration recommends approval of the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between Pearland ISD and Alvin College to provide dual enrollment opportunities for eligible Pearland ISD students during the 2026–2027 academic year. The proposed Memorandum of Understanding establishes the terms and responsibilities governing the Dual Enrollment Program between Pearland ISD and Alvin College for the period of August 24, 2026, through August 13, 2027. The agreement complies with applicable requirements of the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, Texas Education Agency, and the Texas Administrative Code governing dual credit partnerships. Through this partnership, eligible Pearland ISD students will have the opportunity to enroll in satisfies both high school graduation requirements and college credit requirements.

Students participating in the Dual Enrollment Program will be responsible for tuition, fees, and textbooks in accordance with the Board-approved Dual Enrollment Tuition and Fee Schedule unless eligible for assistance through the Financial Aid for Swift Transfer (FAST) Program or other provisions identified in the agreement. Alvin College will provide faculty stipends and reimburse certain instructional support costs as outlined in the MOU. Executive Summary:

In 2016, the Pearland ISD Board of Trustees authorized the administration, in collaboration with the District Educational Improvement Committee (DEIC), to develop a District of Innovation (DOI) Plan in accordance with Texas Education Code Chapter 12A, established by the 84th Texas Legislature. The District of Innovation designation provides eligible school districts with local flexibility from certain provisions of the Texas Education Code, allowing districts to better align practices with local priorities while supporting innovation in curriculum, instruction, personnel, operations, and student services.

The Board subsequently approved a five-year renewal of the DOI Plan for the 2021–2026 term. During the 2025–2026 school year, district administration conducted a comprehensive review of the current plan to evaluate its effectiveness, continued relevance, and alignment with district needs. Based on that review, revisions were recommended to preserve appropriate local flexibility, enhance operational efficiency, support high-quality educational services for all students, and align the plan with Pearland ISD's 2025–2029 Strategic Plan.

The proposed District of Innovation Plan was presented to the District Educational Improvement Committee (DEIC) on April 13, 2026. Following discussion and stakeholder input, the DEIC approved the revised plan by vote during its May 11, 2026, meeting. Administration recommends Board approval of the renewed District of Innovation Plan for the next five-year term.

Subject: Ratification of Emergency Procurements Due to Immediate Need

Executive Summary:

Administration requests Board ratification of the emergency purchases described below. Due to the immediate operational needs created by two separate and unrelated emergency events, the purchases were made outside the District's normal competitive procurement process to facilitate the timely restoration of essential campus operations and are now presented for Board ratification.

1. PACE – Emergency Electrical Repairs (FY 2026)

A complete power outage occurred at PACE after a bird-related incident damaged the campus electrical system. The outage was determined to be the result of an unexpected external event rather than equipment malfunction and required immediate electrical repairs to restore power and prevent further damage to district property. Emergency electrical repair services were obtained from Pieper-Houston Electric utilizing TIPS Contract No. 2610402 – Trades, Labor, Materials (JOC-IDIQ) in an amount not to exceed \$50,000.

2. Pearland Junior High West – Emergency Mold Remediation and Ceiling Tile Replacement (FY 2027)

Following a complete power outage at Pearland Junior High West, moisture intrusion occurred within the facility, resulting in mold growth and damage to ceiling tiles. Immediate remediation was required to address health and safety concerns, prevent further damage to district property, and restore affected areas for occupancy. Emergency remediation and ceiling tile replacement services were obtained from Skilled Construction utilizing HCDE/Choice Partners Contract No. 24-04TC-26 – Maintenance (All Trades) & Job Order Contracting – Concrete/Earthwork & Improvements in the amount of \$32,424.78.
