DISCUSSION

5. Superintendent's Report
5.1 Enrollment is up by 45 students compared to last year.

- 5.2 Dr. Sever commended the Rafer Johnson Junior High staff for a successful promotion ceremony, congratulated the promoting student class, and recognized teacher Lisa Kiser for her 39 years of service to the District.
- 5.3 Principals had a fantastic year and will be checking out the second week of June for a much deserved break.
- 5.4 We look forward to administrators and staff joining the upcoming Project Surf Camp.
- 5.5 Maintenance continues to ramp up with several summer projects. We look forward to seeing all of their hard work come to fruition.
- 5.6 Dr. Sever introduced A-Train Tournaments, who recently hosted a pickle ball tournament at Rafer Johnson Junior High, drawing over 175 participants. A-Train Tournaments presented the Kingsburg Community Education Foundation with a check for \$4,800.
- 5.7 Mr. Stovall and Mr. Rodriguez' diligence on the LCAP and 2026-2027 budget was acknowledged.
- 5.8 Dr. Sever thanked Human Resources for their continuous efforts finalizing employee contracts and processing several new hires.
- 5.9 We are looking forward to summer school starting with the newly adopted curriculum, designed to prevent "summer slide."
6. Assistant Superintendent- Curriculum & Instruction, Special Projects' Report
 - 6.1. Local Indicator Report
 - 6.2. LCAP Presentation
 - 6.2.1. Mr. Stovall presented the 2026–2027 LCAP, which was developed with input from educational partners, including site teams, SSC, ELAC, DELAC, and PAC as well as a new addition, including two students. The District continues to show strong academic performance, with ELA and Math scores exceeding state averages, and significant progress among key subgroups such as English Learners and socioeconomically disadvantaged students. Additionally, the District showed growth in Science and outperformed the state average of Chronic Absenteeism. The areas of greatest need include intervention and support for English learners, low income and foster youth student groups, mental health services and support, and ongoing staff training and professional development. The five LCAP goals focus on: ensuring access to basic services and safe facilities; targeted academic intervention and staff training; expanding access to a broad, rigorous curriculum focusing on 21st-century learning and college and career readiness skills; promoting a safe and welcoming school climate; and reducing chronic absenteeism at Island Community Day School. The District will continue to track progress through local indicators, aligning efforts with the California Dashboard to support improved student outcomes.
7. Assistant Superintendent- Business Services' Report
 - 7.1. Budget Presentation:
 - 7.1.1. Mr. Rodriguez presented the 2026–2027 July 1 Budget, which includes a financial forecast through 2028–2029. The District's budget is based on the FCMAT LCFF Calculator v. 27.1b and the Governor's May Revise. Total revenues for 2026–2027 are estimated at \$40.97 million, driven primarily by LCFF sources. As the District enters Year 4 of the California Community Schools Partnership Program (CCSPP), the enacted budget is expected to provide clarity regarding proposed ongoing CCSPP funding. Additionally, capital outlay expenditures are set to increase to accommodate expansion at Washington School. The District successfully maintains its reserves above the state minimum threshold through 2028–2029. The multi-year projections will be closely monitoring enrollment, staffing, and funding fluctuations to maintain long-term fiscal health.
 - 7.2. News and Projects Around The District:
 - 7.2.1. Rafer Johnson Junior High: A wall will be constructed to divide the Room 13. Vendors will be installing carpet, tackboard and furniture in the old home economics area. A new Trane Chiller will be ordered, replacing the old system.
 - 7.2.2. Washington: TK/Kindergarten enrollment is strong, filling 15 classrooms. Typically, we see an influx of students during the month of August. To prepare for the influx, we will turn rooms 17 and 18 into classrooms, with the library being moved to a temporary portable unit.
