*Getting ready for Third Grade!*

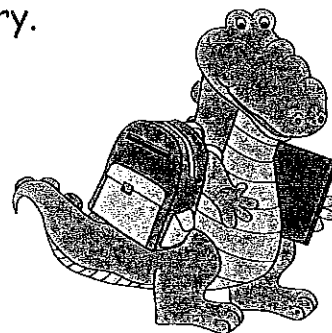
Summer time is a time for fun reading! We are so excited for you to read the book How to be Cool in the Third Grade by Betsy Duffey.
