Dress for Success Expectations

Tops: Polo Style Shirts

Solid in color and have a collar.

Polo Colors: Dark Green, Gold/Yellow, White, Black (Blue, and Red are also permitted)

Custom Polo (Optional): Can be ordered from Printworks St Pete

Fit: They must fit neatly and not be oversized or undersized (must extend below the waistline).

Logos: Must be small (quarter size)

Also acceptable: School-approved Tyrone Middle School Spirit and Club shirts may be worn on Fridays

Outerwear: Plain crewneck sweatshirts, sweaters, and jackets that are solid color. Students must wear polo under ALL outerwear.

Hoods and Headwear Not Permitted: Hoodies and other outerwear with a hood attached is NOT permitted on campus. Head gear such as caps, hats and bandanas shall not be worn.

Bottoms: Pants/Shorts/Skirts:

Solid in color, uniform/Chino style

Colors: Khaki or black (blue uniform pants are also permitted)

Fit: They must be neat in appearance, worn at the waist with no exposed skin or underwear. Shorts and skirts must be no shorter than mid-thigh (within 2 inches of kneecap, minimum of 7" inseam).

Bottoms Not Permitted: The bottoms may not be torn or have rips. Leggings, Athletic/spandex pants, Knit type shorts/pants, Bike Shorts, Basketball Shorts, Sweatpants and PJ Pants are also not permitted.

Friday Blue Jean Exception : Blue jeans are allowed on Fridays. Blue jean must at least knee length, un-ripped/no holes/no rips/no frays. No midriff, underwear or rear skin should not be shown when the student is standing or sitting.

Footwear: Safe and appropriate. Shoes must have a closed toe and closed back.

Footwear Not Permitted: Crocs, slides, clogs/mules and slippers are not acceptable footwear

Dress Code (Policy 5500.04)

The dress and grooming of Pinellas County Public Schools' students shall contribute to the health and safety of the individual, promote a positive educational environment, and not disrupt the educational activities and processes of the school. These standards of dress and grooming apply to all students in the public schools of Pinellas County, unless a specific exemption is granted by the principal. Apparel that disrupts educational activities and processes of the school will result in the removal of the student from the regular school environment until acceptable apparel can be secured for the student. The administration will be the final judge about whether a student's clothing is appropriate for school or whether it will create an environmental climate that is distracting to learning. Principals, faculty, and staff members will enforce the dress code. Failure to comply with the dress code will be handled similarly to other disciplinary infractions.

If the school has a mandatory school uniform policy, the student must adhere to those requirements.

Tyrone Middle School has a mandatory school uniform policy.

Principal, faculty, and staff members will enforce the dress code expectations.
