Information will be shared with parents at the Open House held in August. The school will also post information on the website under Title I and in the main office.

The annual Title I meeting is held at the beginning of every school year. During this meeting, the parents are informed of the schools participation in Title I.A., as well as explain Title I.A requirements. We state the right of parents to be involved and encourage their support and partnership. We will utilize surveys to obtain parent input and feedback at the beginning and end-of-year.

We host Curriculum Nights to provide families with information regarding grade-level curriculum, instructional programs, and academic assessments. Since this is a K-2 school, MAP assessments are not administered. Instead, the district uses STAR Assessments for English Language Arts and Mathematics and Galileo Assessments for Science to monitor student progress and achievement.

Parent-Teacher Conferences are held in the fall to further communicate student progress, curriculum expectations, and assessment information with families.

During the annual Fall Title I Meeting, parents are provided with an overview of the district's assessment program, including the most recent Galileo benchmark data and schoolwide academic goals for the year. Information regarding testing windows, implementation timelines, and achievement levels is shared, and parents are given opportunities to ask questions regarding the assessments and student performance data.

Assessment information and updates are also shared during Curriculum Nights, in the monthly family newsletter, and through district communications. In addition, district assessment results are sent home with families following each benchmark assessment period.

At Bermuda Primary School, we host several parent nights to assist parents in learning about the STAR and Galileo assessments and reading the reports. We host curriculum nights to ensure they know about our core content and how to use the Tyler student information system to monitor their child's progress. Fall conferences are held for open feedback. Families receive monthly newsletters to update on school happenings, attendance data, ELA and math performance data.
