Student and Parent Handbook

The Student and Parent Handbook will be available on our school website and will explain our school policies and procedures.

Dress Code

The Academy requires students to wear uniforms purchased from FlynnO'Hara Uniforms (flynnohara.com) that have the CBCA logo. Please be aware that if you buy clothes from other sources, they will not be acceptable. Students may continue to wear previously purchased Dennis items or current FlynnO'Hara uniform products.

No hoodies, sweatshirts, or sweaters and fleeces that are not CBCA Uniforms may be worn in the classroom. School Spiritwear hoodies or sweatshirts may not be worn in the classroom. If your child is out of dress code in any way, he/she may be sent to the office to contact you.

Girls Dress Reminders

Girls' uniform skirts must touch the floor when kneeling in an upright position. Girls in K5-4th grades wear the uniform jumper. Girls in 5th and 6th grade may wear either the jumper or the skirt. Girls in the 7th-12th grades wear the uniform skirt. All girls may wear the uniform pants as well.

No shoes with open toes, crocs, or slip-on shoes without a back are permitted. The purpose of these guidelines is for the shoe to be secure to the foot. Hair must be a **natural** color. Highlights and removable accessories are permitted, but hair should not be dyed unnatural colors, such as pink, green, blue, purple, etc.

Girls may wear a modest amount of jewelry but should not go to extremes. Due to safety reasons, elementary girls are allowed to wear only small earrings. Tattoos and body piercings other than earrings are prohibited.



Boys Dress Reminders

Hair may not touch the collar or top of the ears. It must be neat and be one natural color. While boys may choose any appropriate hair style, students may not use an elastic or other temporary device to compensate for hair that is otherwise too long. Piercings and tattoos are prohibited. Shoes such as work boots, hiking boots, or crocs are not acceptable.

While many pants look similar to our uniform, only items purchased from Dennis or FlynnO'Hara Uniforms are acceptable.

P.E./Activity Uniform

All students must own a P.E./Activity Uniform, which consists of a Calvary T-Shirt and a pair of blue shorts or athletic pants. T-shirts purchased from our spirit shop may also be worn for P.E. Students who do not have P.E. as a class must still have an activity uniform.

When we attend picnics and have certain field events, students are required to wear their P.E./activity uniform in order to participate. This uniform must be worn on P.E. days in order to participate in class.

The fee for the P.E. uniform is \$12 for the T-shirt and \$14 for the shorts and may be paid at either office.

Sports

The fee for participation in Middle School/JV or Varsity sports is \$100 per student per sport. This fee helps to offset the cost of uniforms, referees, equipment, and rental space.

In order to try out, students in grades 6-12 who are interested in participating in a sport must have a physical before that sport season begins. A physical form is included in this packet or can be printed off the athletic tab on the school website. **Tryouts for girls volleyball and boys soccer begin on August 17. A fall sports intent form to complete will sent by email in July.**

My name is Mr. Tompkins and I will be returning to coach the Boys Soccer team this year. I will also be joined by Mr. Palmer to help coach the team too. Both of us have years of experience playing and coaching soccer. We look forward to coaching and helping the soccer team reach its full potential.

I hope you are enjoying your summer break from school, but wanted to inform you that **Soccer Tryouts will begin on August 17**, which is only 2 month away. I would like to encourage you to not only try out but to start to prepare yourself for the season.

Here are a few suggestions for preparation exercises:

1. **Running** – Any distance running (jogging for 20 minutes, a 2-mile run, trail or course runs- all would be great)
2. **Sprinting** – 50 to 100 meter sprints (5-10 a day)
3. **Ball Touches** – Simply touch the ball with any part of your foot 100 times, keeping your head up
4. **Ball Moves** – Practice 1 or 2 ball moves/fakes that you can use in a game (for example, the stepover, the spin, behind the leg). Be creative or look some up on YouTube and start with something that's not too hard to master.

Feel free to do other things, but if you work on these exercises, you will be much more prepared for the season. I am looking forward to our upcoming season!

FOOTNOTES

1. If DT vaccine is given in place of DTP or DTaP, a physician documented medical contraindication to the pertussis-component is required.
2. Proof of immunity by positive blood test is acceptable in lieu of vaccine history for hepatitis B, polio, and measles, mumps, rubella, and varicella, **but revaccination may be more expedient.**
3. Due to the widespread use of combination products for the primary series of childhood vaccines, the 12–15-month dose-of Hib containing vaccine should be assessed after the 15-month doctor's visit. Hib and PCV (Prevnar™) are not required for children older than 59 months (5 years) of age.
4. All doses of measles, mumps, rubella, and varicella vaccines should be given on or after the first birthday. However, upon record review for students in preschool through 12th grade, a preschool or school may count as valid vaccine doses administered less than or equal to four (4) days before the first birthday.
5. Two (2) doses of varicella vaccine are required for students entering Kindergarten, 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th, 9th, 10th, 11th and 12th grades and for previously unvaccinated students 13 years of age or older. Medical diagnosis of varicella disease is acceptable in lieu of vaccination. Medical diagnosis is a documented history of disease provided by a healthcare provider. Documentation must include month and year.
6. Four (4) doses of DTP/DTaP are required for children less than 7 years old. Three (3) doses of tetanus and diphtheria containing vaccine (any combination of the following —Tdap, DT or Td) are required for children 7 years of age and older.
7. Polio vaccine is not required for persons 18 years of age and older.
