Description of School: Casteel High School is a public, comprehensive four-year high school, which emphasizes a college preparatory curriculum, while offering technology and vocational based programs along with fine arts and athletics to meet the needs of all students. Casteel was established in the fall of 2015, and graduated its first class in the spring of 2019. The Casteel community challenges students in an interactive, collaborative environment that values individual differences and provides opportunities for all students to realize their potential. CCHS is accredited by @CogniaOrg! which symbolizes our commitment to meeting high standards and continuous improvement.

Description of Community: The Chandler Unified School District is located in the Southeastern part of the Phoenix metropolitan area. Chandler Unified serves over 45,000 students in grades K-12 in 44 schools and encompasses 80 square miles, though not all of the City of Chandler. In 2020, Chandler Unified School District was recognized as the #1 school district in the Phoenix Area (Niche, 2019).

Reading, language and mathematics are at the core of students' education. The district has specific expectations for students in these three basic areas. Academic achievement is a high priority in the district as evidenced by test scores above the state and national averages. Our students consistently score among the top in the state on college-entrance exams. Because of the outstanding educational programs offered, almost all of the district schools have been cited for excellence by outside organizations, including the Arizona Department of Education and the U.S. Department of Education. CUSD received an A+ rating for the 6th straight year. It also has 11 of the top 100 schools in the state.

Due to a booming city population and open enrollment laws, Chandler Unified is one of the fastest-growing districts in the state. The district has opened 23 schools since 1998 and now consists of 30 elementary, 8 junior highs, 6 high schools and 3 alternative schools. Parent options at the elementary level include four Chandler Traditional Academies. At the secondary level, families can choose Chandler Online Academy, Chandler Traditional Junior High, Hamilton Prep Academy, Hill Learning Academy and the Chandler Early College program at Chandler Gilbert Community College.
