C. CBO Report: Robert Irving - A brief construction updates our RCSD this afternoon to talk about the consolidation project with the water service district for the high school campus. So, I kind of, when I think of that maker space, envision them in there working with their robots, maybe not every day, but at least you'll get your fair share of time in that maker space. So, congratulations again, and you made us very proud. Made us very, very proud, just your hard work. I don't know how you do it robots. I don't think that's up my alley. But anyway, I wouldn't remind everybody that it's hard to believe, but we are getting close to testing time. Everybody's like testing we don't really care about, we do care about testing. And I just want to give a shout out and remind our parents, please, it's really, really important that during every day, we have our students there on time, learning, but especially during testing time. We want to highlight the brilliant students that we have in Southern Kern and we know we have smart children in every school, but if we don't show it on those tests, then the state's looking at us like, hmm, what happened down there? They did not take this test seriously, or what happened. So, I just want to encourage all of our parents to please talk to your child, give them that hearty breakfast every morning, so when they come for the test, they're ready to show us, well, show the state how good we are in Southern Kern. I spent quite a bit of time with Mr. Tinich, who is the CTE Coordinator at Rosamond High. We're already planning for dual enrollment classes to have on campus during the day, starting the fall semester for all of our high school students. So, we came up with quite a few. I directed him to continue working with Mrs. Hargus to assess who really, really qualifies to teach these dual enrollment classes aligned with Antelope Valley College, so we should have quite a few classes offered that not only will you get high school credit, but you will get college credit as well. So even though, we're still in this year, we're all already in the planning stages to make it even better and more engaging for our students next year. That's pretty much it, except for the attendance awards for me. February Attendance Recognition: Okay, I had, out of six schools, we had five of them that dropped in the month of February in attendance. So Elementary, although this school, too, dropped 1.31% which is a significant number, but again, with 92.26% Westpark Elementary. Yes, Mrs. Ament, congratulations again. I happened to be at Westpark few couple weeks ago and observed Mrs. Ament doing her attendance conferences. I was so impressed. She was really reaching out to the parents and asking them, is there something going on that we're not aware of. Is there something more that we can do here at Westpark to help you? She talked about short term independent study. I was very, very pleased to see how receptive the parents were to her phone calls. Now, of course, a couple of the parents she called, their child had like, 93.88% attendance, which I was thinking, are they on your bad list. I didn't say anything, but Westpark. So anyway, but congratulations, Mr. Holmes, keep up that good work. Best secondary attendance. I love the battle here between our secondary schools and this school was the only school out of the six that showed growth and they showed a 0.09% with 92.21%, almost as good as Westpark, Tropico Middle School. I know Mr. Konegni is also working on attendance out there, so it looks like it's paying off a little bit. And being the only school that showed growth this past month of February, Tropico also gets the most improved.
