A. Recognition Classified of the Year: Leanne Hargus reported the following: Welcome, everyone. It is my honor to be able to present these awards to our amazing classified employees. She organizes everything at the beginning of the school year. All of our curriculum comes and it is delivered to classrooms. I don't even know, she's limited, she moves so fast, it's delivered. Our teachers never go without, because she's able to order and do everything so efficiently, so we're so thankful.) Tropic Middle School's Classified Employee of the Year, Megan Riley. - B. RTA report: *Absent* CSEA report: Gary Jones reported the following: I am glad to see a lot of people here. I know awards really bring out a lot more people, big congratulations to all of our classified of the year. Thank you to the district for recognizing us. What they do every day is not easy. They are essential and very important to continue the functions of the business of the district and educating our students. I've worked with all of those people. They all deserve what recognition they are getting today, so thank you to HR for tonight. We have an MOU on the agenda, hoping to see an approval. When we voted to ratify, we did have eight no votes on that, but we had 57 yes votes, so very strong turnout for an MOU and big turnout for yes, so people are looking forward to having this pass, so we can get through this school year in a nice smooth fashion, and it's just a temporary fix to a big problem that we're hoping to solve in negotiations. So, looking forward to seeing that pass tonight. Thank you all very much.
- C. Student Board Member: Aliyah Finch reported the following: Congratulations to all the employees, they're amazing. They make the day possible. Drama has a play coming up, so I'll go see it. It looks pretty good.
- D. CBO Report: Robert Irving reported the following: Alrighty, congratulations to all for their awards tonight. Without classified, things get really dicey really quick, so all well-deserved, but we're somehow at the end of May. Last time I was here, we talked about Alice training that was meant to happen at RES, that happened very well, pretty well attended for training on a Saturday morning, so thank you to everybody who came out to that, giving me feedback on whether they liked it or not, and all that trouble to know going forward as we offered, and then there's something that ideally everybody likes it, but they don't get that kind of feedback, also that I got any of that for this one. They continue to work on English language arts essential standards, like half priority standards and assessments, and we continue to plan for summer school in regards to Torah.

- G. Associate Superintendent, Human Resources: Leanne Hargus reported the following: Good evening, everyone. It truly is an honor for me to be able to present the awards to our very deserving employees. As Robert mentioned, if we didn't have our classified staff then we wouldn't have good days, for sure. So, thank you to each and every one of them for all of the work that you do every day. Next week, we're going to be honoring our staff, classified and certificated, for their years of service, and that's 5, 10, 15, 20, 25 and 30 years, so that'll be exciting, and hopefully everybody will be able to come. Other than that, we're really busy over in HR. We are doing some teacher interviews, and they're going well. And I have to knock on wood, make sure the district has a few openings. We've had just a few openings all year. We're down to about four, so that's very exciting. So, as far as certificated, we're getting those down. Classified, we still have a few paras that we're we are trying to fill, but we are working to get those applicants, interview them, test them, and make sure they're qualified.

So just very exciting when we think about all the things that we hear about our kids and people like to point out or go on Facebook and talk about one thing that a kid did, but if you had been there that night and saw those kids, it just takes you to a different level, and the one thing that shocked me was they all love Mr. You. I was like, how could you love AP Calculus. They all loved it and loved him, and they were so happy to get through AP Calculus.
