EDUCATIONAL PARK

The Whitehall-Coplay School District serves approximately 4,300 students and is in Eastern Pennsylvania on a 143-acre campus of five schools, including Whitehall High School (9-12), Whitehall-Coplay Middle School (6-8), Zephyr Elementary (4-5), Steckel Elementary (2-3), and Gockley Elementary (K-1). In addition to these buildings, the campus also has an Education Center, field house, outdoor athletic fields, shipping and receiving building, garages, and two sports stadiums. The Whitehall Township Library is on the northeast corner of the campus.

WHITEHALL HIGH SCHOOL

Whitehall High School enrolls approximately 1,500 students in grades 9-12. Whitehall High School offers full-year courses across all core content areas along with half-year courses for most electives. Students are encouraged to select courses that are best suited to their career pathways, aptitudes, and interests and which will prepare them for college, business, trade schools, the armed forces, and employment. Course recommendations are made by teachers and are reviewed by the student's counselor. High school students can also participate in programs at the Lehigh Career and Technical Institute and are able to attend area colleges while continuing to attend classes and extracurricular activities at the sending school. The Class of 2027 has 370 students enrolled.

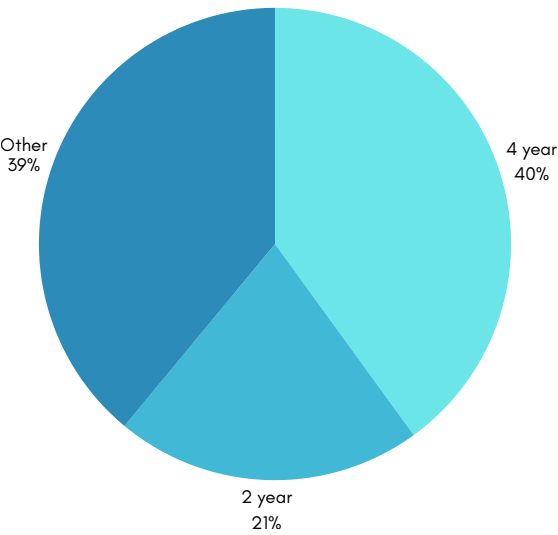

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

The Whitehall-Coplay School District requires that all students complete a minimum number of credits in order to receive a High School diploma. Students are required to complete a minimum of 25.5 Credits in order to graduate. Students must take a minimum of 7 credits per year except in their senior year when students must take a minimum of 6 credits.

SUBJECT

- English: 4 credits
- Social Studies: 4 credits
- Mathematics & Science: 3 of each plus 1 extra credit of math or science
- Art/Humanities: 1 credit
- Wellness and Fitness: 2 credits
- Career Pathway Electives: 6 credits
- Community Service: 0.5 credit

*During high school, students must take at least one (1.0) credit in art/humanities. Any elective course offered in the following departments may be used to satisfy the Art/Humanities requirement: English, Social Studies, World Language, Family& Consumer Science, Art and Music. A minimum of 2 consecutive credits of a World Language is recommended for students planning on attending a college or university of higher education.

Students are required to enroll in the course, Financial Literacy, as a 10th-grade student. Students must take Health 1 (0.5 Credit), Health 2 (0.5 Credit), and PE 1 (0.5 Credit). Students may select from various options for PE 2 (0.5 Credit).

The Grade Point Average (G.P.A.) is a system for calculating a student's scholastic average on a 0 to 4 scale and is used to determine class rank. The calculations are performed in the following manner: Each course has an assigned Credit Value. For example, Health 1 has a Credit Value of 0.5 and English 9 has a Credit Value of 1.0. At the end of the course, the final average is calculated and a grade is assigned. For example, a full year course earning a 1.0 Credit Value will have a Credit Value of 1.0 times the final grade. A semester course earning a 0.5 Credit Value will have a Credit Value of 0.5 times the final grade. All final grades are multiplied by the Credit Value of the course. The product of all courses are added and divided by the total credits, resulting in Grade Points. A cumulative G.P.A. is calculated upon completion of semester and year long courses. During a student's senior year, the cumulative year-to-date G.P.A. is calculated only after the completion of all coursework and exams.
