Welcome back!

I hope your summer was restful and full of good moments, maybe even a few of them spent with us in youth or adult programming. As a new school year begins, I'm proud of the way Community Education continues to bring fresh thinking and innovation to our district, always with the same goal in mind: creating the best possible experiences for you, your children, your family, your neighbors, and our community.

This past year, our district focused on five areas of emphasis, each chosen to strengthen the programs and partnerships you rely on. I want to call special attention to the one closest to the heart of our work: early learning and family programming. So much of what happens in early childhood, from our Early Learning and Family Center to Early Childhood Family Education, preschool, and the family connections that grow alongside them, lives right here within Community Education.

This year we invested deeply in our vision for that programming, working to expand access, reimagine our learning spaces, and strengthen the earliest experiences for Edina's youngest learners and their families. It's some of the most meaningful work we do as Edina Public Schools, because it shapes a child's very first relationship with learning.

Here's a brief look at the other four areas of emphasis from this past year:

- **Spanish Dual Language at Countryside Elementary** completed its fourth year and welcomed its first third-grade class, and continuing to plan for future grades.
- **Elementary Acceleration and Talent Development** took an inclusive, asset-based look at how we recognize and grow every child's strengths early, expanding opportunities for all learners.
- **Edina High School – Defining Excellence** drew on a year of community co-design to shape a vision for real-world internships, capstone experiences, and a learning model where every student is known and supported.
- **Strategic Safety and Security** brought a multi-year, community-grounded assessment focused on keeping our schools both safe and genuinely welcoming.

Thank you for being part of this community. Whether your connection to Edina Public Schools is just beginning or spans generations, we can't wait to learn and grow alongside you again this fall.

In every class, kids are encouraged to ask questions, experiment, and collaborate, leaving with a sense of achievement, new skills, and a stronger interest in STEM that can grow with them over time.

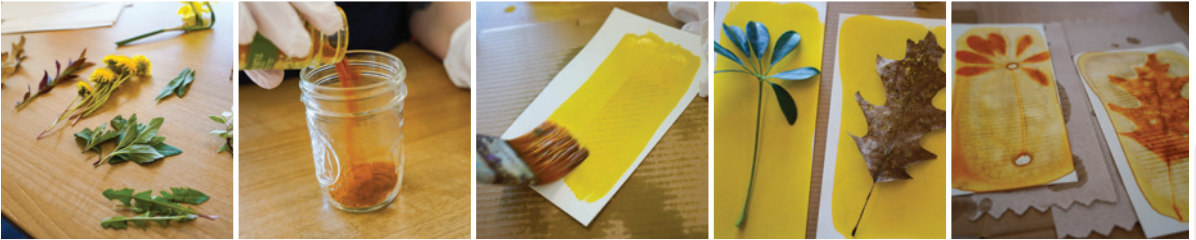

Painting Without Paint – Anthotypes!



An **anthotype** is an alternative photographic process that involves creating images using photosensitive materials derived from natural sources such as plants, flowers, or fruits.



Materials:

- Turmeric
- Rubbing alcohol
- Card stock or thicker paper
- Paint brush
- A piece of strong cardboard
- Glass or clear plastic (like from a framed picture)
- Baking soda
- Hot water
- Collection of leaves, stickers, shapes and objects

FUN FACT

Why does turmeric change color with baking soda?

Turmeric contains curcumin, which is a natural pH indicator. That means it changes color depending on how acidic or basic (alkaline) its environment is. In acidic or neutral environments (like water or vinegar), turmeric stays yellow. In a basic or alkaline environment (like when you spray it with water and baking soda), it turns reddish-orange. This color change is due to a shift in the structure of the curcumin molecule, which affects how it absorbs and reflects light. How wild is this?!

Steps:

1. Mix a bit of turmeric with rubbing alcohol. You want it to be a liquid base mixture. A suggested ratio is 1 tsp turmeric powder to 4 tsp rubbing alcohol.
2. Have in mind that turmeric stains A LOT! So better use a glass jar or disposable utensils and gloves.
3. Filter the mix through a coffee filter. This step isn't necessary, but helpful to stop small particles from adhering to your final piece!
4. Away from light, paint a thin layer of the solution onto the pieces of paper.
5. Place your prepared paper onto your cardboard.
6. Place your plant/shape/shadow on to the paper (some people like to plan out the sizes of their paper and shapes ahead of time).
7. Cover anthotypes with your piece of glass.
8. Take your project (glass on paper on cardboard) outside and let sit in a sunny spot for approximately 3 hours.
9. In a shallow container, mix a baking soda solution of 2 tsp baking soda and ½ cup hot water.
10. Dunk your anthotype in the baking soda solution to halt the chemical process. Let dry!

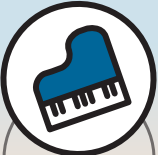

Hitting the Slopes

Edina Community Education's Middle School Ski & Snowboard Club Carves Out Something New

For years, Edina Community Education offered a rich lineup of enrichment programming, but when it came to middle schoolers and winter, there was a gap. No dedicated outdoor activity took 6th through 8th graders out of the usual routine and into something genuinely exciting. That changed last winter with the launch of the inaugural Middle School Ski & Snowboard Club.

From Idea to the Hill

The club was born from a simple observation. Enrichment Specialist Lucas Bates had seen something similar work well at other districts and brought the idea to the team. "Since we live in MinneSNOWta, where winter is basically a lifestyle, we wanted to turn those long, chilly months into an epic adventure for students to connect and build friendships that stick," Lucas said. The enrichment team had been consistently looking for opportunities designed specifically for middle schoolers, and Ski and Snowboard Club checked every box.

Logistics were designed to lower the barrier to participation. Rather than asking families to sort out transportation on their own, the club rolled to Hyland Hills in coach buses complete with open seating and onboard Wi-Fi. "The ride to the venue is pretty epic," Lucas said.

More Than Just Skiing

What makes this club stand out is the intentional freedom built into the experience. Students arrive and, within a safe and supervised environment, get to decide how they spend their time. Some kids spent every minute in the terrain park. Others settled into the chalet and struck up conversations with students from other schools. A few ducked in just long enough to grab a slushie before heading back out, blue tongues and all.

"There's a great deal of autonomy afforded to students," said Youth Development and Community Engagement Program Manager Maggie Arbeiter. "You're in charge of your own experience, with friendly, experienced staff hanging out with you." The balance of freedom paired with supportive adult presence is exactly what middle schoolers need. Many are navigating the shift toward more self-directed choices, and this club gives them a low-stakes place to practice. They choose how adventurous to be on the hill. They choose who to hang out with. They choose what kind of night they want to have.

Building Connection Outside the Classroom

Community is woven into the DNA of the club. Students arrive with their friend groups and

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often leave with bigger ones, having connected with peers in a setting refreshingly removed from the pressures of the school day. “So many middle school students genuinely benefit from a space to hang out with their peers and experiment with how they would spend their time when they are the one with the decision-making power,” Maggie said.

What’s Next: Year Two and Beyond

The team is already looking ahead with big plans. This year’s club will again partner with Hyland Hills,

with an exciting addition: on-site lessons available for families who want structured instruction, making the club more accessible for any skill level. Longer term, the vision includes expanding to venues like Afton Alps, opening the program to additional grade levels, and, according to Maggie, launching official club merch. “I’m pushing hard for that this year,” they said.

For now, the heart of the club remains what it was from day one: a Friday night on a snowy hill, a group of middle schoolers with the freedom to be themselves, and a staff team committed to making winter in Minnesota something worth celebrating.

Hornet Central

Hornet Central provides a reliable, safe, and welcoming space for middle schoolers to start their day. For a flat monthly fee, registered students can attend any morning the program is in session. No specific-day drop-in option is available. The program is open at both Valley View and South View Middle Schools from 8:00 to 9:00 am. Students are released to their regular school day at 9:00 am.

Morning Options

Students have the flexibility to choose how they spend their time:

- **Relax & Prep:** Socialize with friends, finish up homework, or play board games.
- **Get Active:** Participate in organized games in the gym or head outdoors (weather permitting).

Program Details

- **Registration:** All students **must be pre-registered** to participate. No specific-day drop-in option is available
- **Arrival:** Doors open promptly at **8:00 am**. Students may arrive any time between 8:00 and 9:00 am.
- **Schedule:** The program runs only on full school days. There is no Hornet Central on **late start days** or **non-school days**.
- **Expectations:** School-day conduct and behavioral expectations apply at all times.
- **Transportation:** Parents/guardians are responsible for transportation; no school busing is available for this early option.

Following Passions North

How One EHS Student Earned His Service Letter at the Iditarod

Each year, Edina High School students earn their service letter by logging more than 120 hours of volunteer work across a wide range of causes: tutoring peers, helping at youth sports camps, cleaning up local environments, supporting food shelves, and assisting at animal shelters, among many others. This past year, 238 EHS students crossed that threshold, a testament to a school culture that treats giving back as something worth working toward.

For student Cristian Olson, a new transfer to Edina this past year, earning that letter meant pursuing a lifelong dream and doing it in -40 degree weather, thousands of miles from home.

From Minnesota to the Alaskan frontier

Cristian has been fascinated by the Iditarod, the legendary 1,000-mile Alaskan sled dog race that honors the state's Indigenous heritage and history, since he was six years old. His father is originally from Alaska, so the race is a part of their family history.

When he discovered that this year's race aligned with his spring break, he applied to volunteer. His acceptance into the program turned out to be one of the most unusual service experiences any EHS student completed last year.

Working at ground level, or "z level" as he calls it, Cristian helped feed the sled dogs, guided them into their kennels after runs, assisted with merchandise sales, managed security to ensure the animals could rest, and shoveled snow to build wind barriers that protected the dogs from the brutal conditions. His shifts started at 3:00 am.

The bond between human and animal

Cristian came away from the experience with something he didn't expect: a deeper understanding of what service can mean. "I learned to appreciate the bond between a human and an animal," he said. "There is so much work that goes into these races — allowing me to help, to give them a moment of rest or a break, can go a long way. I got to give love and connection to these animals."

He was struck, too, by the scale of volunteer effort behind the race itself. The event is run entirely by people willing to stand in -40 degree weather

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because they believe in preserving Alaskan heritage. “Every single second matters in a race,” he reflected, “and a lot of lives would have been lost for the historical reason this event became a real thing.”

Back in Minnesota, Cristian has done dog sledding himself and knows the commands. The Iditarod experience deepened what was already a genuine passion. When asked whether he’d recommend using service to discover what you care about, his advice was direct: “If you have an interest, follow it.”

Variety beyond Alaska

Cristian’s service letter wasn’t built on one trip. He also delivered food to those in need, participated in Feed My Starving Children, and handed out electrolyte drinks to runners during a marathon. “I didn’t feel like I was ever working,” he said. “It was awesome.”

He’s already logging hours toward next year’s letter, with plans to letter again as a junior and senior. For a student who transferred to Edina this year and lettered in service for the first time, that kind of commitment speaks for itself.

High School Volunteer Opportunities

High School student volunteers provide support throughout the school year in numerous different programs and schools within EPS. These students offer individual attention to younger students, act as role models, and help foster an inclusive learning environment. Community Service Letter Program

Edina High School students entering grades 9-12 can earn a letter in Community Service. Students can earn a letter by making a difference by serving their community and others.

2. Attend an in-person orientation (October)
3. Complete an application (due mid-December)
4. Complete 120 hours of service with at least 60 hours addressing a specific social issue. Hours must be completed by early April 2027 (deadline TBA)
5. By the April deadline, students will submit the following materials on Schoology:
 - a. Hours Log demonstrating 120 hours of service
 - b. One letter of recommendation from a supervisor with an organization you volunteered with
 - c. Creative Reflection Artifact that represents your service work
6. Share your creative artifact and service experiences in a reflection event with peers and families

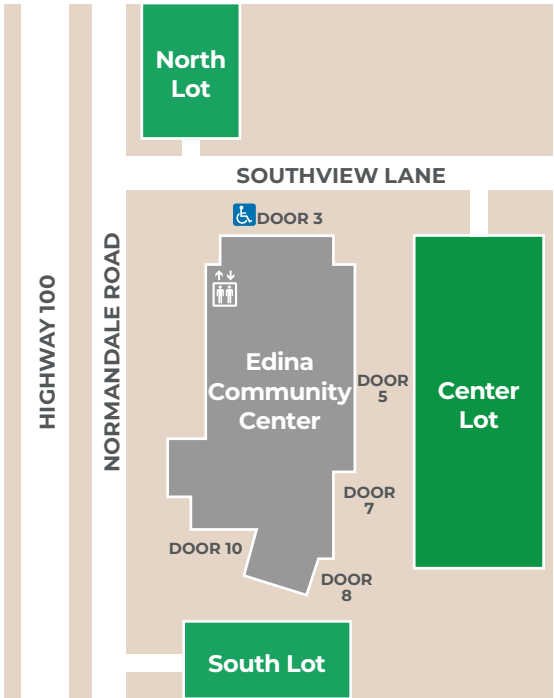
