District goal

- During the 26-27 school year, we will increase content mastery for student groups in tested subject areas on the Georgia Milestones by 3%.

School Goals

- During the 2026-2027 SY, we will increase reading achievement by raising the percentage of students in grades K–2 who score on or above grade level on i-Ready Reading from 49% to 52%, and the percentage of students in grades 3–5 who score at the Developing Learner level or above on the Georgia Milestones ELA EOG from 49.37% to 51.37% during the 2026–2027 school year.
- During the 2026-2027 SY, we will increase math achievement by raising the percentage of students in grades K–2 who score on or above grade level on i-Ready Reading from 40% to 43%, and the percentage of students in grades 3–5 who score at the Developing Learner level or above on the Georgia Milestones Math EOG from 55 % to 58% during the 2026–2027 school year.

Focus Areas

- Vocabulary development, read for fluency and comprehension
- Number sense, fact fluency, multi-step problem solving

- Provide students with the opportunity to build fluency skill in reading using BeanStack and i-Ready.
- Provide students with the opportunity to build math skill by using First In Math and i-Ready.

- Build my fluency skills by sing BeanStack and i-Ready.
- Review Math facts for at least 20 minutes using First In Math and i-Ready.
- Read books and complete a reading log on my Lexile level nightly.

- Visit the suggested websites and encourage my child to practice building vocabulary and math skills (i-Ready, BeanStack, and First In Math).
- Ensure students complete and pass 2 reading and math lessons on i-Ready.
- Ensure adequate time for reading with my child each night.
