A Message from the Elementary Principal

Greetings, Trojan families!

Welcome to the 2025-2026 school year! I am so honored and excited to join the Southwestern Elementary School team!

I've spent the summer getting to know the staff, a few of our students, and their families. After spending the last 14 years in Charlotte, North Carolina, my wife and I recently returned home to Western New York with our two daughters. In Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools, I served as a fifth-grade teacher, instructional coach, curriculum specialist, and most recently assistant principal.

I can't wait to get this school year started and see the faces of all our students come through the door each day. My priorities as we begin the school year will be to primarily observe and listen. I want to continue to learn what makes SWES a great place to teach and learn.

This summer we housed a few programs in the elementary school. We hosted guests from the BOCES 2 BOCES extended school year program, Little Seeds continued their programming, and we ran our own summer enrichment program for K-5 students. Our students in the enrichment program worked on reinforcing their literacy and math skills to prepare for the upcoming school year. They also participated in a variety of enrichment activities including star gazing in the planetarium, nature walks, e-sports, and physical education.

Curriculum

Our teachers will continue their work strengthening their collaboration and alignment to state learning standards through their Professional Learning Communities during the 2025-2026 school year.

We will also continue our focus on Learning for All and reinforce our mission of engaging and preparing students through strong core instruction and research-based, data driven intervention and enrichment.

School Opening & Schedule

Our first day of school with students is Tuesday, September 2, 2025. Open House takes place Wednesday, August 27, 2025. UPK and Kindergarten Open House is from 5:00-6:00 p.m. and Open House for grade 1-5 is from 5:00-6:30 p.m. Students are welcome to bring their supplies and leave them in their classrooms. Supply lists are available on the SWES page of the district website.

Students may be dropped off at 8:35 a.m. and wait at the main entrance until 8:50 a.m. If students are eating breakfast at school, they may enter through the cafeteria doors starting at 8:35 a.m. This year, breakfast and lunch are free for all students. Students

picked up in carpool will be dismissed at 3:15 p.m. and buses will be dismissed at 3:20 p.m. Please be vigilant in the carpool line to ensure the safety of all students.

Transportation

If your child was a bus rider last year, transportation has your child enrolled to ride the bus again this school year. New students, UPK, and Kindergarten students who will ride the bus will need to register either through the link on the SWCS website or by calling the transportation department at (716) 763-8391. The is the same process for any students who have a change of address or are planning to ride this year but were not bus riders last year. As we establish bus routes and routines at the beginning of the year, please be at your morning stop 10 minutes early for the first week. If you need to call in a transportation change, call the SWES office or send a note to school with your child. Our daily deadline to call in transportation changes is 1:30 p.m. to allow time for communication with staff and students.

A Message from the Middle School Principal

Dear Students and Families,

I welcome you all back for the start of another fantastic school year! I am excited to be starting my second year with the Southwestern Middle School community.

We have had a great summer preparing and getting ready for the start of the 2025-2026 school year. We finished a successful summer school program, offering social studies, math, ELA and science classes and enrichment opportunities in arts and crafts. Highlights include making pottery, rock candy, slime, puff mobiles and a field trip to the Roger Tory Peterson Institute.

A big thank you to teachers: Tina Clark, Aaron Emley, Jack Felton, Kim Pannes, and Diane LaGrega for providing our students with these creative opportunities.

We have also been preparing for a positive start to the school year here at SWMS. The maintenance and custodial staff have done a fantastic job ensuring our building is clean and ready for action when we get started in September.

The first full day for students is Tuesday, September 2, 2025. The earliest students should be arriving at school is 7:15 a.m. Buses will drop students off at 7:30 a.m. at the middle and high school. Students can wait for the 7:35 a.m. bell in the cafeteria or lobby by the office. Students will be considered tardy if they are not in class by the 7:45 a.m. bell.

I can't stress enough the importance of student attendance. For your child to reach their full potential and experience success, they must be present and on time for school every day.

Priority Areas

As we progress into this school year, our four priority areas will continue to guide our efforts and ensure we continue to provide the best possible education for our students.

- *The Student Experience:* Our school prioritizes creating a positive and inclusive student experience by setting clear behavioral expectations, promoting academic rigor, and ensuring that every student is supported in their learning and well-being. We are equally committed to fostering mental health and providing diverse co-curricular opportunities that enrich student growth beyond the classroom.

- *Community Connections:* Our school values strong community connections by fostering open

communication, encouraging meaningful parent involvement, and building collaborative partnerships with local organizations. We also prioritize creating positive, supportive relationships between families and school staff to enhance the overall educational experience.

- *The Staff Experience:* We are committed to enhancing the staff experience by fostering a strong sense of community and collaboration through professional learning communities. By supporting effective instructional practices and continuous professional growth, we empower staff to positively impact student learning.

- *A Safe and Welcoming Environment:* We prioritize a safe and welcoming environment by fostering a positive school culture and climate where all students and staff feel valued and supported. Through a focus on safety, security, and ongoing facility enhancements, we ensure our school remains inviting and a well-maintained space for learning and growth.

Trojan Troops

Our goal at Southwestern Middle School is to help our students not only grow academically but also socially, and emotionally. This year we will continue working towards this goal with our "Trojan Troops" which puts students in teams that meet regularly and focus on the Southwestern core values: Integrity, Kindness, Connections, and Excellence.

Our faculty has a lot of fun and engaging activities planned for our students to help them build confidence and foster strong relationships with their peers and the staff.

Cell Phones

Our new cell phone policy will be in effect starting the first day of school. This policy has not changed that much from what we had in place last year. To create the best educational environment for our students and staff, all cell phones/smartwatches must remain in student lockers and turned off throughout the school day. Students will not be able to send or receive messages during the school day. If your child needs to get in touch with you, they will have access to a phone in the middle school office.

If you need to get a message to your child you may do so by calling our office secretary, Amber Hasson, at (716) 664-6270.

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Communication

To create and maintain an effective partnership between families and the school, constant communication is a necessity. We will be communicating in several ways to our school community. At times, our middle school office will use our new Parent Square system (formerly Remind) and School Messenger, which can send mass emails, texts, and voicemails to entire groups in our district. Teachers and staff will also use Parent Square, the TEAMS App, emails, and phone calls to reach out. I strongly believe that consistent communication is one of the best ways to keep everyone working toward the goal of providing our students with a high-quality education. Please reach out to me by phone or email with any questions or concerns.

Schedule Changes

This year we have made some changes to our 7th and 8th grade schedules. Students in these grade levels will no longer be on the block schedule, where they have 80-minute core classes (science, English, math, and social studies) every other day. All classes in 6th, 7th and 8th grade for the 25-26 school year will be 40 minutes in length, and they will meet every day. In our previous scheduling model, we noticed students having difficulty staying focused for the full 80 minutes and when students were absent on certain days, they could go as many as five days without having one of their classes.

Going back to the traditional model of 40-minute classes every day will put students in a better situation to be successful. Also, in support of our mission statement of 'Learning for All,' we have added an academic lab period into the schedule so we can provide extra support and enrichment opportunities for all our students. Our 6th graders experienced success with the use of the academic lab the past few years and now all our grade levels will be able to utilize the extra time as well.

Staff Changes

- Carl Johnson will be our new 8th grade Special Education teacher, replacing Dan Vanderzyden who retired in June.
- Drew Keppel will be taking over in 7th grade Technology for the retiring Dan Thomas.
- Mikayla Dole joins us as a new special education teacher in 6th grade.
- Elizabeth Harrison will continue as a physical education teacher after starting with us at the end of May last school year.
- Angela Beachner is joining us from the

As we prepare to welcome students back for the 2025-2026 school year, as your new high school principal, I am filled with immense excitement and optimism about the opportunities ahead at Southwestern High School.

We begin this year with a renewed focus on **academic rigor and excellence**, building on a strong tradition of success. At SWHS, we are committed to offering challenging and meaningful coursework that prepares students to meet the demands of a rapidly changing world. We believe **ALL** students, regardless of background or experience, deserve access to high-quality learning experiences that stretch their thinking and build competence and confidence. Through collaboration meetings, shared data analysis and focused intervention strategies, our teachers are constantly refining their practice to meet the individual needs of **EVERY** student. This approach is not a program - it's a professional culture and one that is making a real difference.

Our efforts are guided by Southwestern Central School District's Blueprint for Excellence, which lays out a clear vision for student success across academics, social-emotional development, equity and leadership. This Blueprint for Excellence challenges each of us to set high expectations, maintain clear goals and foster a sense of belonging for all students. Within this framework, we are working to build a school environment where students feel supported and empowered to take ownership of their learning.

As we focus on preparing students for life beyond high school, we also recognize the challenges of living in an age of constant connectivity. In response to growing concerns from parents, educators and mental health professionals, **Governor Kathy Hochul announced a statewide initiative to limit**

student use of personal cell phones, bell-to-bell, in New York State K-12 public schools. Research shows that excessive screen time - especially during instructional hours - can negatively impact student attention, academic performance, social interactions and mental wellness.

In line with this new state guidance, the SWCS Board of Education adopted a **new cell phone policy**. While we recognize technology plays an important role in modern life, we also believe in the importance of intentional, undistracted learning. During school hours (bell-to-bell), students are expected to store their phones in their school-issued locker(s) and refrain from personal use unless authorized for academic purposes. We ask for your partnership and support as we implement these changes, which are intended to help students engage more fully with their learning and with one another.

This initiative aligns closely with a core value that we strive to model and teach daily: **the Golden Rule-treat others the way you want to be treated**. In every classroom, hallway and social interaction, we emphasize kindness, empathy and mutual respect. Whether it's in our academic policies, our behavioral expectations or our athletic programs, we believe treating others with dignity is essential to creating a safe and inclusive school culture.

We will also continue to prioritize strong communication and family engagement. Education is not a solo journey; it requires collective responsibility between school, home and the greater community. Your involvement is critical - whether through attending school events, staying in contact with teachers or simply encouraging your child to do their best - each of these engagements makes a tremendous difference.

The Parents As Teachers program offers individualized, interactive early learning experiences for the young siblings of school-aged children. It is a free program for all families residing in the Southwestern Central School District.

It serves families from pregnancy through Kindergarten. It is designed to inform, support



and encourage parents in their important role as their child's first and most influential teacher.

WHAT TO EXPECT: During monthly home visits, PAT liaisons offer child development resources, developmental screenings, and service referrals in addition to classroom visitation opportunities, support groups, and workshops. The program also creates social, group opportunities that connect parents and children with other young families.

FOCUS AREAS: Parent empowerment through parent-led child interaction, as well as developmental centered parenting and family well-being.

Community Eligibility Provision

Southwestern is pleased to announce we will continue to operate the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) for the 2025-2026 school year.

Schools that participate in the CEP can provide a healthy breakfast and lunch each day at no charge for all students enrolled in a CEP school.

What does this mean? Each student will be provided with a standard meal – breakfast and/or lunch – either the daily menu offering or the alternate meal is covered.

Additional meals or “a la carte” items such as additional milk, bottled water, chips, etc., will still be available for purchase. An additional breakfast can be purchased for \$1.65 (grades 6-12)/\$1.50 (Kindergarten-grade 5), and an additional lunch can be purchased for \$2.05 (grades 6-12)/\$1.90 (Kindergarten-grade 5).

As a result of participating in the Community Eligibil-

ity Provision, we are eliminating the collection of meal applications for free, reduced-price, and paid student meals. We are requesting that you complete the Household Income Form to determine eligibility for additional State and Federal program benefits that your child(ren) may qualify for.

Most importantly, such data is used for additional state and federal funding for rural, economically disadvantaged school districts such as Southwestern.

Please complete the form and return it to Ameer Kennedy in the district office. We would like the forms returned by September 19, 2025.

We feel that this program will be a benefit to the students and families in our district. Thank you for your assistance in ensuring that we can bring programs like CEP and others to our district. If you have any questions, please contact Ameer Kennedy at (716) 484-6800.

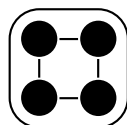
