

HS Art II (Photography)

Scope and Sequence 2026-2027

Course Description: This second-year art course focuses on techniques that will aid students in expressing their ideas. Students will work in color and black and white, with various camera types and formats, explore alternative photographic processes and digital media as well as working to further their own personal vision. Design principles, elements of art, history of art and art criticism learned in Photo I will be built upon in Photo II. Students will also build skills of critical thinking, problem solving, and aesthetics. Development of a portfolio is required.

- Prerequisite: Art I DP, Art I S, Art I P, or Art I DM
- Having a 35 mm film and/or Digital SLR camera of their own is beneficial to students taking this class.
- Additional supplies and/or supply fees may be required.
