Utilize UFLI routines to strengthen students' foundational phonics skills, sound-symbol correspondence, blending, and decoding abilities to improve overall reading proficiency.

Implement SIPPS intervention lessons to provide differentiated support for students performing below grade level and accelerate growth in foundational literacy skills.

Continue targeted support from the Reading Specialist to provide individualized intervention, monitor student progress, and adjust instruction based on student needs and performance data.

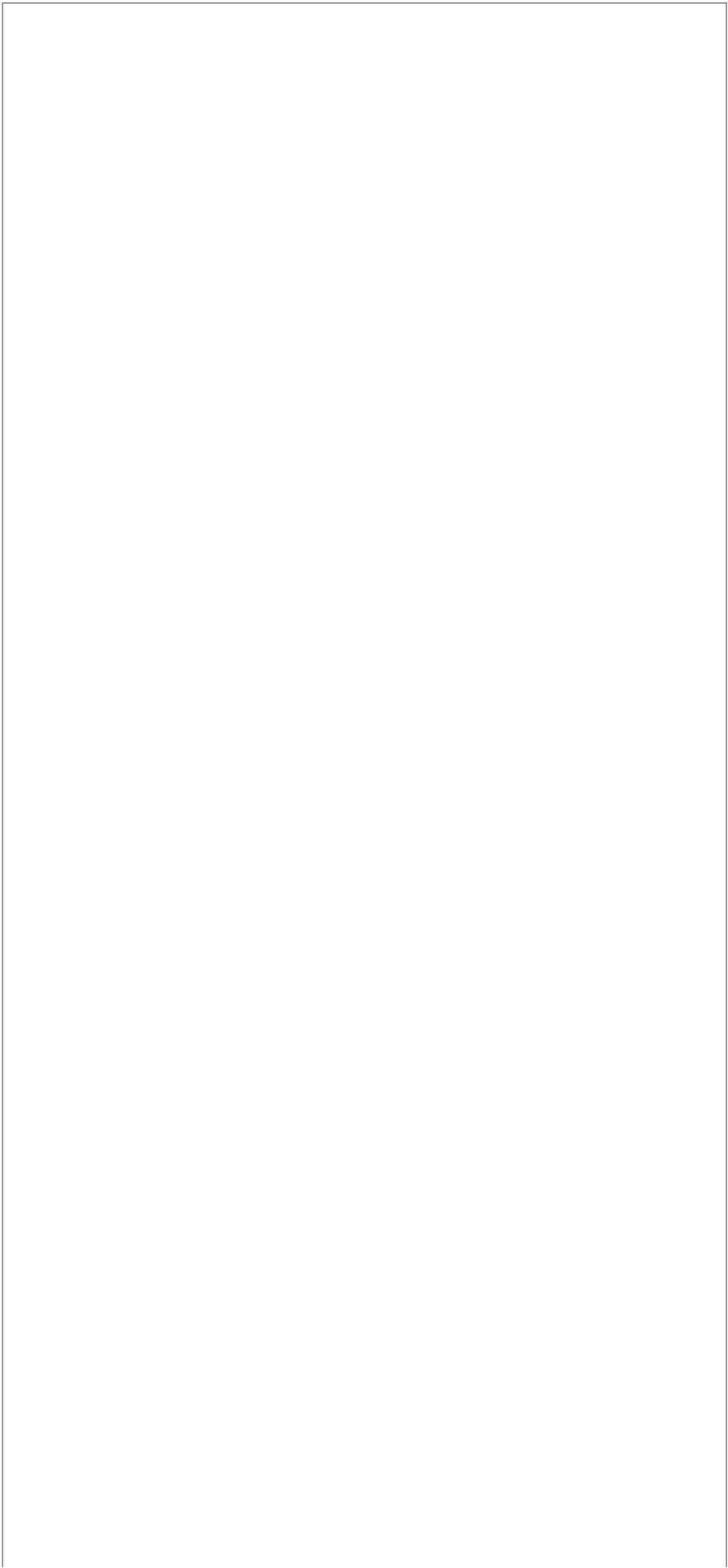
