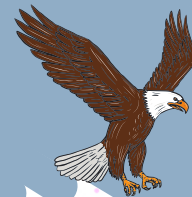

ECES School Improvement Goals for 26-27

Goal 1 - ELA

During the 2026-2027 school year, 60% of 3rd Grade students, 62% of 4th Grade students, and 62% of 5th Grade students at Elbert County Elementary School will meet their projected growth on the MAP Growth Assessment in ELA

Goal 2 - Math

During the 2026-2027 school year, 65% of 3rd Grade students, 78% of 4th Grade students, and 78% of 5th Grade students at Elbert County Elementary School will meet their projected growth on MAP in Math.

Goal 3 - Science

During the 2025-2026 school year, 50% of 5th-grade students at Elbert County Elementary School will achieve "Proficient Level" or "Distinguished Level" on the Georgia Milestones End of Grade Assessment in Science.

Goal 4 - Behavior

By analyzing yearly perception data from the Georgia School Climate Surveys, ECES will increase the climate star rating to 5 stars.
