Top 5 ways to support your child at home

1

CREATE A CALM DAILY RHYTHM

Predictable mornings and evenings help kids feel ready to learn. A simple routine (backpack ready, a quiet space for homework, a consistent bedtime) helps your child feel safe and organized.

2

MAKE ATTENDANCE PART OF YOUR FAMILY STORY

Showing up every day on time helps your child build strong habits, friendships, and confidence. Even one or two extra days of attendance each month can make a meaningful difference in learning.

3

ASK ABOUT A SMALL, POSITIVE MOMENT

Try one meaningful question on the drive home or during dinner: "What made you smile today?" These small conversations strengthen connection and build language and reflection skills.

4

READ TOGETHER... IN ANY WAY THAT WORKS FOR YOUR FAMILY

Reading at bedtime is a great start. Take turns reading signs and labels while shopping and recipes while cooking. Every bit strengthens vocabulary and builds reading confidence.

5

CELEBRATE EFFORT MORE THAN PERFECTION

Children take healthy risks when they know mistakes are part of learning. Notice the trying: "I saw how hard you worked on that!" Research shows this helps build resilience, persistence, and problem-solving skills.



Top 5 ways to support your child at school

1

ATTEND SCHOOL EVENTS WHEN YOU CAN

Family nights, performances, and celebrations help your child feel proud and connected to their school community.

2

STAY INFORMED THROUGH SCHOOL AND DISTRICT MESSAGES

Reading newsletters, checking the school texts, or following PUSD on social media keeps you in the loop and helps you support your child.

3

REACH OUT TO YOUR CHILD'S TEACHER

A quick message, a hello at pickup, or touching base during conferences strengthens communication and builds trust.

4

VOLUNTEER IN WAYS THAT FIT YOUR LIFE

Helping at one event, assisting from home, or supporting a class project, big or small, makes a meaningful difference.

5

JOIN A PARENT ORGANIZATION MEETING

Parent-teacher associations, English Learner Advisory Committees, School Site Councils, African American Parent Councils, the Community Advisory Committee, and other groups give families a voice in school.

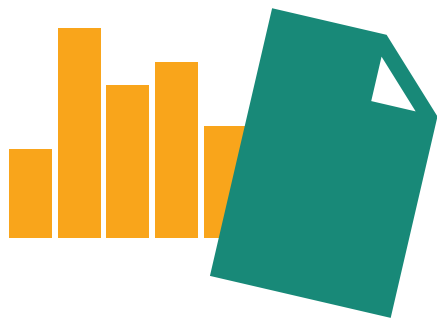

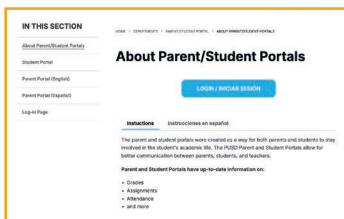

Visit pusd.us/parentportal and click LOGIN.

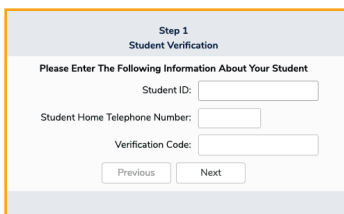

Create and confirm your parent account

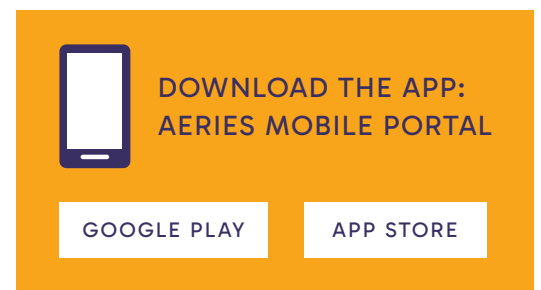
Create a new account (Parent Portal is separate from the Aeries account you created to enroll your student). Verify your email address.

Link the student information to your parent account

Enter the student's ID number, home phone number, and VPC code provided by the school.



How to read a REPORT CARD



There are 3* different types of grades on the PUSD report card:

Traditional Grading Scale

A traditional grading scale shows how well students in grades 3-12 perform on assignments and tests using letter grades from A to F.

A Advanced (90–100%)

B Proficient (80–89%)

C Basic (65–79%)

D Below Basic (50–64%)

F Far Below Basic (0–49%)

Progress Towards Standard Scale

Standards-based grades show how well your child understands grade-level skills and concepts at this point in time.

ES Exceeds Standard (85–100%)

MS Meets Standard (70–84%)

PS Progressing Towards Standard (50–69%)

BS Below Standard (0–49%)

NA Not Yet Assessed (0%)

Effort Grading Scale

Effort grades describe how consistently your child stays focused, completes work, and demonstrates productive learning habits.

O Outstanding (85–100%)

S Satisfactory (70–84%)

N Needs Improvement (50–69%)

U Unsatisfactory (0–49%)

* Students in grades TK-5 dual language immersion programs are also assessed on language proficiency. This grading scale ranges from novice to intermediate levels as defined by the American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages.

How to View and Print Report Cards in Parent Portal

1 SIGN IN TO YOUR PARENT PORTAL

1. Navigate to the Parent Portal at pusd.us/parentportal
2. Enter your email and password to log in.

2 SELECT THE STUDENT

If you have multiple students linked to your parent portal, choose the student whose report card you'd like to view.

3 GO TO GRADES

1. Click on Grades.
2. Click on Report Card History.

4 VIEW & PRINT REPORT CARD

1. Click on the report card you would like to view.
2. A PDF will pop up on separate window which can be printed if needed.

PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES

**Conferences are about partnership.
The goal is to celebrate strengths,
identify growth areas, and create a
plan for success.**



1 Before the conference

- **TALK TO YOUR CHILD:**
Ask them how school is going, what they are learning, and what they enjoy or find difficult.
- **PREPARE QUESTIONS:**
Consider asking about grades, study habits, social-emotional growth, and how you can support them at home.

2 During the conference

- **COLLABORATE ON NEXT STEPS:**
Discuss if there are ways to help at home including assistance with learning, organization, or behavior.
- **SHARE YOUR CHILD'S STRENGTHS, INTERESTS, AND GOALS:** This helps the teacher to learn even more about your child to enhance connection and tailor instruction.

3 After the conference

- **UPDATE YOUR CHILD:**
Talk to your child about what was discussed, what went well, and what steps you will take together.
- **STAY CONNECTED:**
This short meeting is just one of many opportunities to partner for student success.

**How are the PUSD

Parent-teacher conferences happen in October. Your teacher will reach out to you directly to secure a time. Sign-ups typically happen during Back to School Night and/or via email.

Before and After School Care

We offer a variety of options for before and after-school care. Kids are supervised by well-trained and compassionate staff.



LEARNs PUSD Expanded Learning Programs

All PUSD students in grades TK-8 (ages 4 and older) are eligible to apply for PasadenaLEARNs before and after-school programs. Before-school programs are offered at five elementary school sites and begin 1.5 hours prior to the start of the school day. After-school programs are available at every PUSD elementary and middle school and operate until 6:00 p.m. Registration is available in May at pusd.us/learns. Sign up ASAP as spaces are limited! 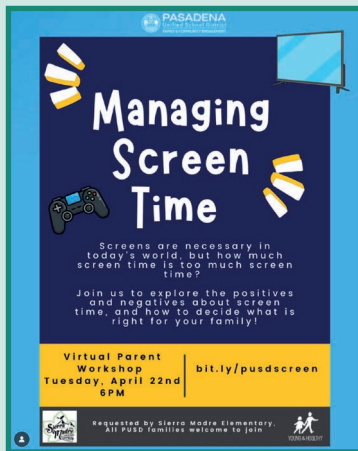

Hot Lunch

All PUSD students are eligible to receive free breakfast and lunch through the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) program, with no applications required. Meals meet USDA guidelines, and all students are encouraged to participate in the school meal program.



PUSD Meal Programs

- **SCHOOL BREAKFAST PROGRAM:** This program provides nutritionally balanced and affordable breakfasts to students each day. Pasadena USD offers breakfast at all school sites.
- **NATIONAL SCHOOL LUNCH PROGRAM:** Nutritionally balanced, affordable lunches are prepared and served to students each school day by our staff. School lunch menus must meet meal requirements specific to the age/grade group of students served.
- **AFTER-SCHOOL SUPPER PROGRAM:** Supper meals are available to students who participate in a regularly scheduled and planned after school educational or enrichment activities.
