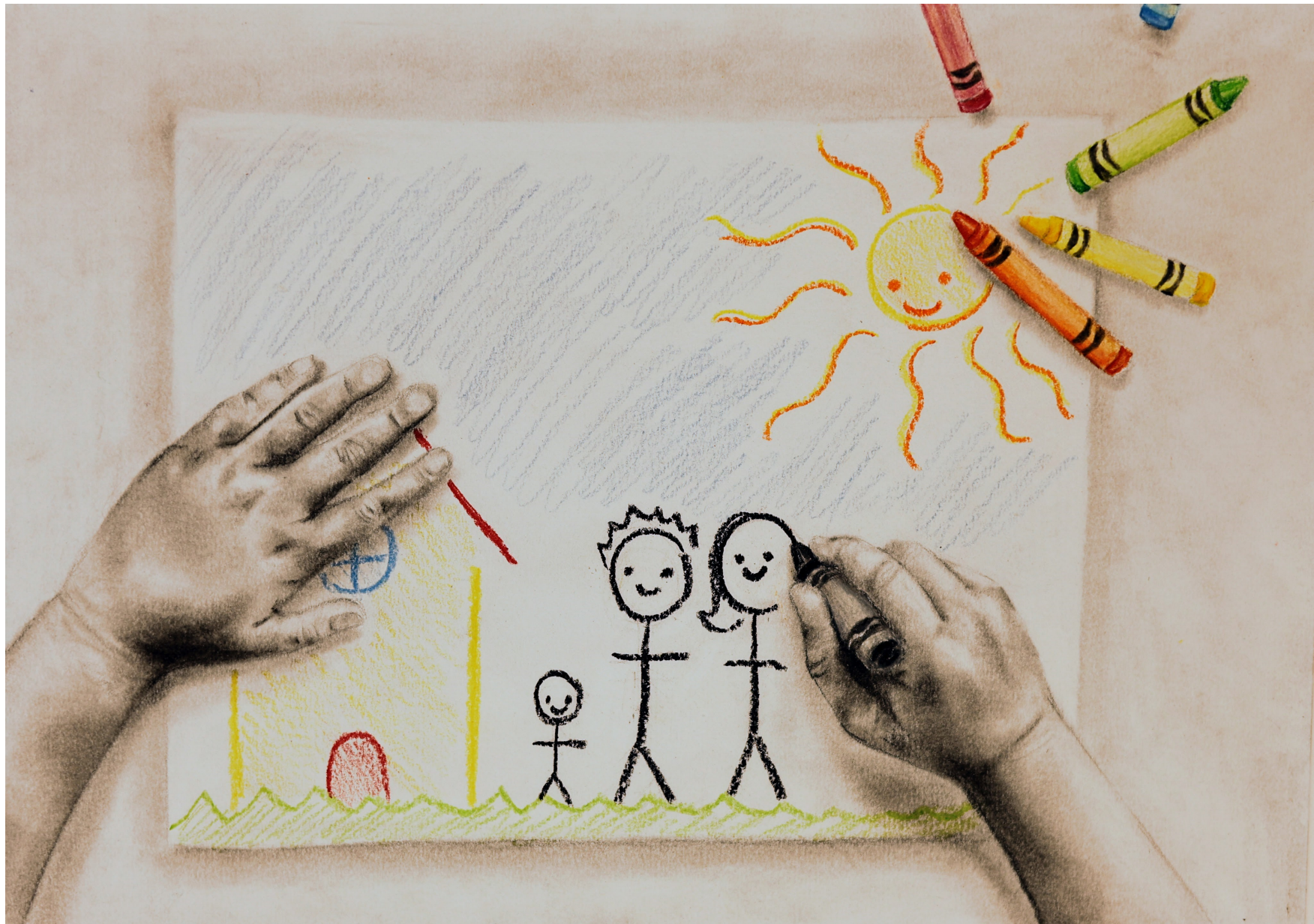

Ensure engagement of students, families and the community in ways that contribute to the overall growth and success of all stakeholders.

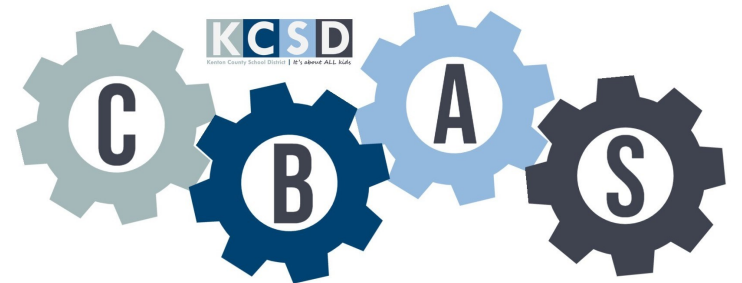

SAFETY AND WELL-BEING

- CPR/AED simulation drills are required twice per year in all KCSD schools

STUDENT LEARNING AND PROGRESS

KCSD's focus on literacy

The KCSD recognizes that the ability to read proficiently is a critical skill, serving as a foundational component for ALL students' future learning. We are committed to all students learning to proficiently read appropriate grade level texts before exiting third grade, reaching grade level benchmarks, and as a result, attaining transition readiness markers established by the district at grades 5, 8, and 12. Research supports that individuals who read proficiently are more likely to achieve higher levels of education, to earn higher incomes, and to have better health outcomes. Furthermore, reading proficiency is a key predictor of critical thinking, problem-solving, and decision making skills, which are essential for success in a rapidly changing global economy. 162 of our teachers have participated in Cohort 1, 2, or 3 of the statewide LETRS professional learning, with more expected to participate in Cohort 4.

TRANSITION READINESS

College and Career Readiness Opportunities for Students

Dual Credit

Each high school in the Kenton County School District is excited to offer a wide range of dual credit options for their students. Through these courses students are able to gain college credit while earning credit towards their High School diploma.

Young Scholars Academy (YSA) at NKU

The Young Scholars Academy is a highly selective partnership between the Kenton County School District and Northern Kentucky University. A limited number of students are selected to take a full-time college course load on NKU's campus for their final two years of high school at an extremely discounted rate! Students have the opportunity to earn 60 hours of college credit and/or an associate's degree with a focus in STEM, integrated studies, supply chain, and computer science. For more information, contact your school counselor.

Advanced Placement

High School students taking Advanced Placement (AP) Courses while in high school allows them to gain an advantage when entering college by earning college credit based on AP Exam scores in pre-requisite areas and explore potential college majors. This coursework is designed for students to perform at a high level immediately and pursue higher level coursework at colleges and universities.

Ignite Institute

Through project-based learning, Ignite scholars will have authentic, real-world experiences that will prepare them for the jobs of the future. Scholars will have access to multiple dual credit courses through partnerships with local universities that will allow them to graduate from Ignite with an Associate's Degree. The "Colleges" at the Ignite Institute are intended to allow scholars to explore careers in the areas of Allied Health, Biomedical Sciences, Computer Science, Design, Education, and Engineering. KCSD Career Technical Partnership Programs

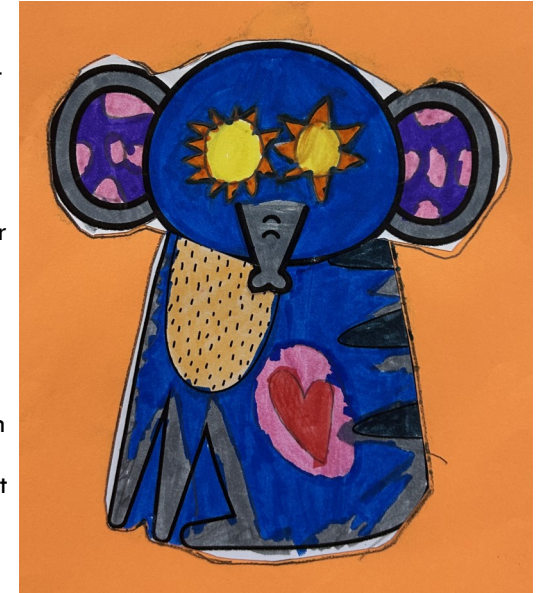
KCSD has partnered with several post-secondary institutions to provide instruction in certain vocation fields. Each area is a two year, half day program which is open to juniors and seniors. Students are able to earn college credits and earn industry certifications. Students that are interested in taking classes in a CTE area not listed (welding, Diesel Mechanic, Nursing, IT, etc) should see their high school counselor to learn about additional opportunities.

Career and Industry Certifications

Students at all KCSD High Schools are able to gain industry certifications at the conclusion of various courses of study. Industry Certifications are a valuable tool for students to enter the workforce with work ready knowledge, skills, and dispositions. By obtaining an industry certification, students have a great start on their career goals and increase their marketability to potential employers.

KCSD Worked-Based Learning Experiences

Upon completion of career pathway course work or through identification within their individual learning plan, students are encouraged to participate in work-based learning experiences that will enable students to gain valuable career experience. Kenton County School District offers experiences in Information Technology, Nursing, English Language Mentors and Future Educators.

STUDENT SERVICES

Family Resource/Youth Service Centers

Family Resource centers serve children through twelve years of age. Areas which must be addressed are: pre-school child care for children two and three years of age; after school child day care; families in training; parent and child education; support and training for child care providers; and health services or referrals to health services.

Youth Service Centers serve children over twelve years of age. Areas which must be addressed include: referrals to health and social services; employment counseling, training, and placement; summer and part time job development; drug and alcohol abuse counseling; and family crisis and mental health counseling.

The centers provide a variety of services and access to resources for families, students and the school community.

Governor's Programs (GSP/GSA/GSE)

The following programs provide academic and personal growth while students participate in co-curricular activities and live in a residential setting on a college campus. Students must apply and compete with other students from across the state. Those selected attend the program free of charge. Being selected into one of these distinguished programs will qualify you for several college scholarships. Please reach out to your school counselor to find out more information.

Governor's Scholars Program (GSP) - open to students in grade 11

Governor's School for the Arts (GSA) - open to students in grade 10-11

Governor's School for Entrepreneurs (GSE) - open to students in grades 9-11

School Counseling/Psychological Services

Each Kenton County school has full time professional school counseling services. Professional school counselors provide individual student and small group counseling, parent support counseling and referrals to community agencies, ongoing teacher and student case consultation. Also, each professional school counselor has a central role in the school's Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS) team. Any time a parent has a concern related to the educational, social, emotional or behavioral well-being of their child, please immediately contact the professional school counselor.

Nine school psychologists provide consultation and support to teachers, parents, and administrators regarding educational or social/developmental/behavioral issues. A primary service provided is a psychological evaluation for students referred by the school due to experiencing educational problems. Results are interpreted to parents and school. Additionally, school and clinical psychologists participate on problem solving teams in each school's Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS) team.

EARLY CHILDHOOD

Preschool

The Kenton County School District is proud to offer a full-day preschool program. The students' family must reside in the Kenton County School District in order to attend the preschool program. The Kenton County Preschool Program is an enriching program serving children who meet eligibility criteria as defined by the Kentucky Department of Education. The program is available at no cost to the family. The preschool program is available to:

- Children who have turned four years old by August 1st of the current school year and are Income Eligible, 160% poverty level.
- Three and four-year-old children with an educational disability due to delays in their development, regardless of income.

Kindergarten Registration

The Kenton County School District will hold kindergarten registration in March. In order to enter The Kenton County School District Kindergarten Program, Kentucky law requires that your child be 5 years of age on or before August 1.

Registration Documents:

- Enrollment Sheet returned to the school office.
- Original legal certificate of birth or other reliable proof of birth required by State Law 158.032.
- Driver's license (State/Federal identification card)
- Proof of residency; such as current utility bill.
- Official custody documentation (if applicable)
- The district requests a Social Security number for each student as it is used for KEES Scholarship purposes

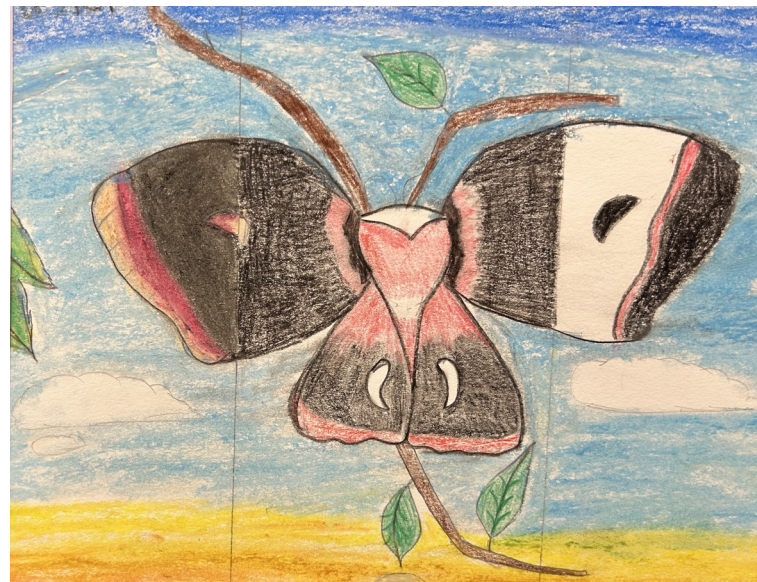

...Add money to my child's account?

- Deposit money into an online student food money account for **optional** a la carte (extra) food items and/or second meal purchases at www.myschoolbucks.com. Please note that each time a transaction takes place, My School Bucks charges a processing fee of \$3.50 for credit card transactions and \$2.75 for e-checks. To avoid processing fees, checks or cash may be sent to school with your student; this is given to cafeteria cashiers for deposit into the student's account. Students can also bring cash on a day-to-day basis for a single purchase. The maximum deposit is \$150 per transaction.

...Fill out a free and reduced form?

- Due to the implementation of the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) program districtwide, families no longer need to fill out Free and Reduced forms. However, all families need to fill out the Household Income Form. These forms will be available on our website and at your child's school.

Inclement Weather

Our District utilizes the Bright Arrow system to communicate with stakeholders regarding inclement weather. **To add or remove a number from our communication list, please visit www.kenton.kyschools.us/departments/behavior-supportstudent-engagement/automated-calling-system.** Those signed up with Bright Arrow will receive a text, phone call and an e-mail regarding inclement weather. Closures will also be communicated on local media, our website, and our X account (@TheKCSD).

Please know that the safety of our students, staff, and families is always our number one priority in everything we do, including when making decisions about school closure or delays due to inclement weather and emergency situations such as utility outages. These decisions are made with great care while always erring on the side of caution. We understand these decisions can be disruptive as families have to adjust schedules, students miss out on important learning time, and our staff must adapt quickly. However, these are not decisions we take lightly when considering there are approximately 10,000 students out of a total student population of nearly 14,000 who ride one of our 86 daily bus routes, there are hundreds of student drivers who drive to our various campuses, and there are nearly 2,000 employees who drive to one of our 17 school campuses or other District facilities each and every day.

The KCSD may utilize non-traditional instruction (NTI) days when schools are closed to due inclement weather or other unforeseen circumstances.

HEALTH SERVICES

The KCSD follows the Kentucky Department of Education, Northern Kentucky Health Department, Kentucky Department of Public Health, and Kentucky Board of Nursing guidelines on immunization requirements, infectious disease, medication administration, and preventative health services.

Each school in the KCSD has a Health Office staffed with a licensed or trained professional. When the health professionals are at lunch or out for the day, each school has additional delegated trained nonmedical school personnel responsible for administration of medications, first aid, procedures, and emergency management. The Health Office has basic assessment tools and has basic non-medicated topical products. Health Offices stock no over the counter (OTC) products. All medications, including OTC products, need to be supplied by the parent/guardian and require an Administration of Medication form to be completed and signed by a parent/guardian and physician.

Physical Exam	Preschool upon enrollment Others within 30 days of enrollment	Required for 1st entry to a Kentucky public school and for all children enrolling in 6th grade. May be completed up to one year prior to initial entry.
Vision Exam	January 1st of first year of enrollment for a 3, 4, 5, or 6 year old child.	Must be performed by an optometrist or ophthalmologist
Dental Exam	January 1st of enrollment year in kindergarten for a 5 or 6 year old child.	May be completed by a dentist, dental hygienist, physician, registered nurse, nurse practitioner, or physician assistant. Must be between Jan. 1 & Dec. 31 of the year the child enrolls in kindergarten
