

2026-2027 Wyoming Central School Chromebook Handbook



The policies, procedures, and information within this document apply to all Chromebooks used at Wyoming Central School by students, staff, or guests including any other device considered by the Administration to fall under this handbook.

Introduction:

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The Wyoming Central School District has established our 1:1 Chromebook initiative to supplement the curriculum and to prepare our students for their own use of technology in the future. Technology will, undoubtedly, be a part of our students' lives – whether in academic pursuits after high school, while attending college, in the workplace or both! The Chromebook initiative will enable and support students and teachers to integrate technology while enhancing students' engagement with content and promoting the development of self-directed, responsible lifelong learners.

The policies, procedures and information within this document apply to all Chromebooks used at the District, including any other device considered by the Administration to be associated with these procedures. Teachers may set additional requirements for Chromebook use in their individual classrooms.

District technology has become increasingly more important as we have learned to implement remote instruction and blended learning. It is imperative that the technology be utilized solely as a tool for teaching and learning. The privilege of using the technology resources provided by the District is not transferable to students, people or groups outside the District and terminates when a student is no longer enrolled in the District.

Learning Model

In-person:

- Pre-K-8 can transport devices/chargers back and forth to school as necessary.
- Students are responsible for ensuring the safety of devices and are charged for the day.
- On site and off site filtering is handled by GoGuardian and iBoss.

Chromebook Basics

Each Chromebook is assigned to an individual for inventory purposes. Periodically throughout the school year, devices are spot checked for quality assurance purposes.

Receiving Your Chromebook:

Chromebooks and AC adaptors are provided at the beginning of each school year.

Parents & Students must sign and return the Chromebook Handbook Sign-off and Student Pledge document before the Chromebook can be issued to their child.

Training:

Students will periodically participate in cyber-security training throughout the school year. They will also be instructed on the proper handling of their Chromebook. Teachers will support students as specific software is integrated into lessons for the purpose of

enhancing learning opportunities.

Storing Chromebooks:

- **Elementary School Students:** Chromebooks are typically stored and charged in student classrooms, however, devices may be taken home when directed to by a teacher. Chromebooks should be stored safely at home, avoiding extreme temperatures. (hot or cold)
- **Middle School Students:** It is the responsibility of the students to transmit chromebooks between home and school. Students must charge their assigned device at home and transmit the chromebook to school each day.

Returning Chromebooks:

Chromebooks will be left in Elementary School classrooms at the end of the school year. Classroom teachers and members of the IT Department will check both devices and chargers for damage. If a student transfers out of the District during the school year, the Chromebook must be returned at the time of transfer.

If your Chromebook, any accessories, and/or AC power adapter has been damaged or defaced, you may be fined respectively for the damage at the end of the year during student Chromebook check-in or when transferring to another district.

If a student Chromebook is not returned during year-end check-in or upon transferring out of the district, administration will be in charge of recovering the District's property.

Taking Care of Your Chromebook:

Students are responsible for the general care of the Chromebook which they have been issued by the school. Chromebooks that are broken or fail to work properly must be taken to the classroom teacher immediately. If a loaner Chromebook is needed, one will be issued to the classroom of origin until the original Chromebook can be repaired or replaced.

General Precautions:

Prior to receiving their Chromebook for the new school year, students are required to read and attest that they will meet the terms and conditions outlined on the Student Pledge/Sign-Off page.

Cleaning/Disinfecting your Chromebook:

To quickly disinfect your device, it is safe to use a clorox wipe lightly across the keyboard. Please avoid using this wipe on the screen. Do not use window cleaner or any type of liquid or water on your Chromebook.

Using Your Chromebook:

At School:

It is the expectation that students will be prepared with all supplies and materials (including Chromebooks) daily. The Chromebooks, like textbooks, are instructional

tools intended for use at school each and every day. Students are provided with school gmail accounts which they may check regularly.

At Home:

In the event that a student is required to take a Chromebook home for instructional purposes, the *Chromebooks must be returned to school the next day fully charged and undamaged*. If students leave their Chromebook or other school materials at home, a loaner device will be available.

Sound:

Sound must be muted at all times unless permission is obtained from the teacher for instructional purposes or headphones are in use.

Managing Your Files and Saving Your Work:

Students should save documents to their school provided Google Drive. Saving to Google Drive will make the file accessible from any computer with internet access. Students using Google Drive to work on their documents will not need to save their work, as Drive will save each keystroke as the work is being completed. Students will be trained on proper file management procedures within Google Drive.

Personalizing the Chromebook:

Chromebooks must remain free of any decorative writing, drawing, stickers, paint, tape, or labels that are not the property of Wyoming Central School.

Software on Chromebooks:

Originally Installed Software:

Chromebook software is delivered via the Chrome Web Store. These are web-based applications that do not require installation space on a hard drive. The software originally installed on the Chromebook must remain on the Chromebook in usable condition and easily accessible at all times.

All Chromebooks are supplied with the latest Google Chrome Operating System (OS), and many other applications useful in an educational environment. The Chrome OS will automatically install updates when the computer is shut down and restarted.

Virus Protection:

Virus protection is unnecessary on the Chromebook due to the unique nature of its design. Chromebooks are always running the latest and most secure version.

Additional Software:

Students are unable to install additional software on their Chromebook other than what has been approved by Wyoming Central School.

Procedure for Restoring the Chrome OS:

If technical difficulties are experienced with a device, students should shut the device completely down, followed by a restart. If technical difficulties persist, students should contact the IT Department. The IT Department will assess the device, following the “5 minute rule” If the problem cannot be fixed in 5 minutes, the Chromebook will be restored to factory defaults. Restoring the Chrome OS will restore the device to the state in which the user originally received it. All student created files stored on an external miniSD card, USB flash drive, or Google Drive will be intact after the operating system is restored. All files saved on the Chromebook that have been synced to Google Drive will be intact. However, all other data (music, photos, documents) stored on internal memory that has NOT been synced will not be restored unless the student requests that an attempt be made to salvage it.

Search and Inspection of Chromebook:

Anything that is found in the course of a search that may be evidence of a violation of school rules or the law may be taken and held or turned over to the police. The school reserves the right not to return items, which have been confiscated. The Board has charged school authorities with the responsibility of safeguarding the safety and well-being of the students in their care. In the discharge of that responsibility, school authorities may search school property to include Chromebooks used by students or the person or property, including vehicles, of a student, in accordance with this handbook.

Protecting & Storing Your Chromebook:

Chromebook Identification: Chromebooks will be labeled in the manner specified by the school.

Chromebooks can be identified in the following ways:

- *Record of serial number and Wyoming Central School asset tag. Under no circumstances are students to modify, remove, or destroy identification labels.*

Chromebooks Left in Unsupervised / Unsecured Areas:

Students are responsible for the care of the Chromebook and all their school issued materials. Under no circumstance should a Chromebook be stored in unsupervised areas. Unsupervised areas include the school grounds, the cafeteria, unlocked classrooms, library, locker rooms, hallways, bathrooms, or any other entity that is not securely locked or in which there is no supervision.

Repairing or Replacing Your Chromebook:

Chromebooks Undergoing Repair:

- Repaired Chromebooks will end up with the original factory image as first received. It is important that students keep their school data synced to Google Drive so documents and class projects will not be lost.

- Students and parents will be charged for intentional Chromebook damage that is a result of misuse or abusive handling.

Warranty:

New Chromebooks have a limited warranty covering normal use, mechanical breakdown, or faulty construction and will provide replacement parts necessary to repair or if necessary, replace the Chromebook. **The warranty DOES NOT warrant against damage caused by misuse, abuse, or accidents.** Please report all Chromebook problems to your classroom teacher.

If a Chromebook becomes defective (at no fault of the student) after the warranty expires, Wyoming Central School will replace the Chromebook at no charge with a refurbished/new Chromebook of the same age or newer.

Lost or Intentionally Damaged Device and Accessories:

A Chromebook or any of its accessories that are lost (whereabouts unknown) or intentionally damaged is the responsibility of the student and parent involved in the loss of property. The user will not be given another device or accessory for at home use until the replacement cost of the lost/damaged device or accessory is paid to the school. Students will be loaned a Chromebook during regular school hours however, additional restrictions will be provided to prevent further damage to another device.

Replacement Cost:

Internet Use & Filtering of Your Chromebook:

A Wi-Fi Internet connection will be required to use your Chromebook.

While in district Chromebooks will use the School's Wi-Fi to access the internet which is filtered by iBoss and GoGuardian. Students are bound by the Acceptable Use Policy, Administrative Procedures, and all other guidelines in this document wherever they use their Chromebooks.

Chromebook Technical Support:

Wyoming Central School Technology Department will assist you with the following areas:

- Password Identification
- User account support
- Coordination of warranty repair
- Distribution of loaner Chromebooks
- Hardware maintenance and repair
- Operating System or software configuration support
- Restoring Chromebook to factory default
- System software updates

Artificial Intelligence (AI) Use

Artificial Intelligence (AI) tools are becoming increasingly common in education and may be used to assist with learning. Examples of AI tools may include, but are not limited to, MagicSchool.ai, ChatGPT, Google Gemini, and Microsoft Copilot.

Students may use AI tools **only when permitted by their teacher or for approved instructional purposes**, and in ways that support their own learning.

Acceptable Use

AI tools may be used for educational purposes such as:

- Brainstorming ideas for assignments
- Getting explanations of concepts
- Reviewing grammar or writing suggestions
- Assisting with studying or practice questions

Students should always **review and verify AI-generated information**, as AI responses may be incorrect or incomplete.

Teachers may require students to **disclose or cite** the use of AI tools when they are used to assist with an assignment.

Unacceptable Use

Students may **not** use AI tools to:

- Complete assignments or assessments that are intended to reflect their own work

- Generate essays, projects, or answers that are submitted as their own without teacher permission
- Circumvent learning expectations or academic integrity policies
- Access, generate, or share inappropriate or harmful content

Using AI in a way that violates teacher instructions or academic integrity expectations may be considered **cheating or plagiarism** and may result in disciplinary action in accordance with school policy.

Students should not upload assignments, documents, or materials containing confidential school information into public AI tools unless directed by a teacher.

Privacy and Safety

Students should **not enter personal, confidential, or school-sensitive information** into AI tools. This includes:

- Full names
- Addresses
- Phone numbers
- Student ID numbers
- Passwords or account information

Teacher Guidance

Teachers may set specific rules regarding AI use in their classrooms. Students are responsible for following **all teacher directions** regarding when and how AI tools may be used.

Chromebook Handbook - Student Responsibilities

- I understand the Chromebook assigned to me is the property of Wyoming Central School.
- I will ensure that my WCS Chromebook is charged and ready for daily use in my classes.
- I will take good care of the WCS Chromebook that is assigned to me.
- I will never leave a WCS Chromebook unattended in an unsecured or unsupervised location.
- I will never loan out a WCS Chromebook to other individuals.
- I will know where my WCS Chromebook is at all times.
- I will keep food and beverages away from my WCS Chromebook.
- I will keep my WCS Chromebook intact; including keyboard keys and screens.
- I will protect my WCS Chromebook by always carrying it in a secure manner to avoid damage.
- I will use a WCS Chromebook in ways that are appropriate for education.
- I will shut down my WCS Chromebook when not in use to conserve battery life.
- I will keep my WCS Chromebook free from personalized decorations such as: stickers, markers, writing, etc.
- I will not expose my WCS Chromebook to extreme temperatures for extended periods of time.
- I understand that the WCS Chromebook I am issued is subject to inspection at any time without notice.
- I will notify District authorities in the event of theft or damage.
- I will seek help from the IT Department for necessary repairs.
- I will be responsible for all damage or loss caused by neglect or abuse.
- I agree to pay the replacement cost of my Chromebook, power cord/charger, or screen in the event that any of these items are lost or intentionally damaged.
- I will follow the policies outlined in the Chromebook Handbook and the District Acceptable Use Policy, at all times, when using a WCS Chromebook.

I understand:

_____ If the property is stolen; my child must report the theft directly to school administration immediately.

_____ In the event of intentional damage, my child will be loaned a Chromebook to be used only during the school day until replacement costs are received.

_____ My child will comply at all times with the Wyoming Central School's Chromebook Handbook and its guidelines as well as the Wyoming Central School District's Technology Acceptable Use Policy. Any failure to comply may terminate my child's rights of possession effective immediately and the school may repossess the property. Legal title to the Chromebook is Wyoming Central School. My child's right of possession and use, is dependent upon full and complete compliance with the Chromebook Handbook.

_____ My child's right of use and possession regarding the property terminates no later than the last day of classes during the school year unless earlier terminated by the School District or upon my child's withdrawal from Wyoming Central School.
