



2026 - 2027 GPA EXEMPT COURSE INFORMATION

INFORMATION REGARDING EXEMPT COURSES

Students are encouraged to pursue their areas of special talents and interest to enrich their academic experience. Elective courses may be taken on a GPA-exempt basis as established by Board Local Policy EIC and identified in this brochure. A maximum of three (3) GPA Exempt credits may be earned. Students will only be enrolled in GPA exempt courses if the following eligibility criteria is met:

- Students must be in grades 10, 11, or 12.
- Students must have a 4.0 or higher GPA.
- Successful completion of course prerequisites must be completed.
- Students must have passed the prerequisite course for elective courses for which they are seeking a waiver.
- Students must maintain a passing average in the GPA exempt course to qualify and maintain GPA exempt eligibility.
- Students must submit an application in MyKatyCloud and obtain approval from their school counselor.
- Students understand they must be in their 2nd, 3rd, or 4th full year of continuous enrollment in the same program to meet eligibility for GPA-exempt status.
- Students may take a maximum of three (3) credits on a GPA Exempt basis during their high school career.

- Students are eligible to GPA-exempt Band 2 or Dance Color Guard 2 if a full credit (1.0) of Fine Arts credit has been earned.
- If a student chooses to combine Band 1&2 or Dance Color Guard 1&2 to earn a full credit (1.0) of Fine Arts and a full PE substitution credit (1.0), they are eligible to GPA-exempt Band 3&4 or Dance Color Guard 3&4.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO TAKE A GPA EXEMPT COURSE?

- Students must be in 10th, 11th, or 12th grade.
- Students must maintain a 4.0 or above grade point average (GPA).
- Successful completion of prerequisite courses specific to a pathway or a program of study must be completed.
- Students must have passed the prerequisite course for elective courses for which they are seeking a waiver.
- Students must maintain a passing average in the GPA exempt course to qualify and maintain GPA exempt eligibility.
- Students must submit an application in MyKatyCloud and obtain approval from their school counselor.
- Students understand they must be in their 2nd, 3rd, or 4th full year of continuous enrollment in the same program to meet eligibility for GPA-exempt status. Completion of prerequisites and/or corequisites required.
- Students may take a maximum of three (3) credits on a GPA Exempt basis during their high school career.
- For more information, see your counselor, teachers, director, or coach.

HOW ARE GRADES HANDLED IN A GPA EXEMPT COURSE?

Students who are eligible and choose to take one of these courses for a GPA EXEMPT grade:

- Will receive a numerical grade all year on the report card.
- Will receive the actual numeric grade with a comment or label indicating “GPA exempt” on the Academic Achievement Record (transcript).
- Will receive credit for these courses, but also have these courses excluded from the computation of GPA and class rank.
- Exemptions are granted on a semester basis.

WHAT ARE THE PERFORMANCE STANDARDS FOR THESE COURSES?

- The numerical grade earned will be reported on the report card.
- Students are expected to complete all assigned work in a GPA-exempt course including tests and semester exams.
- Students eligible to exempt semester exams may choose to exempt a GPA-exempt course.

HOW WILL GRADES IN A GPA EXEMPT COURSE AFFECT ELIGIBILITY FOR EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES?

The numerical grades earned in a GPA Exempt course will be used to determine eligibility for participation in all UIL or school-sponsored activities. In addition, numerical grades will also be used to determine honor roll each six-weeks; for qualifying criteria used in selection of students for various positions such as dance team officers, class officers, exam exemptions, etc.; for eligibility for academic awards, including admission to organizations such as National Honor Society; etc.

IF A STUDENT COMPLETES A LEVEL ONE COURSE DURING ONE SCHOOL YEAR BUT DOES NOT ENROLL IN THE LEVEL TWO COURSE DURING THE NEXT SCHOOL YEAR, THEN ENROLLS IN A LEVEL TWO COURSE DURING THE FOLLOWING YEAR, ARE THEY ELIGIBLE TO EXEMPT THE LEVEL TWO COURSE?

Yes. Each year's exemption stands alone. This qualifies as continuous enrollment in a coherent sequence.

IF A STUDENT EXEMPTS A COURSE DURING ONE SCHOOL YEAR BUT DOES NOT ENROLL IN THE COURSE DURING THE FOLLOWING YEAR, DO THEY LOSE THE EXEMPT STATUS FOR THE FIRST YEAR?

No. Each year's exemption stands alone.

CAN A STUDENT DROP A FULL YEAR GPA EXEMPTION COURSE AFTER THE FIRST SEMESTER IS COMPLETED?

If a student completes the course with a B average or better for which a GPA waiver is granted, the course will be GPA exempt. Students are expected to complete a full-year course for which a GPA exemption has been approved. In extenuating circumstances where a student is approved to drop a GPA-exempt course after the first semester is complete, the student will receive the first semester credit as GPA exempt. However, the remaining 0.5 GPA exemption cannot be applied to another course during the second semester or following year. The requested 1.0 GPA exemption is considered to be fully expended. If a student drops a full-year course before the close of the first semester for which a GPA exemption has been approved per established district guidelines. The new course the student enters is not eligible for a GPA exemption. In this case, the GPA exemption is available for use the following semester/year, if requested and approved according to established guidelines.

DOES A STUDENT HAVE TO MAINTAIN ENROLLMENT IN A SINGLE ATHLETIC SPORT TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR AN EXEMPTION?

No. Any athletic enrollment can qualify.

HOW DO STUDENTS ENROLL IN A GPA EXEMPT COURSE?

Students interested in taking one of the GPA Exempt courses must discuss this option with their school counselor at the beginning of the course. If the student meets all the criteria, they must:

1. Complete the online GPA Exempt application located in MyKatv Cloud.



2. Applications must be submitted during the appropriate window; exceptions will not be made. Once the window closes, if all criteria are met, the request will be approved, and a schedule change will be made to reflect enrollment in a GPA Exempt course.
 - a. Students requesting GPA Exempt status in a year-long course must submit their application at the beginning of the year; move-in students who miss the fall deadline may apply in the spring.
 - b. Students requesting GPA Exempt status in semester-long course must submit their application during the window in the semester the course is being taken.

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3. Once a student's request to take a course as GPA-exempt has been approved, the decision is final and cannot be changed.
