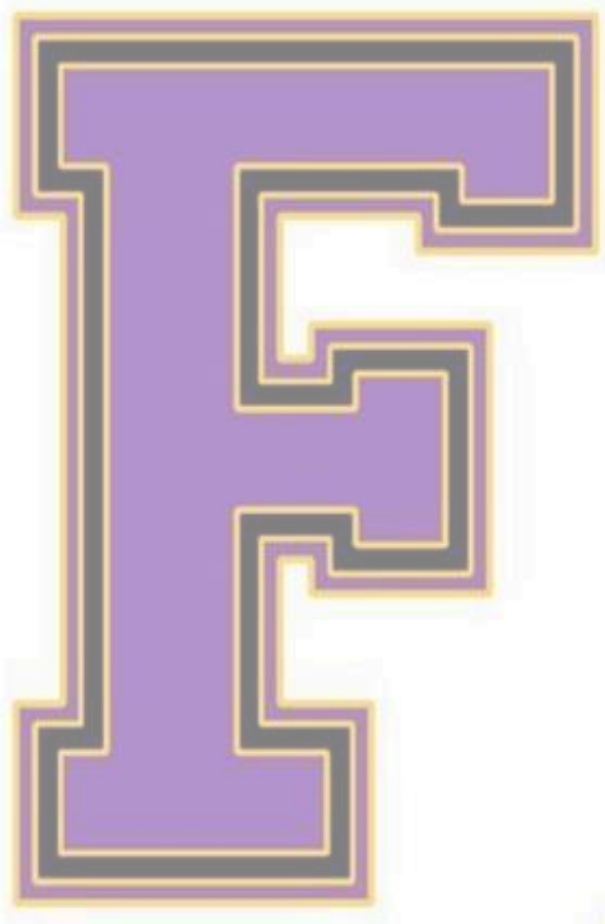

At Fresno High, we believe education should prepare students for a complex world—to think critically, act ethically, and lead with confidence. That’s why we offer the International Baccalaureate (IB)—a globally recognized program that helps students become curious, capable, and compassionate learners. Our Middle Years Programme (MYP) (grades 9–10) builds skills through a global lens, while the Diploma (DP) and Career-related Programme (CP) (grades 11–12) allow students to pursue academic depth or career readiness, gain real-world experience, and earn college credit. Our goal is not just a diploma, but a purpose.

The first day of school is Monday, August 17, 2026.

School begins at 8:30 and ends at 3:20 (or 2:02 on early release days). Please see the enclosed Bell Schedule for details. Breakfast (7:30–8:30) and lunch are free for all students. Bus routes can be found at www.fresnounified.org (Departments → Transportation → Bus Routes).

We invite incoming 9th graders to join Warrior Welcome Week (Aug 3-7, 9:00–1:30)—a fun, supportive way to get to know our campus, staff, and classmates. Flyers will be sent home soon that include dates, times, and registration info. Freshman Orientation will be Monday, August 3rd. Parents and families are encouraged to attend a separate informational meeting on Friday, August 7th from 11:30-12:30 in Royce Hall.

First Day Packets will be handed out August 17 and are due by Friday, August 21. If you don’t receive a packet, visit the office starting August 10.

Class Schedules will be posted on ATLAS the week of August 10. Please check ATLAS up to the first day, as schedules may change due to enrollment adjustments.

We encourage students to bring basic school supplies (backpack, binder, paper, pencils, pens) and their school-issued laptop daily. Please review the dress code and cell phone policy included in this mailer as you prepare for the year.

STUDENT HEALTH INFORMATION

Nurses's Office

- Please complete, sign and turn in the EMERGENCY CARDS for each of your children attending Fresno High. If your phone number or address changes during the school year, please call the school and we will update your information.
- If your child requires MEDICATION at school, a completed "Medication at School" form must be renewed on a yearly basis. The form is available from the Health Center or your doctor. This form is required for any **ASTHMA** medication and over the counter drugs like **TYLENOL**. For your child's safety and the safety of other students, please **DO NOT** send your student to school carrying medications without proper consent.
- If your daughter is or becomes PREGNANT, please notify the Nurse's Office. These students have special health needs and we will help them with planning for homework pick-up after their delivery.
- HOME INSTRUCTION is only available for extreme circumstances, typically involving students who are on bed rest and incapable of leaving their home, and must be approved by a panel with medical documentation. If your child has had a surgery, or if you have questions regarding home instruction, please call the Nurse's Office for more information.
- The Nurse's Office does not excuse sick students without talking to a parent or adult listed on the emergency card. Students who are not sick enough to go home are allowed to rest in the Nurse's Office, and then are expected to return to class.
- If your child contacts you during the school and requests to leave campus due to illness, please call the attendance desk to excuse your child. If you prefer that they stay on campus and see the nurse, let your child know that they will need a pass from their teacher to visit the Nurse's Office.
- Thankyou for your cooperation and feel free to call if you have questions.
- District procedure 5141.1 (page 2 of 3) states: "*In an extreme emergency, an ambulance may be called or child taken to a hospital without parental authorization.*" Parents are responsible for costs incurred during "reasonable treatment" by the school. It would be far better to be involved in a debate over payment than to fail to call the ambulance when needed.

FAMILY LIFE EDUCATION

Section 51550 of the Education Code prohibits governing boards of school districts from requiring pupils to attend classes "in which human reproductive organs and their functions and processes are described, illustrated, or discussed." Parents are to be given the opportunity to preview materials and may choose to request in writing that their child be withdrawn from the class (without credit loss) during the time these materials are to be shown or discussed.

To abide by the code, the Fresno Unified School District is notifying you that Family Life Education, Human Reproduction, and Sexually Transmitted Diseases Education may be taught within the curriculum in the following classes: Physiology, Biology, Zoology, Health Education, Science, Psychology, Health Principles and Practices, Physical Education, Sociology for Living, Adult Living, Exploring Childhood, Human Development Children and You, PACE/Parenthood Child Education I, Pregnant and Adolescent Learning Center, and Prenatal Health Classes.

If you have questions or concerns regarding a course in which your child is enrolled, please email your child's counselor and/or Vice Principal. Arrangements will be made for you to receive a list of materials and films (*pertaining to subject matter addressed in Section 51550 of the Education Code*) that will be used for instruction in the course. If you wish your child to be exempt from portions of the course, you may complete the request forms in accordance with district policy 6142.1.

FRESNO HIGH SCHOOL DRESS CODE

FUSD Dress Code

Educationally Appropriate Dress and Appearance (AR 5132)

The responsibility for the dress and appearance of a student rests primarily with the student and their parents or guardians. In the interest of maintaining an appropriate learning environment, the district believes in the following basic principles:

- All students are encouraged to dress in a manner that is appropriate, comfortable and conducive to an active academic school day.
- Students should be able to wear clothing without fear of or actual unnecessary discipline or body shaming.
- The student dress code should serve to support all students to develop a body-positive self-image.
- The district standard dress and appearance policy is gender neutral and applies to all students equally regardless of gender on school campuses and at school-sponsored functions and will be enforced consistently and fairly by all members of the school staff
- Clothing and hair styles are a matter of personal choice (except for schools with uniforms). The school shall be concerned only when this impacts the health and safety of students and staff.

Examples of inappropriate clothing include:

- clothing where the torso is exposed, i.e., tube tops, mid-drift shirts, halters and tank tops
- clothing that is see-through. (clothing must be opaque)
- clothing or accessories which show profanity, obscene words or pictures, sexually suggestive statements, or incites to violence
- clothing representing gang-related activities
- clothing where the entire thigh is exposed, such as micro minis or short shorts.
- bathing suits or cut-offs
- the wearing and carrying of tobacco promotional items, or items promoting controlled substances (drugs) and/or alcohol,
- clothing where undergarments are exposed
- clothing that has text that is libelous, bullying, constitutes harassment or discrimination
- footwear must be worn at school and all functions

Fresno High School Specific Dress Code

1. Gang-related symbols, insignias, or "colors" are NOT to be worn or displayed. Any clothing item or accessory that is overly bright red, or bulldog red, will NOT be permitted.
2. Clothing, hats, beanies, other head covering, or accessories with logos/mascots depicting bulldogs (word or image of) such as Fresno State Bulldogs and Georgetown Hoyas are NOT acceptable.

To preserve the integrity of a safe and orderly campus climate, the Principal reserves the right to make alterations and additions to the dress code, which may include the banning of articles of clothing, accessories and/or colors.

ENFORCEMENT OF THE FRESNO HIGH DRESS CODE IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF ALL STAFF.

Referrals will be made to the Vice Principals for appropriate action

Consequences of Dress and Appearance Code Violation

First Violation: Home contact and the violator will be required to correct the violation.

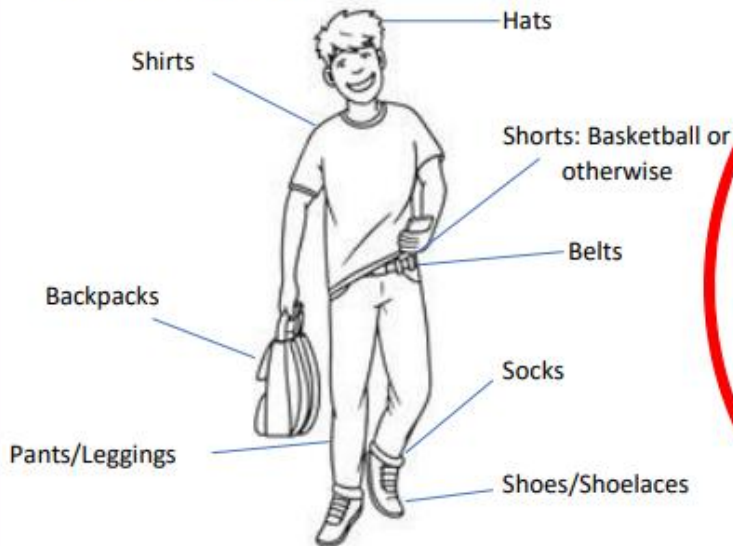
Further violations: Home contact, correction of the violation and additional disciplinary action (i.e. lunch detention, etc.)

Dangerous or Disruptive Violations: Dress or appearance violations that cause actual disruption of the educational environment, result in actual violation of law or other school rules, including hate-crime laws, or cause actual injury may result, at the discretion of the district Administration, in more serious disciplinary action, up to and including expulsion without regard to the policy set forth above for standard violations. The process for appeal of these dangerous or disruptive violations shall be consistent with standard district disciplinary procedures.

FHS DRESS CODE

Absolutely NO Red Articles of Clothing will be permitted on campus including clothing under jackets and sweatshirts/hoodies. No shirts that expose stomach area. No strapless shirts. No visible under garments. Shorts must have a four (4) inch inseam.

This includes but is not limited to:



HOODS, BEANIES, HATS

Hoods, Beanies and Hats are **NOT** to be worn while on campus.

SKIRTS, DRESSES, and SHORTS

Skirts, dresses, and shorts must be mid-thigh or lower, including athletic shorts.

SHIRTS AND TOPS

Strapless tops, backless tops, midriffs, and low-cut necklines are prohibited.

Strapless and sleeveless tops may be worn with a cardigan or sweater that fully covers all areas appropriately at all times.

Shoulder straps must have a minimum width of a dollar bill.

Clothing must **NOT** display alcohol, drug, or sexual references.

PANTS, LEGGINGS, and EXPOSED UNDERGARMENTS

Jeans with holes, shreds, and rips at mid-thigh or lower will be permitted.

Shreds or rips above mid-thigh may **NOT** reveal skin.

Pants must stay up at all times. No low rise or saggy pants revealing undergarments.

Leggings and yoga pants are permitted if skin and undergarments are not revealing.

CELL PHONE POLICY

The Fresno High Community would like to inform you about an important school policy that will be in effect during the 2026–27 school year. All Fresno High School classrooms will be cell phone-free zones; this applies to cell phones, earbuds, smartwatches used for communication, as well as any other personal communication devices. Assembly Bill 3216 authorizes school governing boards to regulate the possession and use of electronic devices during the school day. In accordance with Fresno Unified School District Board Policy 5131.8 (Mobile Communication Devices), all personal communication devices must be securely stowed away during instructional time.

Our school community believes that a consistent, school-wide policy limiting cell phone use during instructional periods will help students remain focused, engaged, and present in their learning. Our goal is to support every student's academic success by reducing a major source of distraction.

Summary of Cell Phone Policy

- Cell phones are prohibited from use in classrooms and any other area in which academic work is being done. School issued devices will be the primary tool for instruction needing technology/Applications
- Parents can communicate with students by calling the main office.
- **ParentSquare** will be used for important school updates, including emergency notifications.

Cell Phone Policy Consequences:*

- **1st Violation:** The student will receive a verbal warning from the teacher. The phone will not be confiscated if the student is able to comply with the initial violation.
- **2nd Violation:** A referral is written, and the cell phone or mobile device is held in school office until student picks up after their last class.
- **3rd Violation:** A referral is written; the cell phone or mobile device is held in school office until a parent/guardian picks it up.**

Chronic Violations: Parent Meeting will be held with an administrator. Students must check in their cell phone each day by first school bell and pick up after the last scheduled class for the rest of the school year.

Students who do not follow teacher directives will be acting in defiance which could result in disciplinary action

***Confiscated Cell Phones will be arranged to be picked up by parents/guardians and vice principal.*

***It should be noted that neither the school nor any of its employees are responsible for the loss or damage to any student's phone or electronic devices, whether in the student's possession or confiscated by the staff. It is the responsibility of the student to adhere to this policy and to always secure his or her belongings. Classes and/or instruction will not be stopped to deal with or search for lost phones/devices.*

Emergency Protocols: ParentSquare will be the primary source of information communicated to parents during an emergency; students can still communicate through staff-approved procedures. Parents are encouraged to use ParentSquare for immediate contact with the school rather than texting students directly during class hours.

Your Support Matters

- We recognize this is a shift and may require adjustments at home as well. This is a commitment to helping our students thrive.
- Talk to your child about the benefits of disconnecting during the school day.
- Use school communication tools like ParentSquare to stay in touch when needed.

This policy is subject to revision as necessary, and any changes will be communicated to parents accordingly.

SCHOOL BUS INFORMATION

Beginning 2026-2027 all students riding a Fresno Unified school bus will be required to have a student bus pass. The registration link goes live Friday, July 24, and families will receive directions through ParentSquare.

Why this is a positive change:

- **For schools:** accurate bus rosters allow us to level routes, reduce overcrowding, and deliver more reliable pickup and drop-off times
- **For parents:** passes are scanned at boarding and exit, confirming your student got on and off the bus safely each day

PARKING AT FRESNO HIGH

Driving to school and parking on campus is a privilege that is closely monitored at FHS. Due to neighborhood parking problems, students should only use the school parking lot.

Student Parking Permits Required for 2026-2027:

As we enter a new school year, all students who drive to school and park on campus must have an FHS student parking permit. Students will need to complete an application and provide a valid CA driver's license, car registration and insurance with the application. The student permit applications will be available on the first day of school, August 17, 2026, in the VP office. Parking permits will be enforced starting Monday, August 24, 2026. All cars parked on campus must have a parking permit hung on the rear-view mirror.

Please observe the following rules when parking on campus:

- The speed limit in the parking lot or school grounds is 5 miles per hour
- Staff parking is designated for STAFF Use only and are **NOT** to be used by students
- Students & the public may not use the interior roads of the campus at any time. This includes before and after school hours. Only **AUTHORIZED** vehicles may access interior roads.
- The school cannot assume responsibility for loss due to theft, fire, or accident.
- The only time students may be in the parking lot is when they are parking their cars or when they are taking their cars from the lot.
- Cars may be searched at any time if school officials feel student safety is in jeopardy.

NON-PRIVILEGED LIST

- Students who have any combination of 3 or more unexcused class period absences/tardies within a 2-week timeframe will be placed on the non-privilege list.
- Students who have been suspended within 2 weeks prior to an event will be placed on the non-privilege list.
- Students on Level 3 for Cell Phone policy violations will be placed on the non-privilege list.

- General procedures prior to purchasing tickets require students to obtain clearance. Students might not be clear to purchase tickets and attend a dance or event if they are on the **non-privilege list**.

School Events and Dances

- There are different events throughout the school year, such as sporting events, school plays, school dances. We encourage all our students to participate and attend, however students on the **non-privilege list** will not be allowed to attend. If students are bringing a guest from another school, they must complete the Guest Pass. Guests must be approved by their site administrator and need to provide an ID at the dance.

Closed Campus

- The safety of our students and staff is our first priority. Therefore, Fresno High School is a **CLOSED campus** during the entire school day. All students must receive a permit to leave from the attendance office which includes contact with a parent/guardian on the emergency card. If a student leaves campus without permission, they are subject to disciplinary action upon return.

Senior Off-Campus Lunch Passes

- **Permission slips** are needed to obtain a Senior Off Campus Lunch Pass; they will be issued through the front office during lunch the week of **August 24th to August 28th**. Seniors will be informed as soon as we are able to safely issue Senior Off Campus Lunch Passes.
- **Criteria:** To receive an off-campus lunch pass Seniors **MUST** be on track for graduation with a minimum of **170 CREDITS** at the start of Fall Semester. and/or minimum of **200 CREDITS** at the start of Spring Semester. Students must be in good academic standing and have above **90% attendance rate**.
- All seniors who want to leave campus must show the off-campus ID through 5-Star Students to the Safety at the gate. You will not be allowed to leave without the proper ID.
- **REMINDER:** Senior Off Campus Passes are a privilege and may be revoked for discipline or attendance reasons.
- Passes for the fall semester **will not** be issued after **Thanksgiving Break** and passes for the spring semester **will not** be issued after **Spring Break**.

Student ID Cards

- Student ID cards will be digital using the app called 5-Star Students your student can find this free app in the apple store or google play store. This will be how they get into sporting events, dances, it indicates if your students attend CART and for the seniors this will be where they will have their off campus lunch pass if they have one.

UberEats/Door Dash Orders

- UberEats, DoorDash or other food delivery services are **not authorized**. Fresno High **WILL NOT ACCEPT FOOD DELIVERIES**. In addition, food deliveries handed over the fence are not acceptable as it constitutes safety concerns. If students are caught receiving food through the fence, they will receive consequences.

Fresno High Start On-Time Policy

Students are expected to arrive to school on time just as adults are expected to arrive at their jobs on time. It is very disruptive to a teacher and students in the classroom when other students arrive late. In the event students do arrive late, the office will only issue excused tardies and absences with a doctor's note. School starts promptly at 8:30 daily. All other tardies are unexcused and may involve disciplinary action. ie. lunch detention, after school detention, being put on the no privilege list.

Each student is expected to be in class before the tardy bell rings. They are given 6 minutes between each class and one minute before the tardy bell music plays to let the students know that they will be late once the music stops and the bell rings.

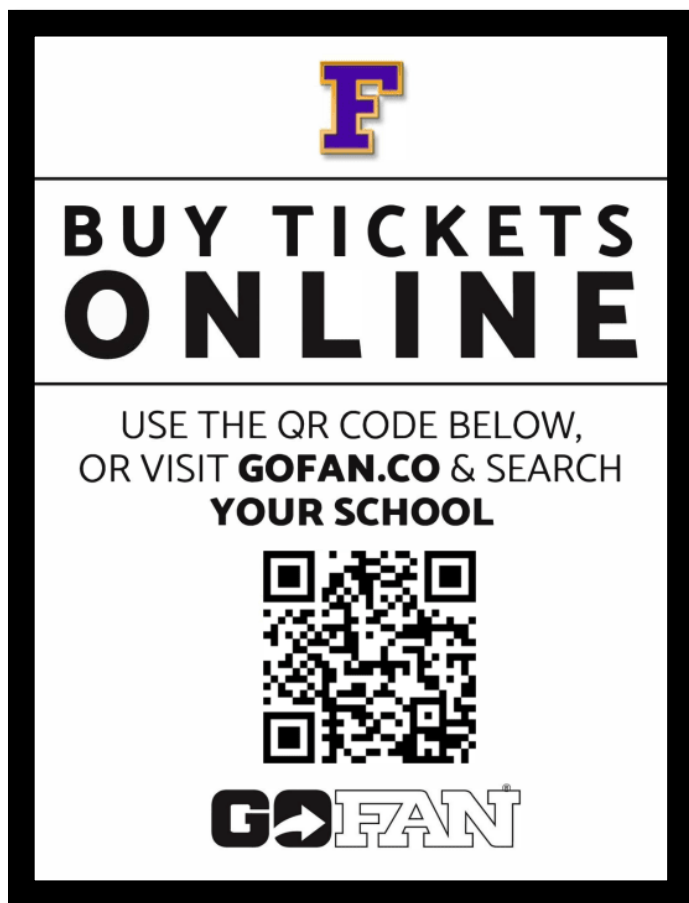

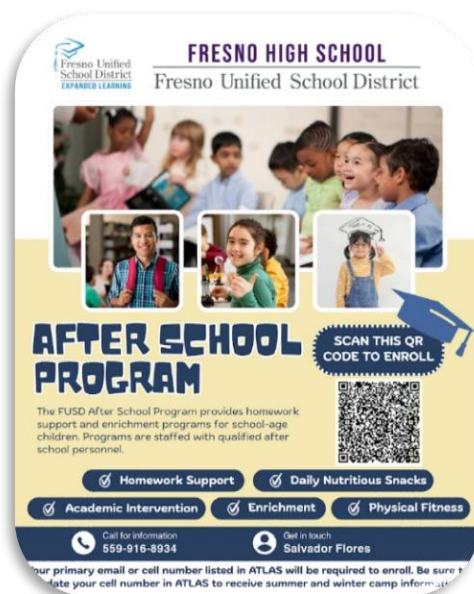

California Assessment System, 2027

TO PARENTS/GUARDIANS: California’s academic standards—the things we want students to know and be able to do—are designed so students graduate ready for college and career. Students across California in grades 3-8 and grade 11 take the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) assessments each spring. The online tests were created specifically to gauge each student’s performance in English language arts/literacy (ELA), mathematics, and science. These tests measure the skills called for by the academic standards, including the ability to write clearly, think critically, and solve problems.

The English Language Proficiency Assessments for California (ELPAC) measure how well English learner students are progressing with English language development in each of four domains: Listening, Speaking, Reading, and Writing.

IMPORTANT: Parents/Guardians have the right to exempt their child from CAASPP assessments pursuant to CA Ed Code Section 60615. You may annually submit a written request to the principal of your child’s school to excuse your child from any or all parts of the CAASPP assessments. The regulations do not provide a parent exemption option for any ELPAC tests.

11th and 12th Grade CART Students

CART is a unique program that offers hands-on, project-based learning opportunities for juniors and seniors from 14 high schools in the Clovis and Fresno school districts. This non-traditional learning path is designed for students who are interested in pursuing career-specific pathways.

CART provides 14 college and career-focused labs, each offering academically rigorous, real-world projects tailored to the students' chosen fields. Students can participate in either an AM or PM CART lab:

- **AM CART Students:** Attend their CART lab in the morning and return to their home school for afternoon classes.
- **PM CART Students:** Attend their home school in the morning and travel to their CART lab for afternoon classes.

Transportation Options

Buses are available for students to travel to and from CART, as well as to Fresno High School. Alternatively, students can drive themselves.

- **AM CART Students:**
 - Bus pick-up: 7:00 AM (arrives at CART by 7:23 AM)
 - Return to Fresno High: 10:50 AM (arrives at 11:10 AM)
 - If driving themselves, students must return to school and check in at the office by 11:20 AM. Students are not allowed to leave campus for errands or meals between their CART lab and afternoon classes.
- **PM CART Students:**
 - Bus pick-up: 12:25 PM (arrives at CART by 12:45 PM)
 - Return to Fresno High: 3:55 PM (arrives at 4:15 PM)
 - If driving themselves, students may leave campus at 12:15 PM to ensure they have enough time to drive to CART and park before their afternoon classes begin.

CART Academic Year:

- Last day for CART seniors: Friday, May 14, 2027
- Last day for CART juniors: Thursday, June 3, 2027

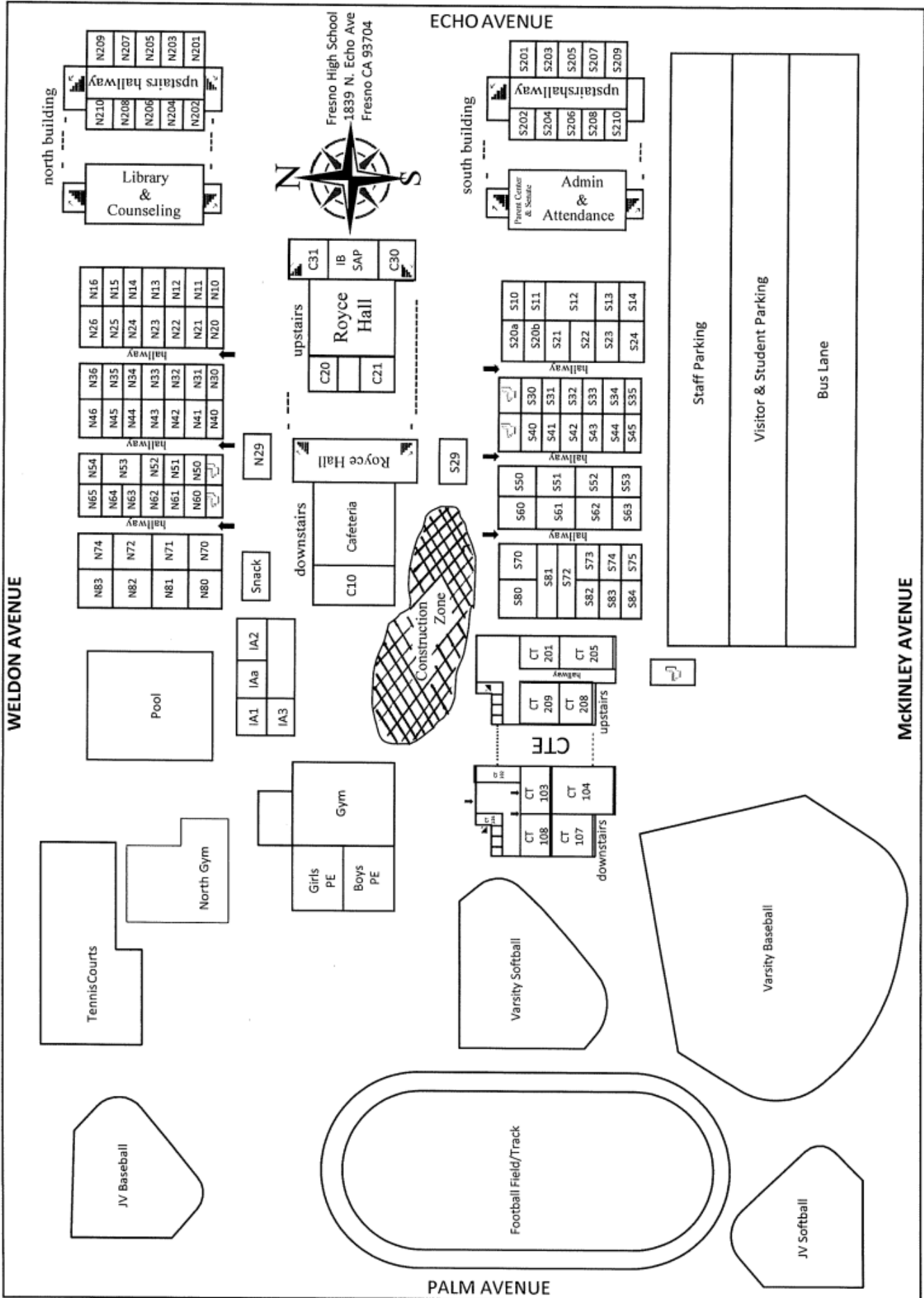
