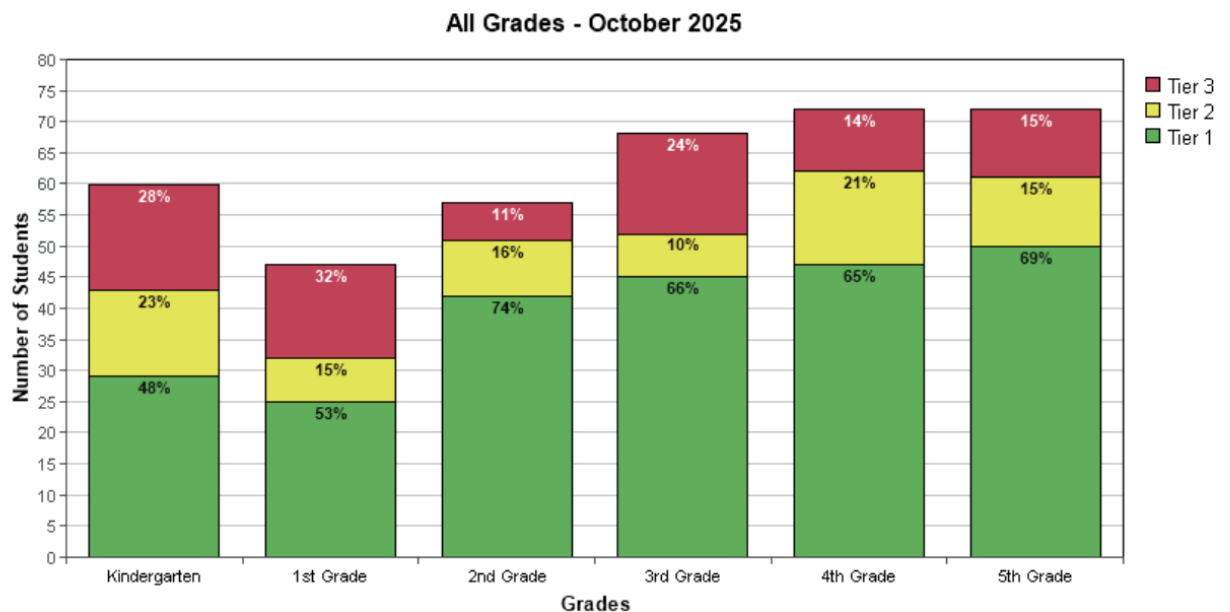

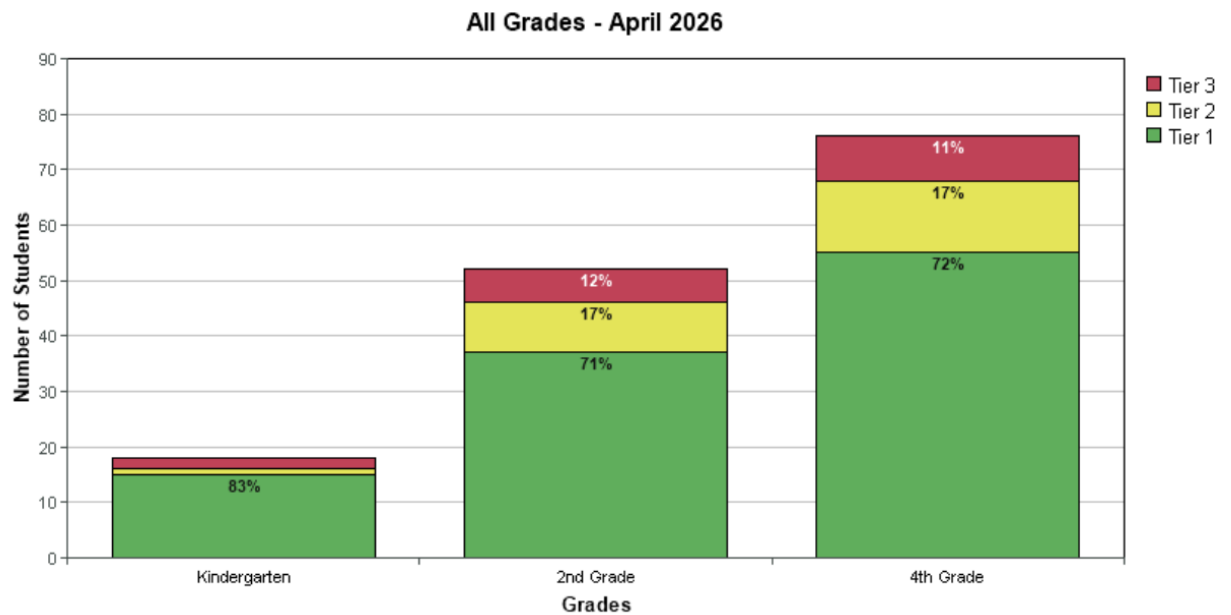
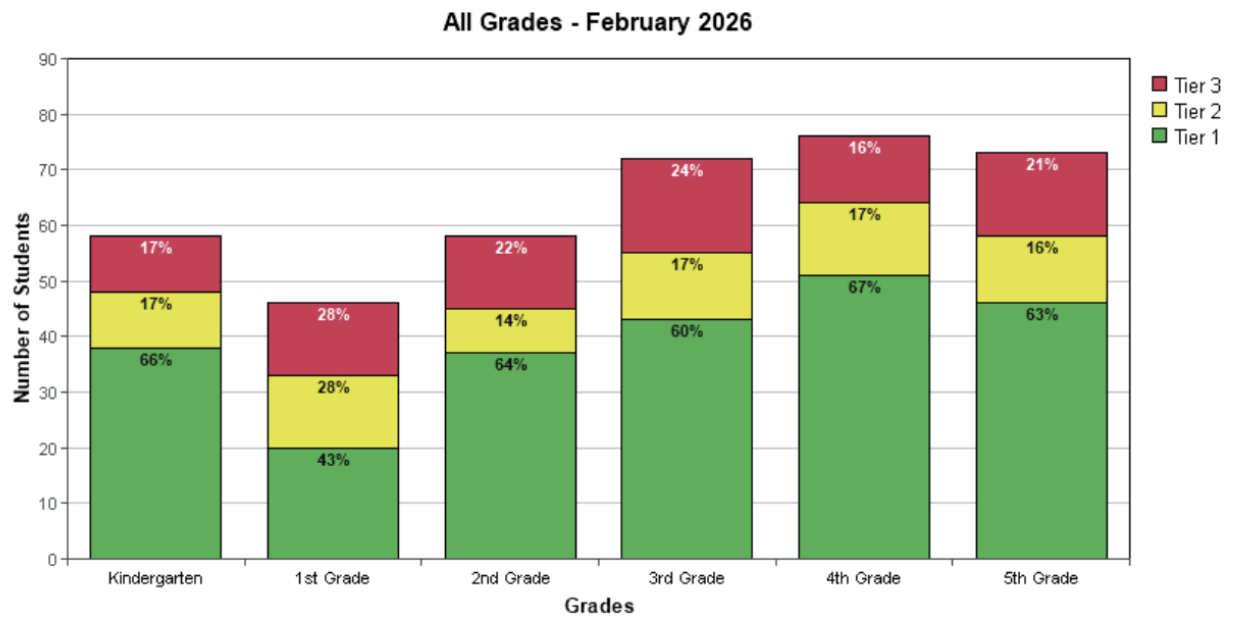

★ **ISIP Reading Scores** - 4th and 5th are using IXL to Benchmark students for the fall and will use their diagnostic scores to watch progress.

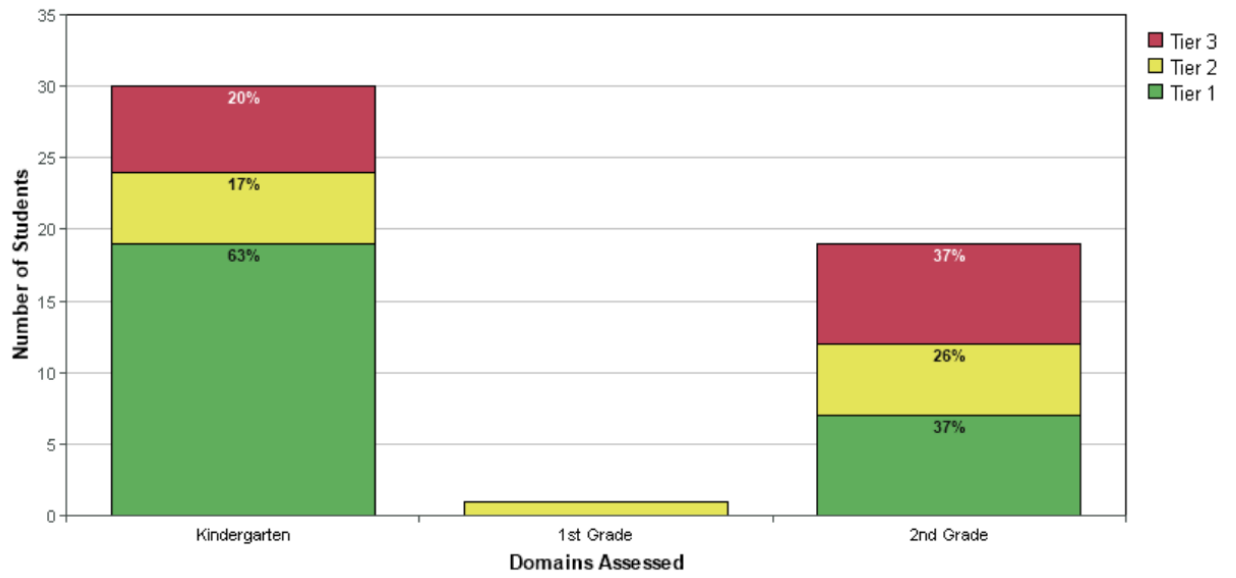




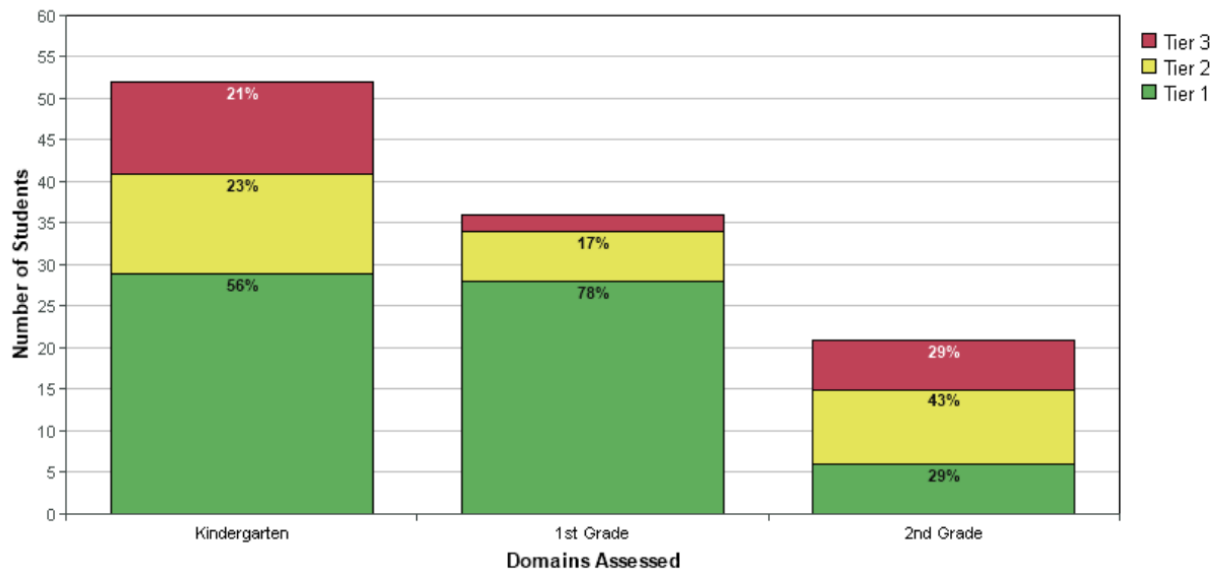

★ ISIP Math Scores

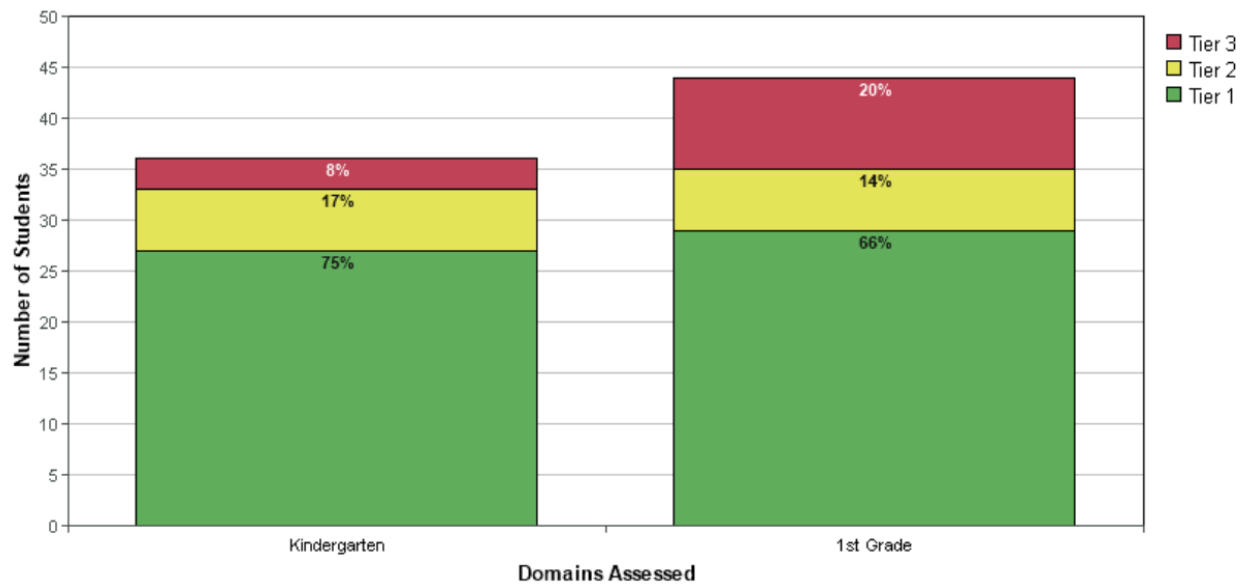
All Grades - October 2025

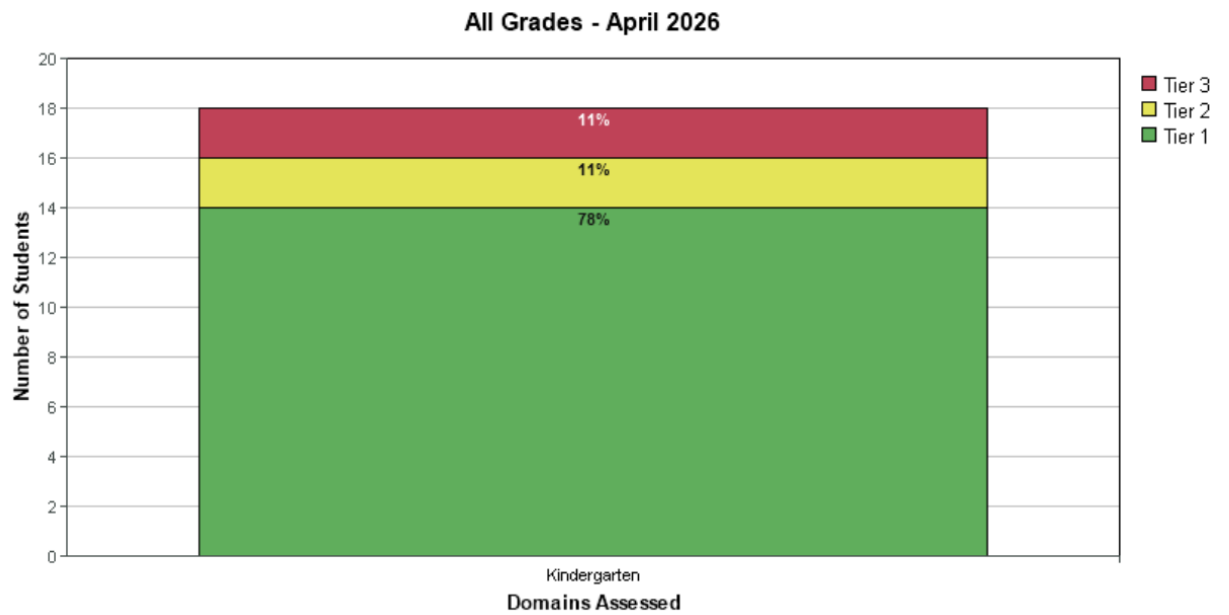


All Grades - December 2025



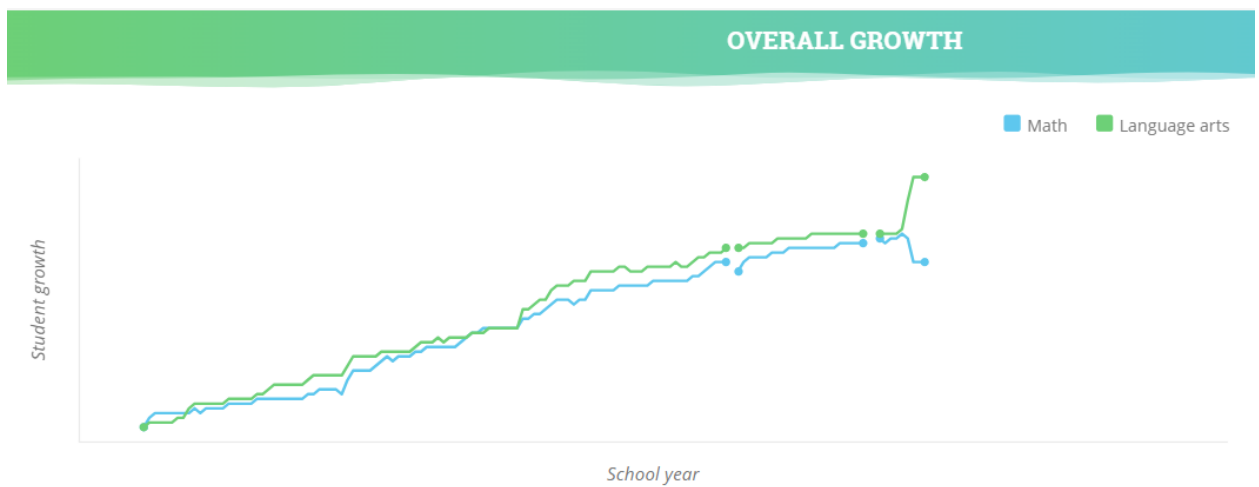
All Grades - February 2026



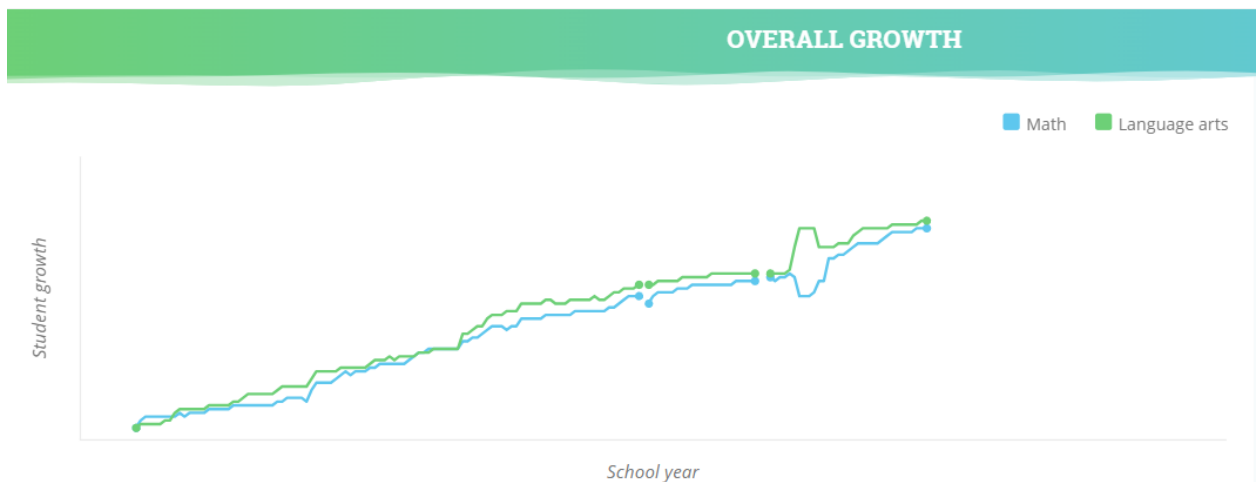

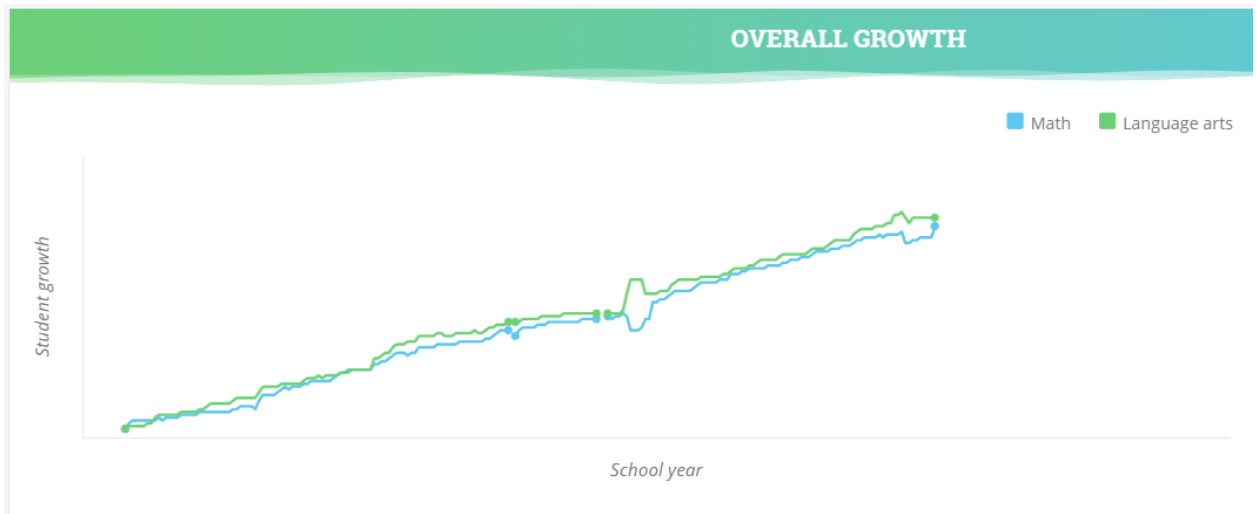
★ IXL Overall Growth

We were excited to see that some major things are in place as we look to organize our RTI and system of support into a model that supports student success on Essential "Promise" standards from year to year.

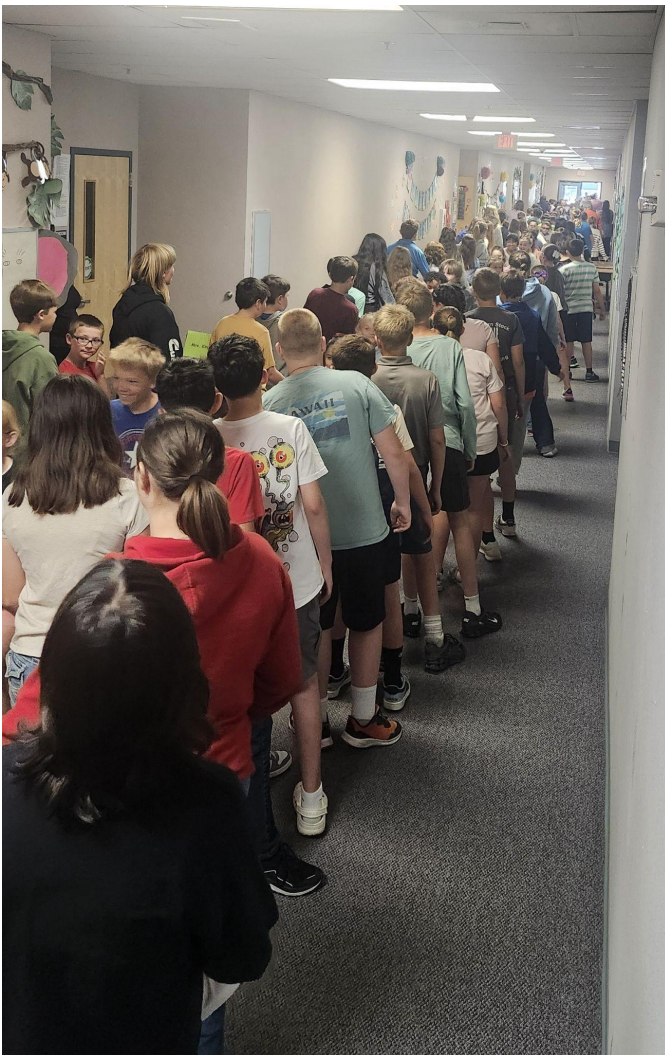
This year, we have 2 bikes and 2 scooters that we are holding a raffle for, and students get tickets for attendance and for improved scores in reading and math.
