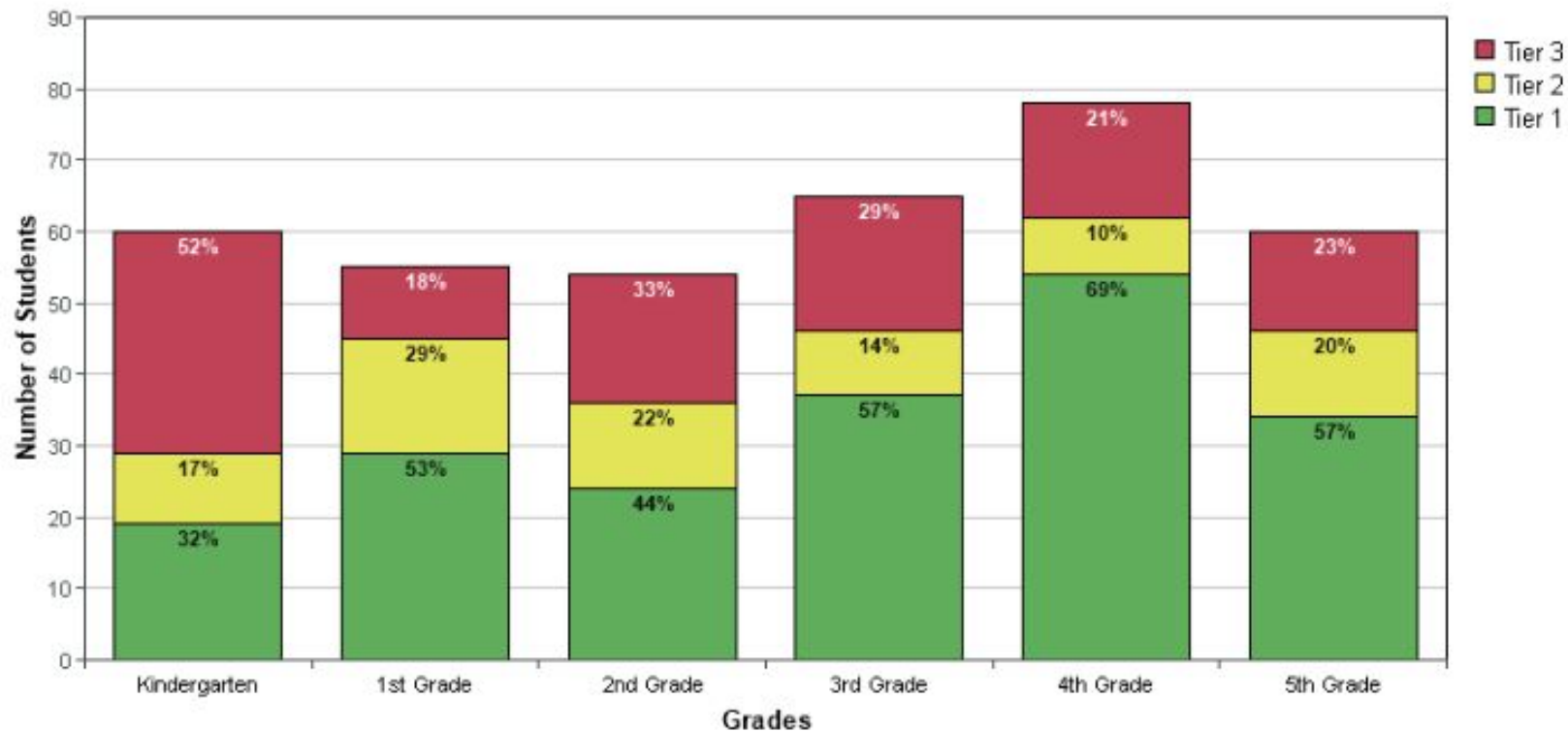
Data Reports

- **ISIP Reading:** The following graphs display student performance levels from the beginning and middle of the year. In the next board report, I will share results from our end-of-year assessments. As this is the first year implementing a new version of the state assessment, our testing timeline differed slightly from a typical year.
- **IXL Math:** The second set of data are from the IXL program which is used for monitoring math. Grades 2-5 work with this program.



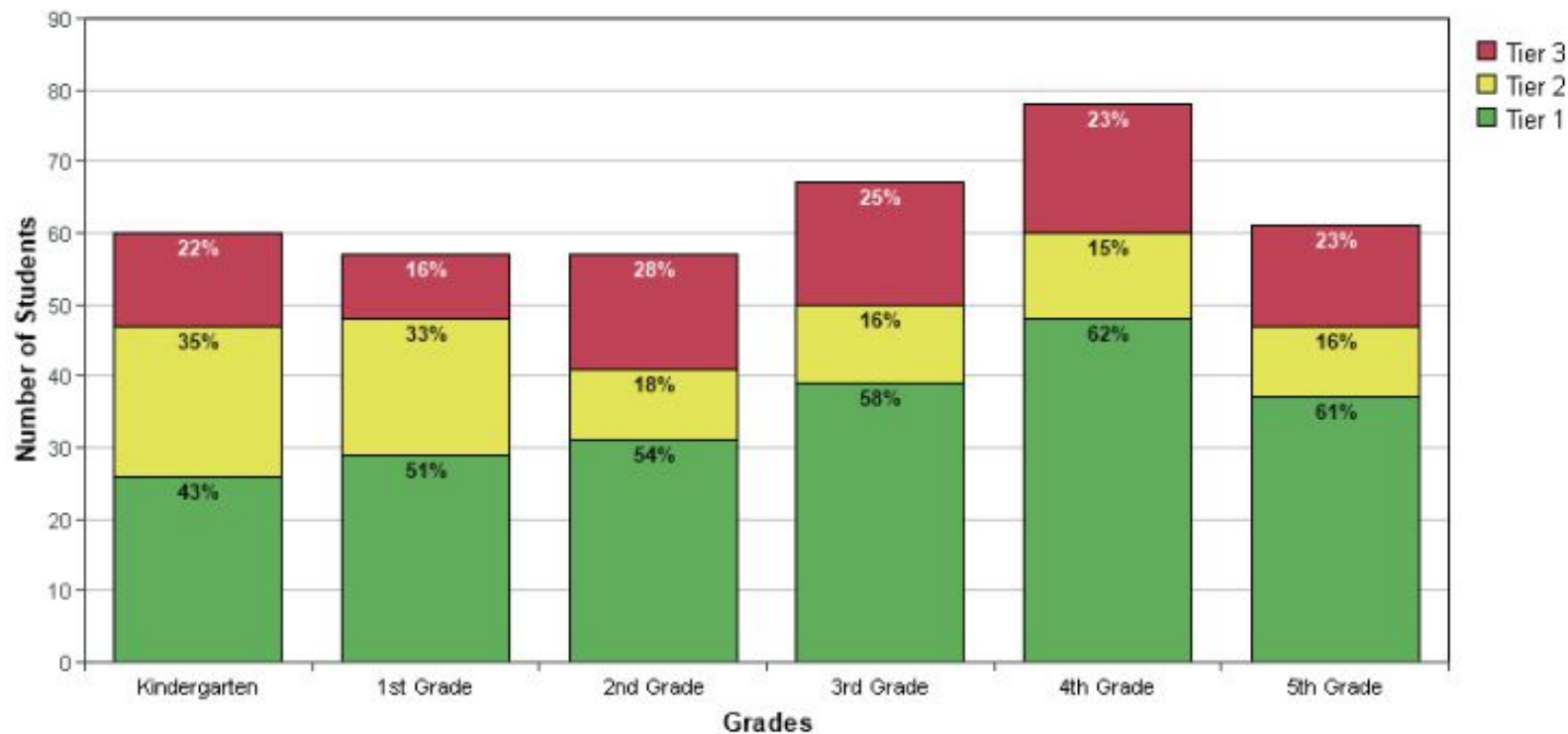
Beginning of Year ISIP (Reading) Data

All Grades - February 2026



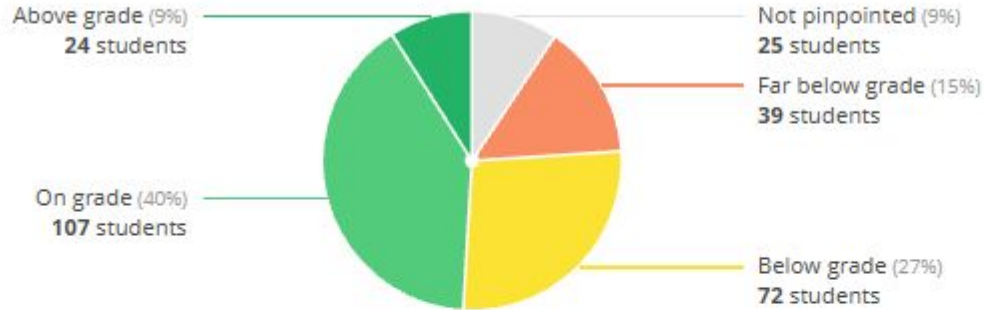
