

Rogue River School District 2026 Summer Learning Program

August 03, 2026 - Rogue River School District's three-week K–12 Summer Learning Program is serving 137 students from incoming kindergarten through high school. The program focuses on building strong literacy skills while giving students fun, engaging opportunities to learn throughout the summer.

The district is partnering with Head Start to offer Kinder JumpStart, a half-day program for incoming kindergarten students. The program helps students build confidence, practice school routines, make new friends, and strengthen early literacy skills before starting kindergarten.

Elementary and middle school students participate in a literacy-focused program that strengthens reading, writing, and communication skills through engaging daily lessons. In the afternoons, students take part in hands-on enrichment activities through partnerships with Rogue Valley Farm 2 School, Talent Maker City, and Project Youth+. These experiences introduce students to agriculture, nutrition, STEM, career exploration, creativity, and teamwork while connecting learning to real-world experiences.

High school students have several ways to earn credit during the summer. Course offerings include Forensic Science, Short Stories in Science Fiction, and Algebra Readiness. Students also have the opportunity to recover credits or get ahead by completing online coursework through Edgenuity.

The Summer Learning Program helps students continue learning, build confidence, and stay connected to school during the summer. By combining strong academics with meaningful enrichment experiences and community partnerships, the program prepares students for a successful start to the new school year.
