98 students earned WorkKeys certificates, including 42 Silver, 15 Gold, and 4 Platinum certificates.



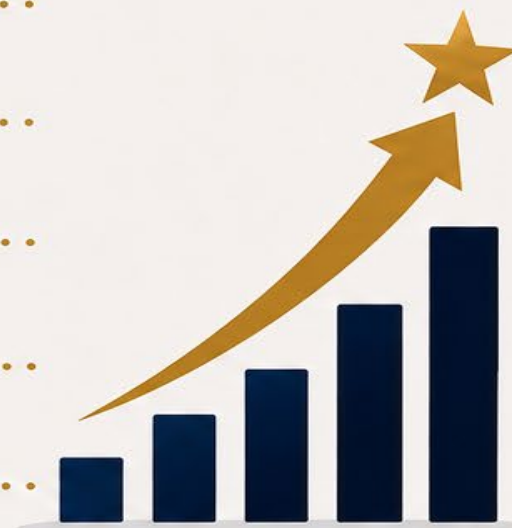
The percentage of ACT testers earning a composite score of **at least 18** increased from **17.2%** to **22.1%**.

BCSS Meets IDEA Requirements!

Butler County earned **29** of **30** possible points—**96.67%**—and received the highest IDEA determination of “Meets Requirements.”



Graduation Success!

The district report-card graduation rate for students with disabilities increased from **75.00%** to **85.71%**. The IDEA Performance Profile separately reported an **87.50%** graduation rate with a regular diploma.



CCR Rate Is Rising!

The College and Career Readiness rate for students with disabilities increased from **43.75%** to **57.14%**, a strong **13.39**-point gain.



ACAP Alternate Science Strength!

In 2024–25, **53.8%** of ACAP Alternate science participants reached Levels 3–4, making science the strongest ACAP Alternate subject.



Attendance Improved Significantly!

Chronic absenteeism among students with disabilities decreased from **38.63%** to **29.21%**, an improvement of **9.42** percentage points.
