Student Drop Off

1. Designated Lane Only

Use the drop-off/pick-up lane; do not use the parking lot.

2. Pull to the Curb

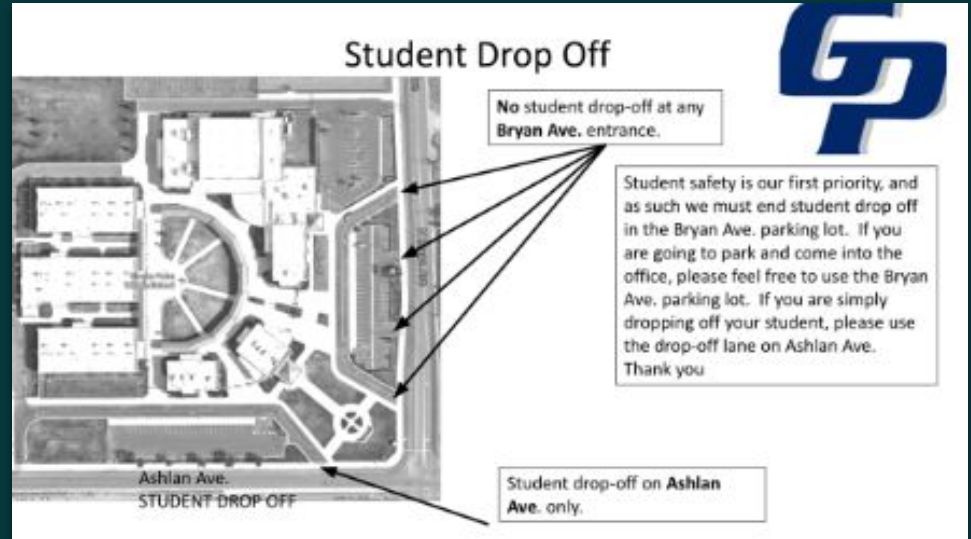
Stop only at the curb, never in the left lane.

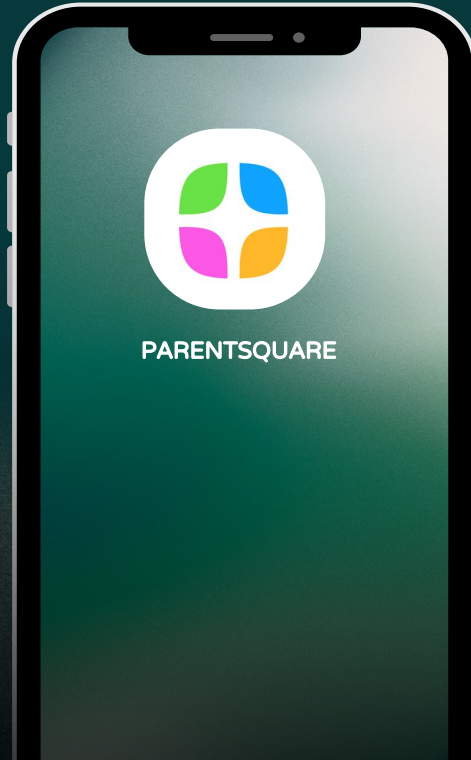

Dress Code

IS THIS IN DRESS CODE?



TANK TOPS

Clothes shall be worn as intended, must have an appropriate neckline, and be sufficient to conceal undergarments, which shall be worn and covered at all times.

SHIRT LENGTH

Underwear-type sleeveless shirts, see-through, fishnet, or other attire which exposes the body such as bare midriffs, tube tops, halter tops, dresses, skirts, shorts, shorts, etc. are not acceptable.



FRAYS AND HOLES/ SHORT LENGTH

Clothing must be in good condition and not showing excessive wear or exposing excessive skin. All pants, shorts, skirts, shorts, and dresses must be properly hemmed.



HAIRSTYLES

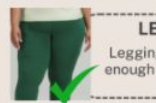
Hair styles shall be clean and neatly groomed. Students can wear hairstyles and textures that include braids, locks, and twists. The school shall only be concerned when a haircut or hairstyle impacts the health and safety of students and staff.



PAJAMAS AND SHOES

Sweatshirts/sweatpants and flannel pants are acceptable. Pajama bottoms may not be worn.

All TK-6 students must wear shoes with a back strap.



LEGGINGS

Leggings must be thick enough so as not to be see-through.

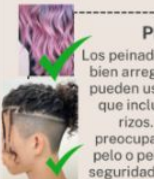
LARGO DE LAS CAMISETAS

PANTALONES DESHILACHADOS Y CON AGUJEROS/LARGOS O CORTOS

La ropa debe estar en buen estado y no presentar desgastes excesivos ni dejar expuesta demasiada piel. Todos los pantalones, shorts, faldas, faldas pantalón y vestidos deben tener el dobladillo correcto.



PEINADOS

Los peinados deben estar limpios y bien arreglados. Los estudiantes pueden usar peinados y texturas que incluyan trenzas, bucles y rizos. La escuela solo se preocupará cuando un corte de pelo o peinado afecte la salud y seguridad de los estudiantes y el personal.



PIJAMAS Y ZAPATOS

Se aceptan sudaderas/pantalones deportivos y pantalones de franela. No se permite el uso de pantalones de pijama.

PANTALONES LEGGINGS

Los leggings deben ser lo suficientemente gruesos para que no se vean a través de ellos.

Attendance Policies



Daily Expectation

Daily full day attendance is the expectation for all students.

CHRONIC ABSENCE

Students are considered Chronically Absent when they miss **10% or 18 days** of the school year.



Punctuality

The school day starts at **8:20 AM**. Students not in class at 8:20 are marked tardy.

CONSEQUENCE

Students will be assigned **detention** if they are tardy to class.
*starting on August 17



Limits & Recovery

More than **10 absences** limits the ability to participate in co-curriculars. 8th graders with **>= 10 absences** lose end-of-year activity eligibility.

RECOVERY:

Saturday School can be used to make up missed days.

Attendance Reporting



1. ParentSquare

The easiest way to report.

Simply respond directly to the ParentSquare absence notification sent to your mobile device or email.



2. Call the School

Call and select the attendance option to leave a message.

- You do not need to speak to a person.
- Include student's name, date, and reason.
- We call back ONLY if more info is needed.



3. Doctor's Visit

For medical appointments.

If your student is seen by a doctor, have them bring the medical excuse note directly to the office upon their return to school.

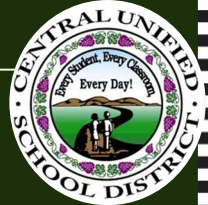

Phone-Free Schools Act- Assembly Bill 3216

The goal is to help students stay focused, improve mental health and academic performance, reduce negative behaviors associated with excessive use of technology, and social media use.



Why are We Doing This?

Assembly Bill 3216- Phone Free Schools Act

*Research shows we are on a digital overload phase that is impacting student's social-emotional health and academics.



3 Hours

The daily social media use that doubles anxiety and depression risks among youth.



20 Minutes

The time it takes for students to regain focus after a nearby cell phone distraction.



15 Points

The decrease in scores of mathematics students when distracted by phones.



68 Percent

The percentage of students who report that electronic devices are distracting.

Yondr Pouches for Middle Schools and High Schools.



Shielded Phone Box for Elementary and K-8 (HK) Schools



StopIt Application installed in all our 1:1 technology, accessible as a bookmark on all browsers. Additionally, the link is on our Central Unified website for all students and families to use. Students and families can report concerns from home.





One-to-One Assignment

Each student in middle or high schools receive a YONDR pouch that is assigned to them for the school year during the summer distribution days or upon enrollment. Printed ID cards or student ID badges will be placed in the snap closure window.





Checking-out, replacing a pouch, obtaining a loaner pouch, or buying an extra pouch?

1. Library staff will check out pouches at their school site using Destiny, our library and resource management system. Barcode is written on the outside of the pouch for tracking purposes.
2. If pouch is damaged or lost, student will be fined \$25 for the pouch and then a replacement will be issued.
3. Each library will have “loaner” pouches, when student forgets pouch at home, for check out but again a fine will be assessed if pouch is not returned in 2 school days.

*A dedicated team of counselors, psychologist, social worker, Family Therapist, and administrators, that support students and families for identified social-emotional scenarios.

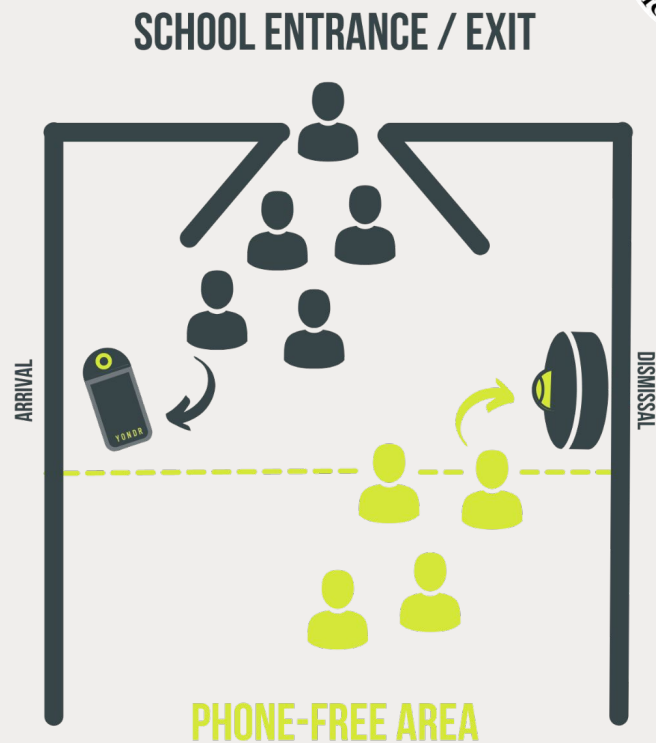


Daily Process

Devices mandated to be inside the Yondr pouch will be limited to cell phones only. All other devices will have to be turned off and put away from beginning to the end of academic day.

What must be turned off and put away:

- Smart Watches
- Smart Glasses
- Airpods/wireless earbuds
- Tablets (Not allowed at schools)
- Any other technology that serves the purpose of a mobile communication device (can text, search the web, post on social media, record, etc.)





What happens if a student forgets their pouch?

If a student forgets their pouch, a loaner pouch will be provided. It will be returned at dismissal.

Repeated instances, or if loaner is not returned after two school days, will be considered a lost pouch. A replacement will be issued at the student's expense, and the parent/guardian will be notified.

Cost for student pouch replacement= \$25



What happens if a student unlocks their pouch without permission, damages it, or uses an alternate phone?

If a student unlocks their pouch without permission, uses an alternate phone, or damages it, they may face progressive disciplinary action in line with our District's policy.

-A message will be sent to the parent explaining the warning provided to student, or the progressive discipline step student is facing.
