Credit Recovery Classes

Credit Recovery

Students who need to recover credits may enroll in an independent study course. Coursework is completed through Subject, an online learning platform that allows students to earn the credits needed to meet graduation requirements.

Students must have a minimum of one hour of contact with their teacher each week and complete approximately four hours of independent work for every hour of teacher contact. Course completion times vary. Students are expected to make consistent, ongoing progress as determined by their Credit Recovery Program teacher.
