- B. Student Board Member: *Valeria Fuentes*: Nothing to report.
- C. CBO Report: *Robert Irving*: Well, happy summer, everybody. Just once upon a time, it was a quiet time of the year. Those days are long gone. It seems like everybody is still at work. So, congratulations! Construction continues, Westpark is every day closer and closer to being done. The asphalt is completed. Now, they are painting design onto it and all of that, so that when school opens, there will not be the alligator skin that used to be there with a little bit of a crater fence wrapped around it. So that is uplifting. Movers have been at RES helping move classrooms from the Westpark satellite campus over to the regular Westpark, but now that the new buildings are completed enough to hold furniture and get everything finished before the start of school. In that regard, progress continues on the locker room. At least, yeah, did not hit any gas lines this week or anything like that. So always a lot. Last week, Dr. Keys from Tropic Middle School, Mr. Bajnath from the high school, myself, Superintendent Gaines, President Vincelette, Travis Ramirez from Alt Ed, went to a National Safe Schools Conference down in Garden Grove. Got a lot of good information and also a lot of terrifying information simultaneously, but it gave us the opportunity to find out areas that we are good in and areas that we are weak in. Things that maybe a concern, so that radar even more so than normal. But it was very informative. It was the first year we have sent anybody down there, so I think everybody took a lot away from it in terms of how do we apply this stuff to our various sites and the district as a whole and everything. So overall, it was a positive experience on that front. With the new buildings at Westpark, Centegix will be on site at the end of July to install beacons, and tie in that part of the campus end with the rest of Westpark, and they will be back at Tropic to address some areas they were not able to last year when they were out. So, with the landscape work and everything that was happening in that quad between the sixth-grade classrooms. So, I believe that is it for me.
- D. Assistant Superintendent, Instruction and Curriculum: *Dr. Larry Mendez was absent so Mrs. Gaines read a report on his behalf*: Dr. Mendez says that his department continues to prepare for the start of the school, including planning professional development and the new math curriculum. So, we are also getting professional development in the new math curriculum for our teachers. We will have four announced Williams visits this year in August of 2026, including Rosamond High, Rosamond Elementary, Westpark, and Tropic Middle School. Ed Services continues to support our parents with enrollments and data confirmations for the 26-27 school year, we have parents enrolling their students every single day for all of our schools. That's it for our Ed Services.
- E. Assistant Superintendent, Special Education, Pupil Personnel: *Sheryl Taylor*: Hello, everybody. I hope everybody is enjoying their summer vacation. First and foremost, in our department, one of the exciting things today, we do a lot of billing for different things and apply for grants and stuff like that. So, we bring different pools of money in to help fund professional development for our department as well as buy materials and things that students need. I got two checks today, totaling \$30,000 which brings our Medi-Cal billing total up to \$378,385.10 for a year-to-date. So, yay! Well done. It is exciting news for us. That's about it for me right now.
- F. Associate Superintendent, Human Resources: *Leanne Hargus was absent so Mrs. Gaines read a report on her behalf*: Human resources is busy completing paperwork and fingerprints for all of our newly hired employees. Certificated openings: we still have a resource teacher at Tropic Middle School, a Paxton Patterson teacher at Rare Earth High School and math teacher at Rosamond High Early College Campus. There is a potential candidate for this position, though. Classified in the next few weeks, interviews will be held for various open positions for our classified employees. Resolution 26-27-01 authorizes two prep period buyouts at Tropic Middle School to address instructional staffing needs for

sixth-grade. The assignments include one additional period of history and one additional period of science. So, we have two instead of hiring another teacher. Obviously, we don't need another teacher if there's only one period that we need to accommodate in accordance with the requirements of the resolution each teacher assigned to teach the additional course has been verified as meeting the subject matter qualifications. A review of each teacher's official transcripts confirmed that they possess at least twelve semester units in the subject area they will be teaching satisfying the credentialing requirements. For these assignments, additionally, each teacher has voluntarily agreed to prep period buyout and has signed the required teacher consent form, acknowledging their willingness to teach the additional class period. Approval of this resolution ensures that these assignments are compliant with applicable credentialing requirements while allowing the district to meet the instructional needs of students at Tropico Middle School.

- G. Superintendent Report: *Barbara Gaines*: Okay, I was going to talk a little bit about the conference that we attended last week, but Mr. Irving did a great job on covering that. The one thing that I will take away from that conference, it was, I think, very informative and yet at the same time I would have to say somewhat alarming. At the same time, what I was very excited about was a few years ago I invited Opal Singleton, who is renowned expert across the United States, working with the FBI, CIA on human and sex trafficking. She was a keynote speaker down there, and when I said, "Oh well, and she turned around and she said, "You had the plan at your middle school. She remembered that Mr. Nat Adams and I thought for sure we might have had a plan that one day at Tropico Middle School, and I shared with her a little bit of the story of what we went through last year, and it was just great to hear her sort of renew our knowledge on what is truly going on in the world. I felt very excited as I was driving home from this conference because you know we attend many conferences that highlight different things that all encompass the world of education, but this one was very real world on and addressed the safety of not only our students but our staff members. And I was thinking next year I will just take so and so and so and so. I was thinking we had even had the conversations of other people in the district that we felt would benefit from being at this conference, it was somewhat bell to bell, but very, very good. Every session was like wow, wow, wow. So that that was my comment on that. I want to say to our parents who are joining us, August 12th is just around the corner. We will be opening school. If you have not registered your child yet, especially if he or she is a TK student, please get in and register them because TK is, I only have TK openings right now at Rosamond Elementary School, and when I do not have any more classrooms, there is not much I can do. So please get in. We still do have openings at Rosamond Elementary, and I know that the high school is growing leaps and bounds with the numbers. I think the last time I checked, they were at 940 students at the high school, so we welcome our students. We are excited to welcome them to Southern Kern, but please make sure that you get in and register them so we know that we have enough teachers and we are ready on August 12th to meet their needs. Last Friday, the 10th, I believe, we opened our pantry at the Parent Community Center, and I was so excited for that. That has been something we have been talking about for a couple of years now is opening a pantry for our parents of our students in Southern Kern, and thanks to the racetrack, the new owners at the racetrack they made a considerable donation that we were able to stock our shelves in the in the pantry. Very interesting thing. We have a grant for the community schools, but it allows us to buy the shelves for the pantry, but we cannot buy the food that goes on the shelf. I mean, ever go figure. But anyway, we
