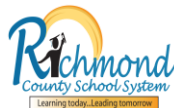

Student Achievement

During the 26-27 school year, we will increase content mastery for student groups in tested subject areas on the Georgia Milestones by 3%.

School Goals

Goal 1: By reducing the variability of Tier I literacy instruction across ELA and Social Studies courses, T.W. Josey High School will increase the percentage of students performing at the Developing Learner level and above on the Georgia Milestones End-of-Course assessments in Literature II and U.S. History by at least 5 percentage points by the end of the 2026–2027 academic year.

Goal 2: By strengthening Tier I mathematical reasoning and problem-solving instruction across Math and Science courses, T.W. Josey High School will increase the percentage of students performing at the Developing Learner level and above on the Georgia Milestones End-of-Course assessments in Algebra Concepts & Connections and Biology by at least 5 percentage points by the end of the 2026–2027 academic year.

Goal 3: By strengthening school culture and climate through consistent cohort monitoring, Early Warning Indicator (EWI) reviews, and tiered academic and non-academic supports, T.W. Josey High School will increase the graduation rate by 5% by the end of the 2026–2027 academic year.
