Attendance matters! Attendance is taken every day! All students in grades TK- 6th grade must be in their classroom by 8 am. If a student arrives late, he/she will be recorded as tardy. Please call our attendance hotline if your child will be absent: (714) 628-5475. Or you may scan the QR code to report your absence also. **Every day matters; be here and ready to learn!**

R

Responsible and Respectful Warriors Always! All Warriors are accountable for their work and computer every day. We also want our Warriors to show respect to all staff and fellow Warriors by demonstrating kindness before, during, and after school.

R

Relationships, Routines, and Resilience are at the core of learning at West Orange. Our goal is to establish relationships with students and parents, prepare daily routines for success, and teach resilience through our academics. **Warriors can do anything!**

Intervention and acceleration support is provided to students via small group instruction during our **Whatever I Need** (WIN) learning block.

Arriving at School

Breakfast
Served 15 minutes before the bell at 7:45 am. TK-6th grade students start school at 8:00 am. Student supervision starts at 7:45 am when the gates open.

- ☐ **Gates Opening:** Gates will open 15 minutes before start time.
- ☐ **Homework Drop-Off:** There is **NO instrument drop-off. If students forget their homework or materials, they must bring them the next day.** It is a Warrior's responsibility to have all materials packed and ready for school and charge their device every night.

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- ☐ **There will be no stopping of cars while the bus is present.**
- ☐ **Walking Parents/Guardians:** If you are walking, please wait by the grass and do not go near the gate. We need the exit area open for the dismissal of students. If your 4th-6th grader has younger siblings, the younger siblings will wait by the lunch tables for their older siblings. Pick up for 4th-6th grade is near the Almond gate.
- ☐ The dismissal times represent when students begin to pack up and then walk to the appropriate pick-up location. Do not expect the students to be waiting for pick-up at the exact moment of dismissal.
- ☐ **Late Pick Up:** Students not picked up within 10 minutes of dismissal time will be taken to the outdoor tables, and the parent/guardian must come in and sign them out. Parents who habitually pick up their students late will be reported to the office of Student and Community Services and could face prosecution from the Orange County District Attorney (SART and SARB process).
- ☐ **Dogs:** Please do not bring dogs on campus to pick up students. Some of our students may be allergic to or terrified of dogs (C.C. 21113 (a)).

SDC Class

We are excited to welcome our new Special Day Class (SDC) to our school community! To ensure the safety of all students, staff, and families, please follow the posted signage located at the front office gate.

A school bus will be using this area each morning and afternoon for student drop-off and pick-up. For everyone's safety, please observe the following:

- **No vehicles may stop or park in this area while the school bus is present.**

Thank you for your cooperation and for helping us provide a safe and smooth arrival and dismissal for all of our students.

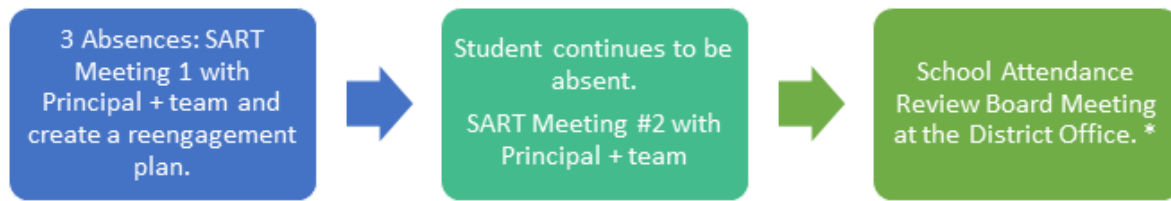


Attendance

Attendance is required daily for 180 days. The parent/guardian is responsible for contacting the school to report an absence [phone: 714-628-5475. Absences must be reported within 24 hours. If your child is late to school, he/she will be marked tardy and recorded in their attendance record. **But what happens if a student is absent more than three times?** As a school, our responsibility is to ensure that our students are receiving a high-quality education. As a parent

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and guardian, you must ensure that your child comes to school daily. The following are our SART and SARB processes for excessive absences and tardies.

Bicycle Safety

Students in grades 3-6 are allowed to ride bicycles. Bicycle riders must walk their bicycles across the street using the crosswalk. Bicycles are never ridden on school grounds, on the playground, or into the corridors. Bicycles are to be walked to the bike rack behind the office and must be locked. Students must never ride double on bicycles. Students who ride recklessly or double may lose the privilege of riding their bicycles to school. **Bicycle helmets are required** for bicycles, scooters, and skateboards (CA state law). Students who do not bring a helmet must walk their bicycles, scooters, and skateboards home.

Birthday Celebrations

There will be no birthday celebrations during instructional time. However, if you would like to bring something to hand out **during dismissal (last 2-3 minutes)**, students are welcome to—for instance, a goodie bag, popcorn, pre-packaged treats, etc. **NO cupcakes, donuts, or pizza.** These items require time and can get messy. **Items must be individually wrapped, no homemade food items.** As a school, we must protect instruction time. Please make sure there is an item for each child. All items must be sent at the beginning of the day with students. Parents must notify the teacher 24 hours in advance if they bring treats for the class.



Examples of items are chip bags, pencils, stickers, Ding Dongs, Twinkies, fruit snacks, gummies etc). If balloons are brought in, students can pick them up at the end of the day.

Buying and Selling

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Students are not allowed to buy or sell any item from another student while coming to, at, or after school.

Breakfast, Snack, and Lunch Safety Procedures

- All students must stand on the red line when getting breakfast or lunch. We will stop serving breakfast five minutes before the start of school.
- **If bringing sack lunches, students are to eat their own food. For health and safety reasons, trading is not allowed.** Do not bring food for friends.
- After students are dismissed from the lunch area, they are expected to place their trash in trash cans. Students should spend a reasonable length of time (15 minutes) eating their lunches and are to remain at the lunch tables until dismissed.
- Students must raise their hands and wait to be dismissed before leaving the lunch tables. **All food must be eaten at the lunch tables.**
- Students cannot access a refrigerator or microwave to warm their food.
- In the lunch line, students may take only one of each item unless the supervisor gives permission to do otherwise.
- **Glass bottles and soda drinks are not allowed at school.** In accordance with California school regulations and to promote a safe and healthy learning environment, glass bottles and soda are not allowed on campus. Glass containers pose a safety hazard if broken, and California's school nutrition standards support providing healthy beverage choices for students.
- School phones may not be used for take-out or delivery lunches for students. Students or parents are not allowed to order lunches via phone applications (**ex: Postmates, Grubhub, Yelp, Ubereats, etc).**
- **School Phone Policy:** Students in elementary school may not use smartphones or other mobile communication devices during the instructional day. Devices must be turned off and placed out of sight during the school day. Students who need to call parents during the school day, may make the call from the administrative office.

Field Trips

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All grade levels will participate in field trips at some point during the school year. Permission slips will be sent home and must be signed and returned to school at least 24 hours prior to the field trip in order for the student to attend. Permission slips will not be accepted on the day of the field trip. Donations are asked for on most field trips. If you are able, please return that with the permission slip. No student will be denied attending a field trip for non-payment, however the costs are only covered by our WOSA fundraising efforts.

Fire and Emergency Drills

Every month, our Warriors practice one of three emergency drills: earthquake, fire, or lockdown. During the drills, Warriors are to stop talking immediately, follow the teacher's directions, and follow all emergency procedures. West Orange School has a complete disaster plan to ensure the best possible care and security for your child during a natural or man-made disaster. Each staff member has been assigned to an emergency team that includes Security, Command Center, Parental Assistance, Reunion Gate, Assembly Area, First Aid, and Search/Rescue. Through the combined effort of the Orange Unified School District and West Orange School, we have school-wide provisions of bandages and other first aid supplies set aside for emergencies.

If an emergency or disaster occurs at West Orange, we will initiate these steps:

- All students are trained in "take cover" procedures should the situation warrant it.
- After the immediate danger is over, evacuation of the building may be in order. Should this become necessary, students will evacuate to their specified class locations on the grass area east of the playground. This is the same procedure they follow during a regular fire drill.
- Attendance is taken immediately, and the information is relayed to the Command Center. After attendance is taken, our Search/Rescue teams check each room for missing or injured children. Any injured students are removed from the buildings and taken to our First Aid center.
- Each teacher has a first aid kit to take care of minor injuries.
- Each school is equipped with a battery-powered two-way radio that will be used to contact the District Emergency Operations Center to report their disposition so any additional needed aid and supplies can be sent immediately.
- Parents should report to the driveway at the back parking lot of the school (Almond Street) when requesting students' release. You will see the sign for Parental Assistance at the front of the school. After signing your child out, a runner will bring them to the Reunion Gate. Students will be kept on campus or at a safe alternative location until released to parents or known adults. Children will only be released to their parent and adult on the Emergency Sheet or to an adult known to the child. **It is essential to keep emergency cards updated through the parent portal account.**
- Should the students need to be evacuated to another site, school personnel will be available to direct parents. No child will be left unattended at school at any time!

Leaving School Early

Early checkout is discouraged as it disrupts the classroom routine and decreases students' instructional minutes.

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- Students **are not to** leave the school grounds during the day without checking out through the office.
- Students **cannot** use school phones to get permission to go home with another student.
- **Students who wish to go home with other students (either by walking or by private car) must have a signed note from their parents.** The student needs to bring this note to the office. This is for liability reasons.
- Students are to go directly home - no side trips to a friend's house.

Please note, that students will only be called to the office for pick up once parents/guardians are in the office.

Lost and Found

Items left on campus will be placed in the lost and found. The lost and found items will be placed outside the office. **Please ensure all lunch boxes, sweaters, and jackets are labeled with the student's full name.** On the last Friday of each month, all clothing not claimed by the owners of the lost and found will be donated to charity.

Medicine

Students are **never** to bring any kind of medicine to school. Parents may only bring medicine to the Health office. The doctor must fill out the OUSD medication form, which can be faxed to our office. If you would like your child to wear a mask, parents/guardians must provide them.

Parent Check-In, Check-out Procedures

Parents who wish to speak to their child's teacher before school will need to check in at the office. Please prearrange any conferences by sending a note to the school, making a phone call to the teacher, or Class Dojo message. **Instructional time will not be interrupted.**

If you wish to sign your child out for an appointment, please come to the office and notify the secretary. She will call your child's classroom, and your child will meet you in the office. Students will not be called out of a class before their parents arrive. The time a child leaves early will be recorded on their attendance record. Please provide us with a doctor's note to excuse the early pickup or tardiness.

If a parent cannot pick up their child, the person whose child is being picked up must be listed on their emergency card. You can change the emergency card via the parent portal on the OUSD webpage.

Parent Engagement Lunches

On some Fridays, we have our Parent Engagement Lunches. These take place during your student's lunch time. These lunches are an opportunity for you to spend time engaging with your own child. Students may only participate if their parent is present. Many parents bring a special lunch to share with their child, but it is not necessary. Parents can sign up for these lunches online and come to school and participate in an activity with their child during their lunch time. Some activities are reading, math activities, art activities or STEM projects. Signups are first come, first served. We have limited supplies and space for parents to attend, so we ask that you do not sign up for more than one per month to allow for other parents to attend with their children. Also, if you attend these lunches, please remember that students have

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instructional time in the afternoons. Please do not take them out early on these days. It is important they stay on campus to learn.

Restroom Safety

Students are expected to use the restroom before, during recess/lunch, and after school. Use of the restroom during class time is for emergency situations only. Suppose a student has a medical reason for needing to use the restroom during class time. In that case, the parent must provide the health office with the appropriate medical documentation. There is no playing or socializing in or around the restrooms. **Cell phones are not allowed inside the restroom.** Students are responsible for keeping the restrooms clean and orderly. Primary students use the primary restrooms, and upper-grade students use the upper-grade restrooms unless directed by staff.

School Supply Wish List

We ask all parents to help our school with our grade-level supply wish list. Supply wish lists are available during registration, in the front office, and on our district webpage. The donations we receive help to fund many of our activities and enrichment opportunities. Educational activities/supplies at a public school are free to the students participating in such activities. In addition, there are no mandatory fees for our students for extracurricular activities. W.O.S.A. thanks you for your donations.

Student Behavior Standards and Expectations

In planning West Orange School's learning environment, we ask three main questions for students to monitor their behavior.

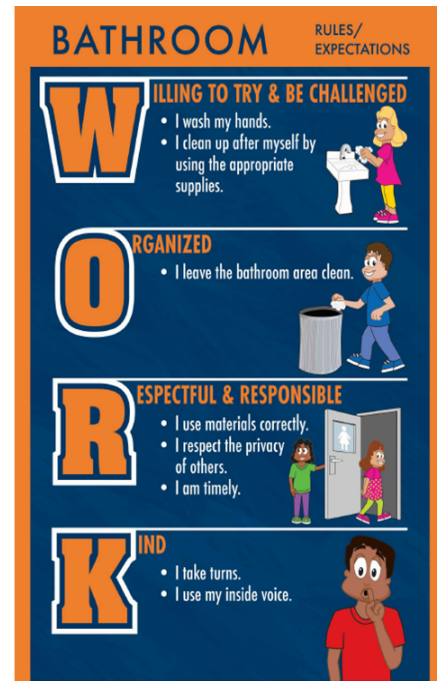
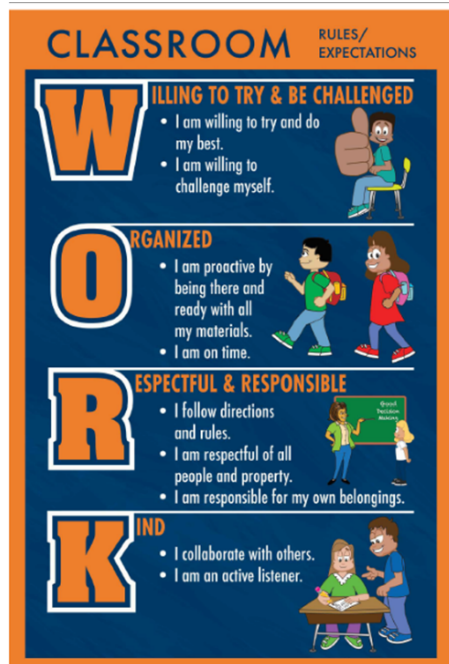
1. Are you safe?
2. Are you being kind?
3. Are you acting responsibly?

These questions lead to our expectation that our students follow these West Orange standards of behavior. Students are expected to behave in a manner that does not disrupt or interfere with the rights of others. There will be **NO BULLYING BEHAVIOR**. Progressive disciplinary consequences will be followed for those who demonstrate bullying behavior.

SAFETY FOR ALL

1. Students are not to bring any toy or real weapon (gun, knife, martial arts instruments), bullets, or explosives to school under any conditions.
2. Whether real or fake, Fighting, wrestling, or martial arts display **is not** allowed. No "play fighting" allowed.
3. Students are to tell an adult if someone is hurt.
4. No throwing of rocks, sand, sticks, and/or other harmful objects is allowed. No throwing rocks at neighboring houses or their pets.
5. Students are responsible for telling another adult if there is a knife, weapon, fireworks, or other dangerous objects on campus.
6. Students are also responsible for telling an adult if someone has made a threat against them or another student.

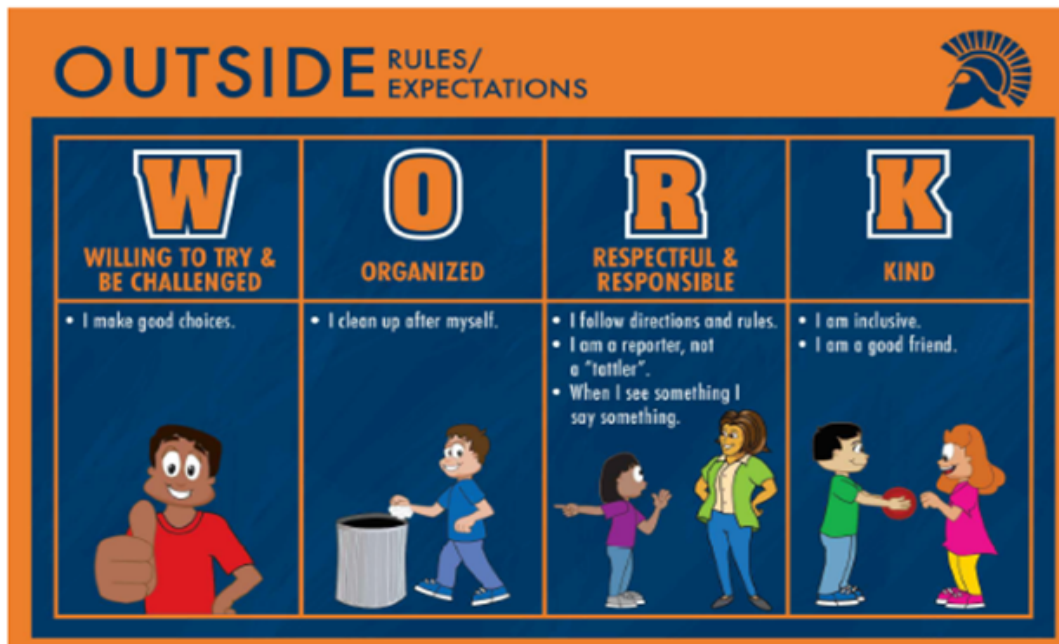
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TO AND FROM SCHOOL:

1. Students are expected to follow the school rules on their way to school and home. Fighting, teasing, and vandalism will not be tolerated.
2. Students are expected to walk on the sidewalks, cross at intersections and crosswalks, and respect private property.
3. No skateboards, "Razors," and/or scooters, roller blades, segways, or roller skates are allowed on campus at any time.
4. Students are expected to go directly to/from school unless otherwise communicated by parent/guardian (ex: No 7-Eleven trips, Chick-Fil-a)

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PLAYGROUND SAFETY

1. Students must be visible to a supervisor at all times.
2. Students cannot play tag (or anything similar) or dodgeball or touch each other.
3. Students are never to play between or behind the portable classrooms. All students must play in their assigned playground area.
4. Students stop playing immediately when the bell rings. After the bell rings, students freeze and then walk to the blacktop to squat. Students are to always walk on the blacktop. If on the grass, students may run to the edge of the blacktop and walk the rest of the way to their line.
5. Students are not allowed cell phones during recess or in the restroom.
6. Students are to get drinks and go to the restroom before the bell rings at the end of the recess.
7. Problems on the playground are reported to the teacher on duty or the noon supervisor. Students must get permission from the teacher on duty or the noon supervisor to come to the office with a note.
8. Students stay beyond the yellow line and away from classes in session at recess and lunch. No students are allowed in the halls or between the buildings during recess, lunch, or before school. **Students are never allowed in classrooms without adult supervision.**
9. Students turn articles left on the grass or blacktop into the office after the bell rings. Students keep the school grounds clean by putting all litter in the trash cans.
10. **GUM IS NOT ALLOWED AT SCHOOL.** This includes candy with gum in it.
11. A student only has one place in line. There are no "cuts" in line.
12. Students are not to sit or stand on walls, fences, water fountains, planters, landscaping, tables, or climb trees while at school.
13. Students must use the rules of "fair play" at all times.

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14. No students are excluded from games, even if the game has already started.

****Failure to follow school rules will result in progressive disciplinary consequences.**

STEAM + Family Nights

We are excited to continue our 2026-2027 STEAM and Family nights. This year, we will continue to have STEAM and Library Nights events. Each event will be centered around science, so come and join the fun. Our weekly newsletter, calendars and ParentSquare will announce specific dates and topics.

Technology/ Personal Equipment

1. **Privately Owned:** The responsibility for any privately owned equipment brought to school rests with the students. Permission to bring personal play items should be obtained from the teacher. **Do not bring toys to school.**
 - a. Students may **not** bring hard baseballs, small handballs, tennis balls, or bats to school. Any other P.E. equipment must be approved by the classroom teacher. Bats are used only under the direct supervision of a teacher during the scheduled P.E. period.
 - b. All games are open to all students regardless of the ownership of the equipment being used. Balls and other playground equipment are used only in designated areas.
 - c. No skateboards, scooters, roller skates, shoes with roller wheels, rollerblades, or motorcycles are permitted on the school grounds.
 - d. Footballs, football games, and football-like games are not permitted at recess or lunch. Teachers may choose to teach football skills during PE.
2. **Cell Phones:** Cell phones/electronic devices(including smart watches) are not allowed during the instructional day. The **school is not responsible** for cell phones/electronic devices that are lost or stolen.
 - a. Cell phones/personal electronic devices **must remain off** during school hours. Devices will be confiscated if found in use during school time. Devices will be returned to parents/guardians only.
 - b. It is recommended that students check their cell phones/electronic devices with their teacher at the beginning of the school day. Students are not allowed to carry cell phones on their bodies.
 - c. Students are not allowed to record videos or take pictures of other students or adults/employees while on school grounds, including before, during, and after school.
3. **School Technology Device:** Please refer to our OUSD Technology contract for all district-owned devices on our district webpage.
 - a. All students must bring their devices fully charged.
 - b. Tech contracts will be sent home during the 1st few weeks of the school year.

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- c. Parents are responsible for paying for any damages to OUSD technology. Insurance may be purchased for devices- please ask the front office (time-sensitive information).
- d. **Responsible warriors must ensure their device is fully charged the next day. This is a school-wide expectation for all TK-6th-grade students.**

Uniform Policy 2026-2027

West Orange Elementary School is a “Uniform” school. While attending West Orange Elementary School, all students are expected to **follow the uniform policy and wear uniforms to school as they were intended to be worn**, which includes the following criteria:

Sweatshirts and Jackets
Sweatshirts and jackets should not have gang-related images, advertisements, or inappropriate images. They should be logo-free, and in school colors. Students should wear their school shirts underneath their sweatshirts/jackets. Students are to avoid wearing their hoods/hats within the classroom.
Shoes
Tennis Shoes No sandals, open toes, open heels, slippers, flip flops, heels, wedges, heeled boots, Crocs shoes with wheels etc.
Items NOT Allowed:
No pocket chains of any sort. No clothing, make-up, or fingernails considered disruptive to class instruction will be allowed. Open-toe and backless shoes are not allowed. Students participate in Physical Education P.E. every day. All shoes must be safe for P.E. and physical activity. Heels are not safe for P.E. and are not allowed at school. Sweaters and sweatshirts that are longer than the shorts or skirt underneath cannot be worn (giving the appearance that the student isn't wearing a bottom).
