Duke School is an independent preschool (three-year-olds) through eighth-grade project-based school. Founded in 1947 as the lab school at Duke University and independent since the mid-1980s, we are celebrating 80 years in progressive education.

ABOUT DUKE SCHOOL

Duke School is a non-sectarian, progressive school serving approximately 500 students from preschool through eighth grade on a vibrant 20-acre campus in Durham, NC. Most families live in Durham or Chapel Hill, and the Southern Association of Independent Schools accredits the school.

Our graduates leave well-prepared for a wide range of high school experiences—independent, public, and boarding—across North Carolina and beyond. Many go on to earn top academic honors, and it's not uncommon to find Duke School alumni among the student body at the North Carolina School of Science and Mathematics each year.

OUR PROGRAM

At Duke School, learning begins with curiosity. Our students explore big questions through hands-on projects and purposeful instruction across disciplines. In every grade, students take on three extended projects, each building core academic skills and one featuring design thinking as a central component.

Our curriculum combines academic rigor with creativity and joy. Nationally recognized standards guide our work, including the NCTM in math, NAEYC in early childhood education, NGSS in science, and NCSS in social studies. Our approach is rooted in deep understanding, whether students are solving real-world math problems, conducting lab experiments, writing with voice and clarity, or investigating the past through a social justice lens.

Social-emotional learning is woven throughout. In Early Childhood and Lower School, the Responsive Classroom approach supports autonomy, competence, and strong relationships. In Middle School, the Developmental Designs framework carries that work forward, helping ensure every student is known, valued, and empowered through adolescence.

Duke School students grow into agile thinkers, skilled collaborators, and confident learners—ready to lead in whatever comes next.

ASSESSMENT AND REPORTING

Assessment at Duke School is ongoing, thoughtful, and personal. Teachers use benchmarks in every subject to track growth and guide instruction, setting individualized goals based on how each child learns best.

Families receive detailed progress reports twice per year, including both narrative reflections and checklist indicators of benchmark progress. Each student also receives a Learner Profile, which highlights strengths and goals across three dimensions: academic growth, community participation, and self-management.

Middle schoolers take increasing ownership of their learning, leading conferences alongside their advisors and families to reflect, plan, and grow.

THE EIGHTH-GRADE CAPSTONE PROJECT

Eighth graders spend the last three and a half months of their careers designing and carrying out their own projects. Topics have ranged from building a clock to designing a piece of street art (left: art designed by Noah Andrews '19 for their Capstone), from researching Jewish food in the South to investigating paradoxes, and more. Each student conducts significant research, seeks guidance from an expert in the field, determines a way to make an impact with their new knowledge and skill, and culminates the effort with a twenty-minute presentation to teachers, parents, and peers. Alumni regularly report that they surpass their high school peers in planning and executing projects of significant scope as well as in delivering presentations.

One alum notes, "The Capstone project is your final chance to create a toolkit that will set you up for all your future endeavors. You don't quite realize everything you learn from Duke School until after you graduate."
