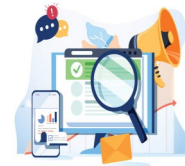
Parents are welcome to provide feedback on the compact at anytime during the school year. All feedback will be collected and reviewed during the annual revision meeting with parents.

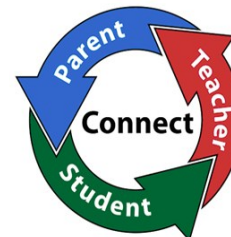

Student Achievement

- During the 26-27 school year, we will increase content mastery for student groups in tested subject areas on the Georgia Milestones by 3%.

School Goals

- By the end of the 2026 -2027 school year, we will increase our content mastery score in ELA by 6 percentage points.

Focus Area



6th Grade: ELA and Math

- Determine how theme is conveyed
- Understand and avoid plagiarism
- Complete understanding of division of fractions and extend the notion of number to the system of rational numbers, which includes negative numbers

- Cite multiple pieces of text evidence
- Read for comprehension and vocabulary
- Develop an understanding of and apply proportional relationships
- Develop an understanding of operations with rational numbers and work with expressions and linear equations

8th Grade: ELA and Math

- Read for comprehension and vocabulary
- Analyze with strongest and most appropriate evidence
- Formulate and reason about expressions and equations, including modeling an association in bivariate data with linear equations and systems of linear equations

- Engage Families: Provide Title I Math and ELA Parent Nights, workshops, and take-home resources to help families support student achievement.

- Support Achievement: Monitor grades and assignments and encourage reading and Math/ELA practice at home.
