- Leading innovation in education (i.e., personalized learning, creative scheduling, curriculum offerings, hybrid learning, alternative assessment).
- Supporting inclusion and development of the whole child, with an ability to advocate for all students and diverse learners.
- The ability to both empathize and effectively interact with students, recognizing that consistency and respect are qualities that help build successful relationships.
- Experience with advocating for, leading, and supporting continuous school growth and improvement.

Specific Areas of Responsibility

TEACHING AND LEARNING

- Support and help lead the development, organisation and implementation of the school's curriculum.
- Monitor, evaluate, and improve the quality of teaching and learning across the school.
- Ensure that support is provided for individual teachers, where this is needed, to ensure their unit plans and subsequent learning tasks consistently meet school-established standards.
- Ensure that new teachers are supported and undertake an effective induction process.
- Demonstrate and articulate consistently high expectations of pedagogy and classroom practice to provide challenge and improvement.
- Collaborate with the Upper School Leadership Team, which includes the IB Coordinators, to manage, monitor and review the range, quality, quantity and use of all curriculum resources and the IB MYP and DP programmes in order to improve the quality of education, and improve students' achievement.
- Create an ethos, curriculum and educational direction which secures sustained improvement in students' spiritual, moral, social and cultural development so preparing them for opportunities, responsibilities and experiences in adult life.

- Organize and develop, in coordination with the Middle School Vice-Principal, the High School's master schedule for MYP (9-10) and DP students (11-12) that supports the academic schedules of all Upper School students, aligning course offerings, staffing, and time allocation to support optimal academic pathways and inclusive learning for all Upper School students.
- Understands Universal Design for Learning (UDL) framework principles to ensure diverse learning needs are proactively met through flexible, accessible, and inclusive instructional design.

MANAGEMENT OF STAFF

- Assist in the development and maintenance of positive staff morale.
- Follow the school's Mission, Core Values, and Vision aligned with the Board of Trustees' adopted strategic plan, school goals and administrative-recommended objectives.
