Clinton Central School District Foundation

The Clinton Central School District Foundation (CCSDF) is a public nonprofit organization, established in 1991, that provides support to the District to acquire resources that are outside of the school's operating budget. To date, the Foundation has donated more than one million dollars to the school. Some of the projects that were funded include the athletic fields, renovations to the theater, computers, musicals instruments, media equipment and books for the "One School, One Book" Program. In addition, with added support from the Hamilton College Town-Gown Fund, the Foundation provides funding for the Summer Program for students in grades K-5 and the Middle School STEAM summer program. Annual fundraising programs include a July golf tournament and a giving appeal in the fall that reaches over 6,300 alumni, parents, District associates and friends. The CCSDF also sponsors the Hall of Distinction, which honors inductees with a ceremony and a plaque that hangs in the Performing Arts Center. A Memorial Brick Garden established by the Foundation is located on the school campus. In addition, the CCSDF is participating in the MVGives program with The Community Foundation September 2026.

In accordance with CCS Policy 8115, pesticides will not be used on District playgrounds, turf, athletic or playing fields unless an emergency occurs, which will be handled in accordance with applicable law and regulation. In the event that this becomes necessary, all District staff and parent guardians will be notified.

Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act

In accordance with the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act of 1987 (AHERA), and CCS Policy #7100, a copy of building inspection reports are available for review by appointment. Dignity for All Students Act (DASA)



No student should feel that it is not safe to come to school and participate in all school activities. No student should ever be prevented from concentrating on schoolwork because another student or a school staff member is teasing you, making fun of you, or threatening you in some way, because of your actual or perceived race, color, weight, national origin (where your family comes from), ethnic group, religion, religious practice, disability, sexual orientation, gender (including gender identity or expression), or sex, or for any other reason. No student may act toward another student in a way that might reasonably make them feel threatened or unsafe, or that might reasonably make them unable to concentrate on their schoolwork because of what you might think about their race, color, weight, national origin (where their family comes from), ethnic group, religion, religious practice, disability, sexual orientation, gender (including gender identity or expression), or sex, or for any other reason. It is against school rules for any student or staff member to do this by physical actions or by verbal statements, including electronic messages. This kind of behavior is prohibited on school property, on school buses, and at all school-sponsored events.

You should report acts of bullying, discrimination, harassment and other inappropriate actions that harm others to your Dignity Act Coordinator.
