Oliver Hazard Perry was a naval officer, born and bred, and he embodied that perception of the romanticized naval ideas of the era. Even though he is best known for his actions at the Battle of Lake Erie during the War of 1812, who and what he was up to that point in time enabled him to be victorious. He can be defined by a strong adherence to an 18th century code of conduct/honor, fierce combat courage, deep patriotism, and a demanding leadership style.
