MEETINGS OF THE BOARD

The Board of Education meets regularly on the second Monday of each month at 5:30 p.m. in the district. From time to time, the Board may schedule other special meetings. Notices of those meetings will be posted on the district website and at the Administration Building at least 18 hours prior to the meeting. Board meeting agendas are posted on the school web site, and are available in the Superintendent's office prior to the meetings. All Board of Education meetings are held in the public and the public is invited to attend. Upon request to the Superintendent, the district shall make reasonable accommodations for a disabled person to participate in these meetings. DUTIES OF THE BOARD

The Sault Ste. Marie Area Public Schools is governed by a seven-member board. The Board is the policy making body of the school district. It selects and appoints the Superintendent as the district's executive officer and delegates to the Superintendent the responsibility for implementing its policies and plans, including the school district's curriculum. The Board also has the responsibility of approving a budget and seeking tax dollars to improve school facilities.

Citizen Participation at Board Meetings

The Board of Education recognizes the value of public comment on educational issues and the importance of allowing members of the public to express themselves on district matters.

Any person or group wishing to place an item on the agenda shall register their intent by emailing bwhite-sas@eupschools.org no later than 10 business days prior to the meeting include:

- Name and address of the participant
- Group affiliation, if and when appropriate
- Topic to be addressed

Such requests shall be subject to the approval of the superintendent and the board president. To permit fair and orderly public expression, the board shall provide a period for in-person public participation at every regular meeting of the board and publish rules to govern such participation in board meetings.

The presiding officer of each board meeting at which public participation is permitted shall administer the rules of the board for its conduct.

The presiding officer shall be guided by the following rules:

- Public participation shall be permitted as indicated on the order of business of this board and at the discretion of the presiding officer.
- Anyone having legitimate interest in the actions of the board may participate during the public portion of the meeting.
- Participants must be recognized by the presiding officer and must preface their comments by stating their name, address, and topic to be addressed.

Upon request to the Superintendent, the district shall make reasonable accommodations for a disabled person to be able to participate in these meetings.

GOALS:

- 1. Provide safe, secure and dependable transportation by maintaining rigorous safety standards.**
- 2. Optimize routes, schedules, and resources to deliver a highly reliable transportation system.**

NOTE:

**BUS PICKUP TIMES ARE SUBJECT TO CHANGE DEPENDING ON
BUS ROUTE LENGTH AND STUDENT NUMBERS**

EXPECTED BEHAVIORS FOR STUDENTS:

1. Pupils are expected to conform to the requests of the bus drivers and help to as sure safety at all times.
2. Be on time at designated bus stops at least 5 minutes early. The bus cannot wait.
3. Expect to walk at least one-half mile to the bus stop, if necessary.
4. Stay off the roadway at all times while waiting for the school bus. No pushing or shoving.
5. Cross at least 10 feet in front of the bus when crossing on the roadway, not in back of the bus.
6. Wait until the bus comes to a complete stop, and red lights are on, before attempting to enter or leave the bus. **Stay seated until the bus has stopped.**
7. Do not leave the bus without the driver's permission.
8. Occupy the seat assigned to you by the driver. When seated, keep feet out of aisles. Report any damaged seats to the bus driver.
9. If the bus is crowded, seat three in a seat starting from the back of the bus and working forward.
10. Sit upright with feet on the floor.
11. Keep hands and head inside the bus at all times.
12. Avoid unnecessary and disturbing noises; do not shout at passing persons or vehicles.
13. Talk only to students sitting near you, in a low, normal inside voice.
14. Use **no bad or inappropriate language.**
15. Help keep the bus clean, sanitary, and orderly.
16. Be considerate of other students. No hitting, throwing things, teasing or harassing.
17. No eating or drinking on the bus.
18. Make sure that you are prepared to exit once the bus has stopped.

VIOLATION OF RULES:

1st Offense: Verbal warning of infraction (notification to child that he/she is doing something wrong).

2nd Offense: Written warning of infraction, in the form of a Bus Conduct Report. Must be signed by parent/guardian and returned to the driver in order to return to busing.

3rd Offense: Bus Conduct Report with a one to three day suspension from busing. Must be signed by parent/guardian and returned to the driver prior to returning to busing.

4th Offense: Bus Conduct Report with a one week to one month suspension from busing. Must be signed by parent/guardian and returned to the transportation coordinator during a mandatory meeting with the student, parent/guardian, driver and transportation coordinator prior to returning to busing.

5th Offense: Bus Conduct Report with a one month or remainder of the semester suspension from busing. Must be signed by parent/guardian and returned to the driver prior to further transportation to and from school.

SEVERE DISRUPTIONS: This includes physical harm to a student, physical harm or threat of physical harm to driver or another student, insubordination toward driver, failure to correctly identify oneself, spitting of any kind, bringing a weapon of any kind on a school bus, being in possession of a controlled substance or flammable substance, causing property damage to the bus. Consequences for severe disruption will be dealt with as a 4th or 5th offense, as decided by the transportation coordinator.

PROPERTY DAMAGE: This includes any damage to transportation equipment. Any damage will be assessed to determine the cost of repair, with the student being responsible for these costs. The student will not be allowed to return to busing until all repair costs have been paid, and the Transportation Coordinator approves the student's return.

EXPECTATION/GOAL: The expectations and goals of this department are to be able to transport our students to and from school in the safest manner possible. The rules stated need to be followed to allow this to happen for the safety of all of the students, driver and the other drivers on the roadway.

Annual Notice to Parents Regarding Student Records

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords a parent or legal guardian of a student, an adult student and those authorized by State and Federal law, and Board policy to inspect and review the student's education records within thirty calendar days after the Principal or designee receives a written request for access or within a shorter period as may be applicable to students with disabilities. Parents and adult students are not permitted to inspect and review education records of other students.

A parent or adult student has the right to:

- request in writing an amendment of the student's education records if the parent or adult student believes the record is inaccurate, misleading, or otherwise in violation of the student's privacy rights.
- consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student's education records except to the extent that Federal and/or State law authorizes disclosure without consent.
- challenge the noncompliance of a parent's request to amend the records through a hearing, and may request that an explanatory statement be placed in the student's file explaining the basis for the disagreement.
- obtain a copy of the Board's policies and administrative guidelines about student records.

SCHOOL CLOSING

The decision to close school usually takes place between 4:30 and 5:30 a.m. and is based upon road conditions, weather conditions, and weather forecasts from several sources. On very rare occasions, we are aware of drifted roads in the evening and can accurately make the call at that time.

We make every effort to avoid sending students home early, however it is a possibility. It is important for families to have contingency plans for such an occurrence.

We communicate the school closure to local radio and television stations, ParentSquare, Facebook, and on the front page of our district's website as early as possible. We encourage parents to take the time to check these information sources before sending children out to the bus stop.

Generally, if school is closed, the evening school activities are cancelled for that day as well.

Michigan requires a specified number of instructional hours per school year. If we exceed the number of allowed weather-related closures and come up short for the school year, the school may have to change the school schedule late in the year.

Annual Asbestos Hazard Notification

The annual Asbestos Management Plan has been completed and submitted to the State of Michigan for every school building where asbestos was found. A copy of the Asbestos Management Plan is available in each school building regarding location, condition, and a plan for monitoring and maintaining the asbestos-containing materials.

Once every six months, asbestos-containing materials must be visually inspected for changes in condition and the results documented in the Management Plan.

Law requires re-inspection of all district buildings every three years. The ongoing three-year inspections have been completed.

Periodic surveillance and regularly scheduled inspections permit the school district to immediately repair any damaged asbestos-containing materials and maintain a safe environment for all students and employees.

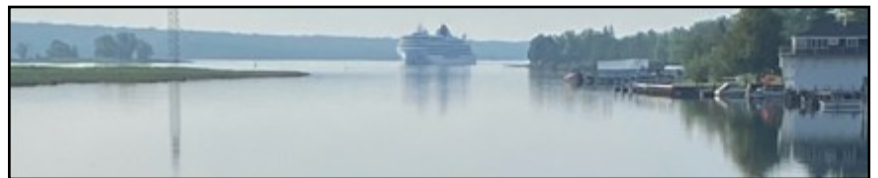
As a result of repairs and recent re-inspection, it is our belief that all asbestos-containing materials in our school buildings are in safe condition for normal occupancy and do not constitute a health hazard to occupants.

Annual Pesticide Notification

As part of the Sault Area Public Schools Pest Management Program, pesticides are *occasionally* applied during the school year. You will be informed prior to any routine pesticide application. In the event of an emergency application, you will be notified immediately following the treatment.

In addition, preventative pesticides are sprayed during non-school (summer) sessions to maintain the grounds areas.

HEAD LICE

A student with nits within 1/4 inch of the scalp or live lice may remain at school until the end of the school day. The student will be restricted from activities that involve close head-to-head contact or sharing of personal items. The District will notify the student's parent/guardian about the need to remove the nits.

The student will be readmitted to school after the treatment so long as the parent/guardian consents to a head examination and the examining District official does not find live lice on the student. If the District official finds nits within 1/4 inch of the student's scalp, the student may return to class, but the District must inform the student's parent/guardian about the need to remove nits.

District Personnel will not ostracize or embarrass a student with lice or nits and will maintain student confidentiality.

If a student has a persistent infestation after 6 weeks or 3 separate cases within 1 school year, the District will form a team that may include the student's parent's/guardian's, teacher, social worker, or administrators to determine the best approach to resolve the issue.

MICHIGAN IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS

The Michigan Department of Public Health has immunization guidelines for all students entering the school system for the first time. It is a **requirement** for all new enrollees who attend any Michigan school to have a **minimum** of:

1. Four doses of **DPT or DTAP** (one dose must be on or after four years of age) OR 3 doses if #1 given on or after the first birthday. **One dose of Tdap for children 11 years of age or older upon entry into 7th grade or higher.**
2. Two doses of **MMR** vaccine (measles/mumps/rubella) at or after 12 months of age..
3. Three doses of **HBV** (this takes 6 months to complete series).
4. Four doses of **Polio** (only three doses if third dose on or after four years of age)
5. **Two doses of Varicella** (Chickenpox) at or after 12 months of age or current lab immunity or history of Varicella Disease.
6. **One dose of Meningococcal Conjugate vaccine for all children 11 years of age or older upon entry into 7th grade or higher.**

You will need to present an immunization record at the time of school enrollment. All kindergartners will need to be fully immunized before entering school. Records will be reviewed and only those students who are up to date will be allowed to attend. Parents will be responsible to bring or send updated shot records to the school before opening day of school. All transfer students will need a shot record on file before they start school with one month to update their records. A State of Michigan Medical Contraindication form or a Nonmedical waiver [religious or philosophical (other) objections] will need to be obtained from the county health department. This is a state law to remain in school.

Public Health Code Act 368 of 1978, Section 9307 states a parent or guardian, applying to have a child registered in a school in this state shall present to school officials, at the time of registration or not later than the first day of school, a certificate of hearing and vision testing or screening or statements of exception under Section 9311. The Revised School Code (Act 451 of 1976, section 380.1177) requires that parents of children entering kindergarten present a statement to school officials confirming that they have received the Michigan Department of Community Health Vision Screening OR a statement, signed by a licensed eye care practitioner (optometrist or ophthalmologist) or medical/osteopathic physician, indicating that a child's eyes have been examined at least once after age three and before initial school entry may also be presented.

SEVENTH GRADE IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS

Schools in Michigan are required to assess and report the immunization status of all seventh grade students, in addition to the new school entrants, including kindergartners, whom they currently assess.

All seventh graders must have documentation showing they have had the following immunizations: two doses of MMR, three doses of Hepatitis B, four doses of Diphtheria and Tetanus OR 3 doses if #1 was given on or after the first birthday, one dose of Tdap for children 11 years of age or older upon entry into 7th grade or higher, four doses of polio (Only 3 doses of polio are required if dose 3 was administered on or after the 4th birthday), two doses of varicella vaccine at or after 12 months of age OR current lab immunity OR reliable history of disease.

This requirement will help assure that school-aged children are up-to-date and protected against vaccine-preventable diseases.

COMMUNICABLE DISEASE

Policy 3404: Communicable Diseases

A person with a communicable disease will be restricted only to the extent necessary to prevent the transmission of the disease, protect the person's health and privacy rights, and protect the health and safety of others.

The District will report student immunization information as required by and consistent with state and federal law.

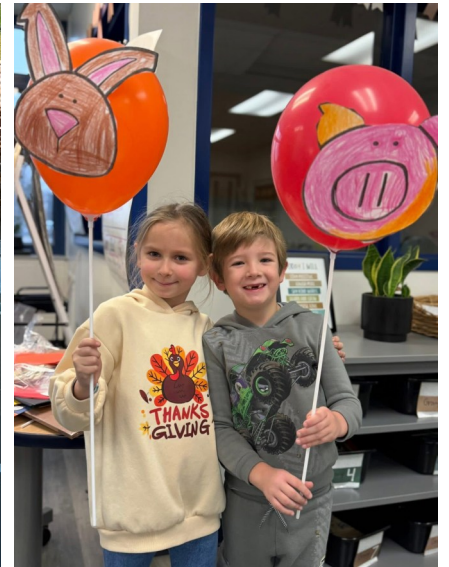

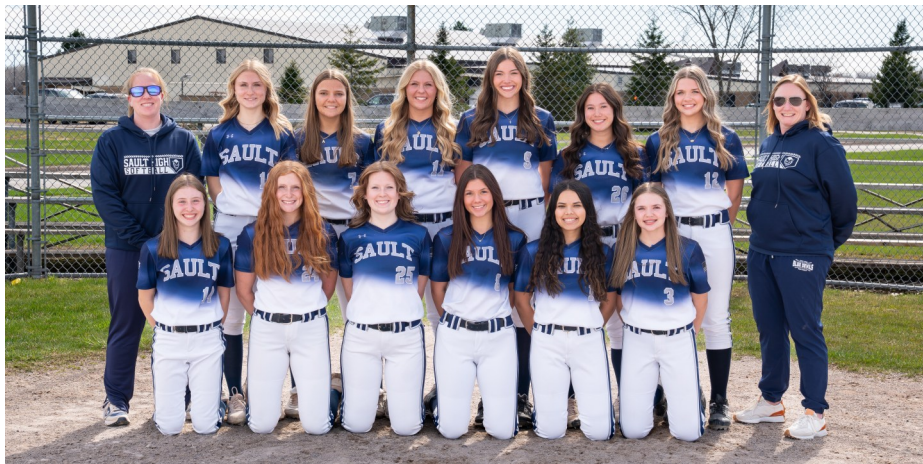
